### WORKSHOP ON PERSONNEL ADMINISTRATION


A Workshop on Personnel Administration for mid-level university administrators sponsored by the Commonwealth Conference of Registrars of Universities in the Southeast Asia and Pacific Area was held in Hong Kong from 15th to 21st May. The Workshop was organized and hosted by the University of Hong Kong and this University and attended by delegates from universities in the area: Nanyang University, University of Singapore, Universiti Pertanian Malaysia, Universiti Malaya, University of Papua and New Guinea, Institut Teknoloji Kebangsaan, University of the South Pacific, Universiti Sains Malaysia, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia, and the Papua and New Guinea University of Technology. The two delegates in the area:

The keynote address on "Personnel Administration—its Purposes and Practices" was delivered by Mr. A. Tattersall, Secretary of University College, London, who came to Hong Kong to serve as Workshop Leader at the invitation of the two host universities and under the auspices of the Inter-University Council for Higher Education Overseas in London. Other topics for discussion included:

"Appointment procedures"; "Promotion procedures and criteria, including staff assessment, performance, discipline and efficiency bar"; "Estimating staff needs—establishment systems and post control, norms and ratios, teaching hours and research, teaching assistance, etc."; "Terms of appointment for academic and other staff—salaries, contracts, including probation, substantiation, tenure and dismissal, outside practice"; "Fringe benefits: leave, housing, medical schemes, expatriate staff conditions"; "Staff and establishment records"; "Negotiations on salary and conditions, etc., with Government" and "Staff training".

The Workshop was financed with a substantial grant from the Commonwealth Technical Cooperation Fund.

### RECENT DEVELOPMENTS OF THE INSTITUTE OF CHINESE STUDIES

The Institute of Chinese Studies was established in 1967 to give concrete expression to the University's dedication to the promotion of Chinese studies. With the University's unique cultural heritage, the Institute fosters inter-disciplinary research among staff members in various fields and ten publications have already been published. The University has decided to step up its activities further in the next decade to make it an international stronghold of Chinese studies and a distinctive feature of the University.

Prof. C.T. Hu, on leave from Columbia University, has been appointed full-time Director of the Institute, and he has lost no time in formulating plans for the development of its research activities and teaching function and the strengthening of international ties.

### Research

The research programme of the Institute will be developed to make full use of the human and material resources of the University and the favourable cultural, academic, social and political conditions of Hong Kong. Apart from individual research projects there will be an integrated research programme for the study of developments in modern and contemporary Chinese culture, from academic pursuits to the arts and crafts, drawing

upon the social and natural sciences as well as the humanities in methodology and embracing all four Faculties of the University in scope. Not only will inter-disciplinary cooperation within the University be promoted, but the Institute will also seek to set up exchange programmes and establish other ties with universities all over the world.

### **Teaching**

The primary function of the Institute is research, but through its research it can contribute to teaching and help to bring about the necessary improvements. The Institute should assume a coordinating and innovative role in teaching, where its first task must be to define clearly the scope of "Chinese studies", so that course content may be revised accordingly and efforts may be made to improve teaching methods.

### **International Cooperation**

With its favourable setting the Institute plans to enter into close cooperation with scholars all over the world to make an intensive study of all aspects of Chinese culture, the living culture of an ever-changing country, thereby strengthening international ties and making it an international centre of Chinese studies.

### **Reference Collection**

The Institute aims to build up within the next few years a comprehensive and systematic collection of reference materials adequate to serve

both research and teaching staff and worthy of international recognition.

### Prof. C.T. Hu, Director of Institute of Chinese Studies

Prof. C.T. Hu obtained his B.A. from National Fu-tan University in 1942 and his M.A.

and Ph.D. from the University of Washington, Seattle, in 1950 and 1954 respectively.

Prof. Hu was Research Associate at the University of Washington and Yale University from 1949 to 1957. In 1957 he was appointed Associate Professor at the State University of New York. Since 1959 he has been Professor of Comparative Education at Teachers College, Columbia University. Prof. Hu has served as Visiting Professor at a number of universities, including Princeton University, the University of Washington, Harvard University, the University of Delhi and this University. He has also served as Acting Editor of Comparative Education Review, member of the Editorial Board of Yearbook of Education and consultant to the Ford Foundation.

Prof. Hu has carried out extensive research in Chinese studies and his publications include *China*, *Its People, Its Culture, Its Society; Chinese Education under Communism* and *Symposium on Chinese Education*.

Prof. Hu's association with this University dates back to 1969, when he was Visiting Professor at the School of Education. He has since served for three years as External Examiner in Education and has visited this University regularly to advise on the development of the Institute of Chinese Studies and the Graduate School. He has now been appointed the first full-time Director of the Institute.

Dr. Choh-Ming Li, the Vice-Chancellor, left for conferences overseas in the months of May, June and July. 


