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COOPERATION BETWEEN THE TWO UNIVERSITIES

The University of Hong Kong and The Chinese University of Hong Kong jointly announced on March 24, 1966 that they had made more formal arrangements to ensure a full-exchange of information and further cooperation between the two Universities in matters of common interest, both in regard to their internal affairs and in their relationship with the community as a whole, in particular with the University Grants Committee.

There have, of course, long been personal contacts at all levels between the staff of the two Universities, both academic and administrative, about matters with which they are individually concerned. The Vice-Chancellors are, moreover, each members of the Councils of both Universities. In addition, there have also been regular informal meetings between the two Vice-Chancellors to discuss matters of common concern. These informal meetings will be an essential part of the new machinery but will be supplemented by meet-

ings of a liaison group consisting of the Vice-Chancellors, Registrars and Bursars of both Universities.

Meetings of the liaison group have already proved themselves a valuable addition to the many ways in which the two Universities seek to assist each other in the promotion of learning and research to which, as Universities, they are both dedicated, and, in so doing, to serve the community to the best of their ability and resources.

EXCHANGE AGREEMENT RENEWED

An agreement for exchange of scholars entered into by the University of California and this University in May last year has been renewed for another year.

For the academic year 1966-67, not more than eleven students enrolled at a campus of the University of California, including four or five graduate fellows, may be enrolled for a year of studies in this University, this year to include a five-week orientation and intensive language programme.

Five undergraduates and three fellows have been selected by the University of California to be sent to this University some time in August this year. All of them, having excellent academic records, have been accepted by this University.

Among the five undergraduates, three are from Berkeley, one from Los Angeles and another from Santa Barbara. Three of them major in Political Science, one in Political Philosophy and the other in Oriental History. All of them are male and Juniors.

The Senior Fellow coming to this University in August is Mr. Stephen Hoadley of the Santa Barbara campus. He is a Ph.D. candidate in Political Science, and has a special interest in theories of social and political change, political systems analysis and behavioral techniques for studying political phenomena.

The Junior Fellows are Mr. Walker Adams Bush and Mr. Donald Holoch. Mr. Bush is a Ph.D. candidate in Political Science minoring in English. He is also an M.S. in Journalism. He has taught English as a second language in Los Angeles and Singapore. Mr. Holoch of the Berkeley campus is a Ph.D. candidate in Comparative Literature with a minor in English and German.

The University of California waives its non-resident tuition fee for the same number of students from The Chinese University enrolled at any one of its campus as the number of its own students enrolled at The Chinese University.

The renewed Agreement also provides for three fellowships for faculty members of The Chinese University to study at the graduate school at one of the campuses of the University of California. Such fellowships carry travel grants plus a living subsidy of US\$1,000.

FIRST SHELL SCHOLAR FROM THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG

The first Shell Scholarship of this University has been awarded to Mr. Tse Fu-yuen for advanced studies. He will leave this summer to study for a Master's degree in Economic Geography at the London School of Economics and Political Science.

Mr. Tse was graduated from Chung Chi College in 1965 with a Bachelor's degree in Social Science. He took Geography as his major subject and History as his minor. He is at present teaching at La Salle College in Kowloon.

Last year, the Shell Company of Hong Kong, Limited, donated \$200,000 to this University to establish a Shell Scholarship Endowment Fund. The interest accruing annually from the Fund is used exclusively to provide, from time to time, for a scholarship to enable an outstanding graduate of the University to undertake post-graduate studies for a higher degree in the United Kingdom.

KWOK CHING TONG SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT FUND

The University has received an endowment of HK\$100,000.00 from the Trustees of Kwok Ching Tong Memorial Charity Fund.

The late Mr. Kwok received his early education at Queen's College, Hong Kong, and later studied at the Foochow Nautical Academy. After graduation, he served in the Chinese Navy for twenty years, rising to the rank of Rear Admiral. He went into business in Canton and Hong Kong after his retirement. In view of his interest in education and charity during his lifetime, his sons Mr. G.S. Kwok, the late Mr. K.K. Kwok and Mr. Kwok Chan Kwan, all of them distinguished personalities in the banking business, established the Fund in his memory.

The endowment is to be known as the Kwok Ching Tong Scholarship Endowment Fund, and its income will be used to provide scholarships, each of HK\$ 3,000.00 per annum, to two or three undergraduates of the University. These scholarships will be awarded according to the regular University procedure on the basis of both academic ability and financial need. The award will be reviewed each year and preference will be given to the current recipients until their graduation.

CERTIFICATE COURSE ON HOTEL MANAGEMENT

The University's Department of Extra-Mural Studies is offering a certificate course of hotel management to begin in September this year.

The Programme is designed for persons who wish to make hotel business their career, or who, being in the business, wish to maintain and advance their own competence. A Certificate in Hotel Management will be issued to successful candidates after written and oral examinations.

An intensive part-time programme, it consists of more than 700 class hours over a period of two years. It is made up of the following courses: Introduction to Hotel Management; Elementary Accounting; Intermediate Accounting; Hotel Accounting; Hotel House-keeping; Sanitation; The Bar & Wines; The Restaurant; Economics; Catering; Food Equipment, Use, Selection & Purchasing; Banqueting Sales & Special Functions; Hotel Engineering; Hotel Psychology; Public Relations, Advertising & Sales; Personnel Management; Accounting Machines in Hotels; Insurance & Legal Aspects of Innkeeping; English Business Correspondence; English Public Speaking; Japanese.

Instructors include members of the teaching staff of the University and executives of local hotels, tourist industries and related organisations.

For persons intending to apply for the course, they must have at least the Hong Kong School-leaving Certificate or its equivalent, and the age preference will be from 19 to 30. But no special qualifications will be required of those who elect individual courses only.

TEACHING POSTS FOR THIS UNIVERSITY'S GRADUATES

Seventy-two of this University's four hundred and seventy-seven graduates are now in the teaching profession, according to the recent statistics given by the Government Education Department. Of these 72, 14 have received a teacher's training in one form or another, but not from the University's School of Education which was established in September, 1965.

STAFF PROFILES

Mrs. Lung Tu Chi-yung, Lecturer, Chinese Language & Literature, United College.

Mrs. Lung obtained her B.A. degree in Chinese Language and Literature from the National Taiwan University in 1953, and her M.A. degree from the same University in 1956. She served first as Lecturer (1956-1961) and then Associate Professor (1961-1964) in the Department of Chinese Language and Literature in her *alma mater*. She joined United College as an Assistant Lecturer in Chinese in 1964.

Her publications include: *An Examination into the Reference Books Noted in Mao-Shih-Chun*, *An Annotated List of Sound-Related Dissyllabic Compounds in the Book of Odes*, *Notes on the Pronunciation of Mao-Chih-Shih-Wen*, a translation of *The Chinese Language* by Bernhard Karlgren.

Mr. J.C. Lee, Lecturer, Business Administration, New Asia College.

Mr. Lee was born in the Province of Anhwei. Having graduated from the National Ordnance Engineering College and Central University, he pursued his post-graduate study at the College of Commerce and Business Administration of the University of Illinois.

Mr. Lee has been teaching in the Department of Business Administration of New Asia College since 1961. Before joining the College, he had been professor in the following colleges and universities: National

Ordinance Engineering College, Taiwan University, Normal University and Nanyang University. He was for some time Director of the Chinese Management Association and the National Association of Cost Accountants of China.

His publications include: *Motion and Time Study*, Ordinance Engineering College, 1951; *Industrial Management* (2 Vols), Chinese Management Association, 1965 and 1958; *Plant Layout*, China Productivity Center, 1956; *Top Management*, Nanyang University, 1960; *Office Management* (2 Vols.), Nanyang University, 1960; *Industrial Relations and Personnel Management*, Aurora Book Co. 1965.

Mrs. Ho Tung Te-hing, Lecturer, Sociology, New Asia College.

Mrs. Ho Tung Te-hing received her B.A. degree from the National South-West Associated University, Kunming, China, in 1943. She went to the United States to study Sociology and obtained the degree of Master of Arts from the University of Michigan. She received special training in Social Work at Merrill Palmer Institute, Detroit, Michigan, U.S.A., specialising in child development and family life. She did graduate research at the University of London and participated in the Programme of Advanced Study at Smith College School for Social Work, Northampton, Massachusetts, U.S.A.

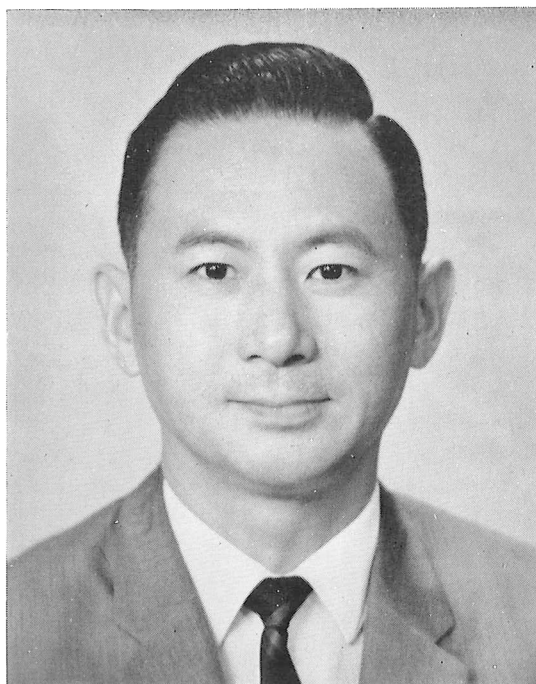
During the war, Mrs. Ho was a probation officer in the Kunming Magistracy, and from 1950 to 1958, she was a family case worker in the Hong Kong War Memorial Fund Office. From 1947 to 1949, she was associate professor in Hwa Nan College, Foochow, China. Before joining New Asia College, she taught in the Hong Kong Baptist College. Her publications include: *Understanding of Social Work* (in Chinese, 1960), and *Social Welfare Work in Great Britain and U.S.A.* (in Chinese, 1963).

Mr. John T.S. Chen, Secretary, New Asia College.

Mr. Chen, a native of Nan Hoi, Kwangtung, was educated at Aurora University, Shanghai, where he obtained an LL.B. degree and a French Diplome de Licencie en Sciences Politiques et Economiques in 1946. His French thesis was "La Mission de Yuan Shih-k'ai en Corée".

After 1946, he did research in the field of Chinese economics at Aurora University for several years; his many essays appeared in the University's economics journal *Monthly Bulletin (Chinese Economics)*, which he helped edit. From 1948 to 1951, he taught General Economics and Economic Geography of China at Aurora.

After he came to Hong Kong in 1951, he taught in Wah Yan College for five years. From 1956 to 1959 he was Editor of the *Chinese Weekly Review* and a



Lecturer at the Central Political Institute in Vientiane, Laos. From 1959 to 1965, he served as Senior Programme Assistant to The Asia Foundation, Hong Kong. He joined New Asia College in April 1965.

Mr. Chen is the author of *Return to the Fold of Christ* and *1001 Chinese Proverbs*. He has also translated several books from English into Chinese.

Mr. Lyon Yuan Lee, Assistant Registrar, Chung Chi College

Mr. Lee, born in Canton, China, was educated first in Shanghai and then in Wah Yan College, Kowloon.



He was graduated from Chung Chi College with a major in Economics and a minor in Business Administration. He received his M.A. degree at George Peabody College of Nashville, Tenn. where he studied Library Science and Education. He did further graduate work at the University of Minnesota.

After his studies in the United States, he served for a short time as Special Assistant to the Registrar at Austin College of Sherman, Texas. Then he received a grant from The Asia Foundation to make an observation visit to five private colleges in the States to study their curricula and libraries. Later he joined the Chalmer Davee Library of the Wisconsin State University at River Falls, Wis. He resigned from it in 1964 in order to return to his *alma mater* where he had served before going abroad. He is now the Assistant Registrar of Chung Chi College.

Mr. Lee is a member of the National Association for Foreign Student Affairs (U.S.A.), and a member of the American Library Association.

△格魯麗雅國際出版公司於四月十四日及十五日假崇基學院舉行美國百科全書展覽。

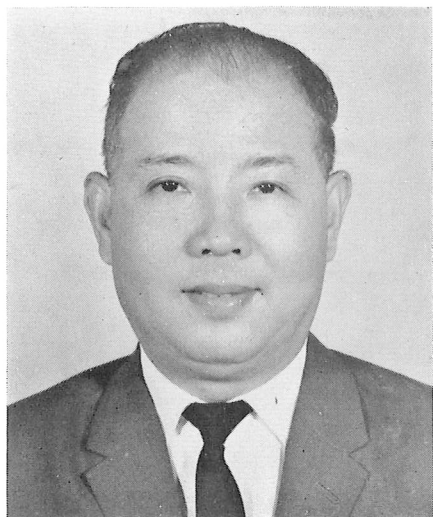
△崇基學院物理系技術員郁偉信先生獲倫敦工程師協會選為贊助會員。

陳氏之中文及外文著述甚多，包括「重歸天主懷抱」及「中國諺語一千零一句」各書。

李乃元先生 崇基 助理註冊主任

李氏並為美國國立外國留學生事務協會及美國圖書館協會等團體之會員。

本大學已將蜆殼留英獎學金首先授予謝福原君供其赴英深造。渠將於本年夏赴英入倫敦大學經濟政治學院研讀經濟地理碩士課程。

謝君為崇基學院之畢業生，在校時以地理為主科，歷史為副科，於一九六五年畢業，獲本大學社會學學士學位，現在九龍喇沙書院担任教職。

香港蜆殼有限公司去年捐贈本大學港幣二十萬元，設置蜆殼獎學基金，以每年所得之利息撥作獎學金，

獎助本大學之優秀畢業生一名前往英國研讀高級學位之課程。

郭靖堂助學基金

本大學業蒙郭靖堂慈善基金代表人捐贈港幣十萬元，作為獎學基金。

查郭公靖堂係廣東番禺縣人，幼年肄業於本港皇仁書院，旋考錄福州船政學堂官學生，與我國海軍耆宿程璧光、李鼎新、劉冠南等同屆畢業。其後服務政府凡二十餘年，叙至海軍少將。

退役後在省港經營商業，曾與周壽臣、馮平山、李煜堂、郭少濤先生組織「九老會」。郭公生平樂善好施，尤重教育。其哲嗣作治、景琨、鎮坤諸先生皆為銀行界知名之士，不忘庭訓，成立慈善紀念基金，以繼先人遺志。

該項捐款，現由本大學以「郭靖堂助學金」名義設立獎學金，每年獎助本校學生二名至三名，每名每年港幣三千元。凡學生成績優良而家境清貧者，本大學得察其情形，依照規定辦法給予獎助。是項獎助，當由本校當局逐年加以檢討，除特殊情形外，仍以頒給原領獎人為原則，供其完成學業。

校外進修部開辦「旅業管理」課程

本大學校外進修部將於本年九月開辦「旅業管理」文憑課程，以利欲投身旅業或對該業作更深瞭解者之進修。將來修業期滿，筆試與口試俱及格者，將由該部給予畢業文憑。

該項業餘進修課程為期兩年，上課時間達七百小時，其課程內容如下：旅業導論，初級會計，中級會

計，旅館會計，旅館內務衛生，酒吧及酒，餐室，經濟學，食品供應，食物之裝備、使用、選擇與採購，筵席與其他盛會，旅館工程，旅館心理學，公共關係，廣告與推銷，人事管理，旅館計算機，旅業之保險及法律，英文商業信札，英語演講及日文。

教授該項課程者計有本大學之教師，本港旅遊業及各有關機構之負責人。

欲申請進修該課程者必須有英文中學會考畢業證書或同等資格。年齡在十九與三十歲之間者將獲優先取錄。選科攻讀者之資格不限。

兩大學密切合作

本大學與香港大學於本年三月廿四日聯合宣佈，兩校已設立機構，對彼此有關之共同問題，力謀消息之充分交流，並求更密切之合作，其範圍除校務外，包括兩校與整個社會之關係，尤其對大學經費分配委員會方面。

兩校各級教職員間，對於切身事務，素不乏私人商討機會，而兩校之校長，俱為兩校之校董，在過去數年中，經常舉行非正式之會談。此項會談，將為新機構之主要部分，惟將輔以聯絡小組。該小組係由兩校之校長、校務主任及總務主任所組織而成，經常開會討論各項問題，使今後兩校間之聯繫，益臻密切。

兩校一向以互助之方式，發揚學術研究，藉此服務社會，不遺餘力。此聯絡小組之集會，已使兩校間之合作，更進一步。

本校與加州大學交換協定續約

本大學與美國加尼福尼亞州大學間去年五月簽訂之交換協定，頃已續延一年。

加州大學可於一九六六至一九六七學年內選派學生十一名，包括研究員四至五名，前來本大學攻讀一年，首先以五週之時間，專修中文，並作種種活動，

以謀熟識環境。

加州大學現已選定肄業生五名及研究員三名，將於本年八月間前來本校。各生學業成績優良，業經本校准許入學。

該五名肄業生中有三名係來自柏克萊，一名來自洛杉磯，另一名來自聖巴巴拉。五生中主修政治者三名，政治哲學者一名，東方歷史者又一名，均為大學三年級男生。

高級研究員赫德列先生(Mr. Stephen Headley)來自加州大學聖巴巴拉，現正攻讀政治學哲學博士學位課程，對於社會及政治變革之理論，政治制度之分析及研究政治現象之技巧等，特具興趣。

初級研究員則有布希先生(Mr. Walker Adams Bush)及何樂治先生(Mr. Donald Holoch)。布先生為新聞學系理學碩士，曾在洛杉磯及新加坡各地教授英語，現正從事有關政治學哲學博士學位論文之著作，兼修英國語文。

何先生係柏克萊之研究員，專攻比較文化，準備應哲學博士學位之考試，兼修英文及德文。

本大學選派前往加州大學攻讀之學生，將蒙該大學豁免學費，人數與加州大學選派來本校攻讀者相同。

新約規定：加州大學將以研究獎學金贈予本校教師若干名在該校研究院研究，是項獎學金包括來回旅費補助金及生活津貼美金一千元。

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
