## VICE-CHANCELLOR ACCEPTS CHALLENGE

Dr. Choh-Ming Li has just informed the University Council that after long, careful and searching consideration, he has finally come to an affirmative decision to stay on with the University. This means that instead of serving The Chinese University for a brief period of time, he is now the permanent head, although the University of California yet extends to him magnanimously the privilege of returning to the Berkeley campus any time within the next few years.

It will be recalled that soon after the Provisional Council of the University had been set up in June, 1963, Dr. Li was approached by the Government of Hong Kong with an invitation to be the first

Vice-Chancellor. Negotiations were then carried on for several months, and he came to Hong Kong for on-the-spot discussions in November, 1963. In January, 1964, he assumed duty.

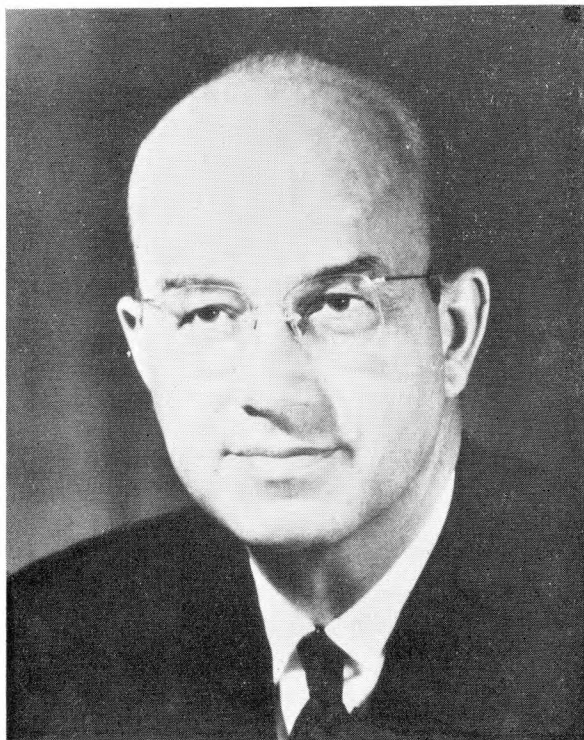
For more than four years, Dr. Li has worked incessantly for the development of the University by raising the standard of teaching and research, recruiting high-quality staff, enlisting financial support locally and abroad, co-operating with universities and academic organizations here and abroad, and planning the new University campus in Shatin. Questions, however, concerning the future of the University had been raised from time to time by co-operating institutions and supporting Foundations as long as there was no decision on his part to be a permanent member of the University. Now that the decision has been made, the development of the University could be pressed forward with assurance.

The news has been welcomed by His Excellency the Chancellor Sir David Trench and the Council, as well as by the overseas friends of the University.

## UNIVERSITY COUNCILLOR ON VISIT

Dr. Clark Kerr, one of the foremost scholars in the United States and a member of the University Council since its inauguration in 1963, came to Hong Kong on 3rd March to attend a University Council meeting. He was met on arrival by Mr. H.T. Wu, University Registrar. During his three-

day stay here, he was a guest of His Excellency Sir David Trench at lunch at Government House and also met with Vice-Chancellor Li and administrative officers of the University.

Dr. Kerr paid visits to the three Colleges and also to the University of California Study Center.

Dr. Kerr is now serving as Chairman of the Commission on the Future of Higher Education, Carnegie Foundation.

## APPOINTMENTS WORKSHOP

The Appointments Workshop Committee invited Mr. J.C.H. Gillard, Senior Education Officer of the Hong Kong Education Department, to give a talk on "Interviews for Teaching Jobs" to the students at the School of Education on 13th March. Mr. Gillard stressed on behaviour and performance at interviews for teaching positions. Following his talk, Mr. H.T. Wu, Director of the School of Education, held mock interviews with some students and Mr. Gillard followed up with an evaluation of

the interviews to draw the students' attention to certain important aspects of an interview for employment.

The last of this series of career talks was given by Mr. James Wu, Managing Director of the China Cold Storage and Engineering Company on 19th April. Mr. Wu spoke on "Opportunities in Industries for University Graduates".

## INVITATION TO ATTEND EROPA SEMINAR

Dr. Charles S.S. Hsueh, Reader of Public Administration at United College, was invited to attend an important research seminar of the Eastern Regional Organization for Public Administration in Bangkok from 18th to 23rd March. The seminar was attended by a selected group of Asian academicians to make a critical examination of administrative reforms for international development in Asian countries.

This project is assisted financially by the Ford Foundation. The Foundation and EROPA are making efforts in promoting co-operation among Asian universities and professional institutions especially in the field of development administration.

Dr. Hsueh presented his research paper on public administration and socio-economic development in Hong Kong at the seminar.

## SCHOOL OF EDUCATION RECEPTION

The School of Education invited final year students of the colleges to a reception held at the Y.M.C.A. Waterloo Road on 23rd March. Mr. H.T. Wu, Director of the School of Education, gave the welcome address followed by a talk on the School of Education by Dr. Y.C. Yen. A film on Student Teaching in the United States was also shown.

During refreshments, the students were divided into small informal groups with a staff member of the School of Education as the discussion leader.

The party adjourned to the School of Education where they were shown the facilities of the Language Laboratory, the library and the lecture rooms.

## STAFF PROFILE

*Dr. Morris Berkowitz, Senior Lecturer in Sociology, Chung Chi College.*

Dr. Morris Berkowitz received his Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees from Purdue University in 1952 and 1954 respectively. In 1956, he earned his Master of Arts degree in Sociology at Yale University and was awarded his Doctor of Philosophy degree, also in Sociology at Yale University in 1958.

He was with Rand Corporation and System Development Corporation in Santa Monica, California and Paramus, New Jersey from 1957 to 1962. While there, he participated in system research and system design, with emphasis on computerized control systems. He taught part-time at Columbia University in 1961 and in 1962. He resigned from his position as head of the simulation laboratory in Paramus and went to the University of Pittsburgh as Assistant Professor of Sociology with a joint appointment in the Management Science Center. He was promoted to his present position as Associate Professor in 1963. During this period, he was research consultant with the Pittsburgh Board of Public Education, The American Institute for

Research, the Pittsburgh Commission on Human Relations, and other agencies.

His many publications include two monographs in small group research (one in association with Omar K. Moore), and a book published by the University of Pittsburgh Press, *Social Scientific Studies of Religion*, in collaboration with J.E. Johnson. He is associated with the Regional Council for International Education, and served as associate director of a summer orientation centre for new foreign students going to the United States.

His current interests are in the Sociology of Religion, Social Psychology, Methodology, and general theory.

## COMINGS AND GOINGS

- Dr. James A. Olson, Professor and Chairman, Department of Biochemistry, Faculty of Medical Sciences, Bangkok, visited United College on 16th March. He was received by Dr. S. C. Joseph Fu, Professor of Chemistry of the University, and was shown the Chemistry Department and its laboratories.

- Dr. James J. Thomas of Jamaica, Sociologist and Educator, Area Secretary for the Board of World Missions of the Reformed Church in America, visited Chung Chi College and gave a series of public lectures on the influence of religion on the society.

- Mr. John James, Representative of the Asia Foundation, visited United College on 27th March. He was met by Mr. T.C. Cheng, President, Mr. S.K. Fang, Vice-President, Mr. N.H. Young, Academic Registrar, Mr. T.R. Liu, Deputy Registrar (Students) and the Deans of the Faculties of Arts, Commerce and Social Science, and Science.

After a general exchange of views, the visitor toured the College campus.

- Mr. N.H. Young, Academic Registrar of United College, left for the United States on 29th March to attend an Academic Deans Institute to be held in the University of Chicago during April.

Organized by the American Council on Education, the Institute is an annual seminar for university administrators to study the dean's role in educational policy-making, evaluation of department administration and leadership, faculty recruitment and development, long-range planning and resource allocation, and student participation in academic administration. Mr. Young is the first overseas candidate from Asia to attend a session of the Institute as it normally restricts participation to American university administrators only.



While in the United States, Mr. Young will also visit Indiana University with which United College has an exchange programme, the University of Massachusetts in Boston, and the University of Michigan.

Thereafter Mr. Young will proceed to Europe to visit British and German universities. He is expected to return to Hong Kong on 21st May.

- Dr. Shiu-ying Hu, Senior Lecturer in Biology at Chung Chi College, arrived in Hong Kong on 3rd March from the United States to assume duty.

- Mr. William C.C. Kung, Lecturer in Business Management, United College, attended the Asian Workshop on Justice and Human Progress in Society organized by the Committee for Development of Socio-Economic Life in Asia, at the University of Singapore from 3rd to 8th March. Mr. Kung presented a paper entitled "The Responsibilities of the Business Sector".

In addition, Mr. Kung gave lectures on:

- (a) Wage Incentive Scheme on 29th March at the Hong Kong Management Association, and
- (b) A well-Designed Wage System Helps to Reduce Labour Turnover to members of the Hong Kong Productivity Association on 31st March.

- Visitors to Chung Chi College in the month of March included the Rev. Clifford O. Simpson, Center Church, Manchester, Connecticut; the Rev. Ralph Huffer, former pastor of the First Parish Church, Congregational Dover, and Mrs. Huffer; Dr. Alex J. Grant, the Institute on Ethnic Studies for Asia, the National Council of Churches of the Philippines; Dr. Dean Moore, Office of Communications and Research and Mass Communications Overseas of the United Presbyterian Church, U.S.A.; and Rev. Dr. Dale Doran, Vicar of an Episcopal Church, Pittsburgh, and Mrs. Doran.

- Mr. Koo Yee-yin, a third year student of Chinese Language and Literature, United College, and President of its Student Union, left on 26th March to participate in the 14th Far East Student Leader Project being held in the United States from 27th March, 1968 for about 70 days. Under this project arranged by the United States Department of State, he and other young student leaders from the Far East will visit representative American college and university campuses, meet American students and take part in an experiment in international living. Mr. Koo is the fifth student of United College selected to represent Hong Kong in the Far East Student Leader Project and the second

student of the College so selected in the first three months of 1968.

## COLLEGE NEWS

- A Seminar on Educational Problems in Hong Kong was held at United College on 15th March under the sponsorship of the College Sociology and Social Work Society. The speakers at the Seminar were Mr. N.M. Ho, Assistant Director of Education, Dr. Ho Chung-chung, Principal of the True Light Middle School of Hong Kong and Dr. Maurice Anderson, Vice-President of Hong Kong Baptist College, Chairman of its Department of Sociology and Social Work, and Chairman of the Hong Kong Sociological Association. The discussions were on the problems facing primary and secondary schools, and on education and personality.

The Society also organized a talk on "Priorities for Educational Development" given by Mr. R.F. Simpson, Senior Lecturer in Education, University of Hong Kong, on 23rd March.

- Members of the Executive Committee and Council of the New Asia College Students' Union were invited by their College President, Dr. T.C. Ou, to a reception on 8th March. Also present were members of the academic and administrative staff of the College.

- The 16th Annual Dinner of the Chinese Christian Universities Alumni Association was held on 30th March, at the Hilton Hotel. Vice-Chancellor Choh-Ming Li was invited to speak at the dinner, and Mrs. Li presented the floor prizes.

- Mr. William Kung, Lecturer in Business Management, Mr. Y.C. Jao, Assistant Registrar, and Mr. Charles Cheung, Part-time Lecturer in Accounting and Finance, all of United College, were elected to serve on the Executive Committee of the Hong Kong Economic Association at its Annual General Meeting held on 18th March. Mr. Jao was also elected to the Editorial Board of its official publication, *The Hong Kong Economic Papers*.

- Apart from the scholarships for postgraduate studies for New Asia College graduates, the Yale-in-China Association is offering two scholarships for research studies to staff members and students. Miss Maria Yuen-man Ho, Tutor of the Department of English Language and Literature, 1967-68, has been selected for the award.

- Professor David H. Li of the Lingnan Institute of Business Administration of the University has been appointed Director of the Economic Research Centre of the University with effect from 9th March.

- Professor M.R. Smith, Visiting Professor of Journalism and Dr. Michael T.K. Wei, Lecturer in Journalism, New Asia College, gave a talk to United College students interested in Journalism at United College on 15th March.

- The Institute of Advanced Chinese Studies and Research of New Asia College held a monthly seminar for assistant research fellows and research trainees. Mr. Tso Sze-bong, an assistant research fellow, reported on "Biographical Style in Chinese Traditional Historiography, as viewed in the light of Buddha's Biography". Miss Sun Yuen Kim, a research trainee, reported on "The Background of the Sino-American Monetary Agreement signed in 1936."

- Mr. K.S. Lo, Managing Director of Hong Kong Soya Bean Products Co., Ltd., spoke to Chung Chi College students on "Is Our Educational System Geared to Our Industrial Needs?" on 22nd March.

- At the 104th monthly seminar of New Asia College on 15th March, Mr. Mou Tsung San, Senior Lecturer in Philosophy at the College, spoke on "The Development of Character and the Pursuit of Learning".

- An exhibition of works of art by students was held at United College from 26th to 28th March under the joint sponsorship of the Art and Photographic Clubs of the College. On display were selected and prize-winning works of Chinese painting and calligraphy, oil painting and photographs.

- The Winthrop College Scholarship, started last year for New Asia College graduates to further their studies at that college, has been awarded to Miss Lui Foon Sai, a 1967 graduate of the Department of Chinese Literature.

- Mr. Ho Pung, Assistant Lecturer in Chinese at Chung Chi College, has been promoted to an Associate Lecturership with effect from 1st March.

- 40 students of United College attended an Introduction to Industry Seminar sponsored by the Industrial Committee of Hong Kong Christian Council in cooperation with the Federation of Hong Kong industries, held on 23rd March at the Christian Family Service Centre, Kwun Tong. The seminar was designed to give the interested student an opportunity to gain first-hand knowledge of the industrial life in Hong Kong and the problems facing its industries.

- Besides attending to their academic or administrative duties, the staff members of New Asia

College take part in various research projects. Their research papers are usually published in "The New Asia Academic Annual", and "The New Asia Journal" of The Institute of Advanced Chinese Studies and Research, or printed by the College as monographs.

The following monographs were published by the Institute of Advanced Chinese Studies and Research in 1967-68:

*The Migration of the Fan Tribesmen in China from the Two Han Dynasties through Five Dynasties* by Mr. Su Ch'ing Pin;

*A Study of the Land Communication of the Han Dynasty* by Mr. Tam Chung-yeec;

*A Study of the Chronological Biography of Li Kang* by Mr. Chao Hsiao-suan; and

*A General Survey of the Boat People in Hong Kong* by Mr. Hiroaki Kani.

Prof. T'ang Chun-i's paper on *The Development of Ideas of Human Nature in Chinese Philosophy* is due to be published in the near future.

A group research paper, headed by Dr. Daniel Y. Chang, Head of the Chemistry Department, on *I. Cleavage of  $\beta$ -Ketonic Esters by the Action of Metal Iodides; II. The Action of Hydratec Sodium and Calcium Iodides on Acetoacetic Ester and Its  $\alpha$ -Methylated Derivatives*, will be published in the *Journal of Organic Chemistry* of The American Chemical Society.

- Miss Wong Kwok-shing, a first year Sociology student of United College, was adjudged the winner and awarded the "T.C. Cheng Cup" in a quadrangular speech competition participated by representatives of the students' unions of the Hong Kong University, Chung Chi, New Asia and United Colleges, held on 16th March at United College.

- In the month of March, New Asia College sponsored the following lectures:

"Editorial Writing" delivered by Mr. Kuei Chung Shu, Editor, Sing Tao Jih Pao;

"The Perception of Beauty" by Mr. Mou Tsung San, Senior Lecturer in Philosophy; and

"The Sung-Yuen Lyrics and Songs: Their Relation to the Characteristic of the Han Official Collection of Tunes" by Mr. Wong Ching Chang, Senior Lecturer in Chinese Literature of the College.

- The 7th Annual Athletic Meet of the Hong Kong Post-Secondary Colleges Athletic Association was held on 16th March at the Government Stadium. Chung Chi College was champion in the men's and runners-up in the women's track and field events, and won, for the 5th time, the group championship with a score of 141 points.

- The New Asia College Music Club presented Gilbert and Sullivan's Operetta "H.M.S. Pinafore" on 31st March at the City Hall. The operetta was first performed by the Club in 1963.

- At the invitation of the Academic Department of New Asia College, Dr. A.T. Roy, Vice-President of Chung Chi College, spoke on "The Future of Hong Kong" on 22nd March.

- Mr. Chu Siu-ming, a fourth year student of Business Management, United College, won a Gold Shield and the Dr. Onward Szeto Challenge Trophy in March for his photographs entered in the 13th Hong Kong Students' Photographic Contest organized by the King's College Photographic Club.

- The Social Convenors Department of the New Asia College Students' Union presented a variety show on 17th March. The programme of the evening included pop music, modern dances, Chinese music, folk dances and Japanese sword-play.

△曼谷醫學院生物化學系教授兼系主任柯爾遜博士 (Dr. James A. Olson) 於三月十六日訪問聯合書院。由該院化學系講座教授傅守正博士接待懇談，並陪同參觀化學系及實驗室等處。

△牙買加著名教育家及社會學家，又為美國改革宗教會海外傳道部分區秘書譚馬士博士 (Dr. James J. Thomas)，最近訪問崇基學院，並就宗教對社會之影響，先後作數次之演講。

白國衛博士 (Dr. Morris Beckwith)

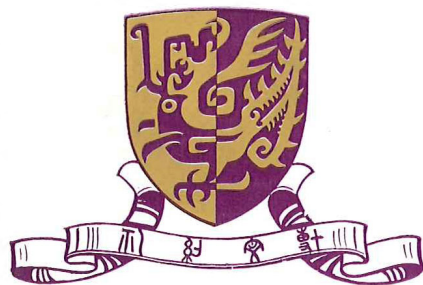
崇基社會學系高級講師

白國衛博士，於一九五二年及一九五四年，在普度大學先後獲得理學士及理學碩士學位後，復在耶魯大學，於一九五六年獲社會學碩士學位，並於一九五八年再得社會學博士學位。

自一九五七年至一九六二年，白博士在加州山達蒙尼卡之蘭德公司及新傑西州巴拉瑪斯之工商制度發展公司担任職務，並參加制度研究及制度設計等工作，其所側重研究者為電子計算之管制方法。一九六一年與一九六二年，曾在哥倫比亞大學兼課。旋又辭去其在巴拉瑪斯任模擬實驗室主任之職，而轉就畢茨堡大學之社會學助理教授，兼管理科學中心之職務。一九六三年即擢升為副教授。當是時，歷任畢茨堡公共教育委員會，美國研究學社，畢茨堡人類關係研究委員會及其他機構之研究顧問。

白氏著作豐富，其中有兩篇論文，為小組研究之專論，其中有一篇係與慕爾 (Omar K. Moore) 合著者；另有「對宗教作社會科學之研究」一書，乃與約翰遜 (J. E. Johnson) 共同著述者，業經畢茨堡大學出版部刊行。渠曾任國際教育地區委員會委員，及暑期指導新生入學中心副主任，指導外國新生赴美國求學。

渠對於宗教社會學，社會心理學，方法學及一般理論均感興趣。
