## GIFTS TO THE UNIVERSITY

## Donation by CARE

The University Council confirmed the acceptance of two grants by CARE through the World University Service to Chung Chi College and New Asia College for the purchase of a quantity of science equipment. Chung Chi received HK\$17,439.20, and New Asia \$17,450.00. A grant to United College was reported in an earlier issue of this Bulletin.

Scholarship for Students of Business Administration

The Rotary club of Hong Kong has offered to this University HK\$30,000 for setting up a scholarship in memory of one of its members, the late Mr. G.E. Marden. The sum will be invested and the proceeds therefrom used to establish a scholarship for a student of Business Administration.

### Scholarships for Students of Journalism

The Sin Poh Amalgamated (H.K.) Limited has donated two and Wah Kiu Yat Po four scholarships of H.K.\$1,500 each annually for outstanding students studying in the Department of Journalism of New Asia College.

## COMINGS AND GOINGS

△ Mr. N. Chithamparanathan, Associate General Secretary of the World University Service Secretariat at Geneva, Switzerland, Mr. Fujita, Executive Secretary of the World University Service of Japan, Mrs. L.P. Gutang, Director of the Student Counselling Service of Far Eastern University, Philippines, and Mr. Gutang visited Chung Chi College on May 5. They exchanged views on questions of student welfare with the advisers and members of the Chung Chi Branch of the Hong Kong World University Service.

△ Mr. Harold Ho, Lecturer in Social Work of Chung Chi College, has been granted leave of absence for about four weeks to attend the annual American National Conference on Social Welfare to be held in Chicago from May 29 to June 3 and followed by a seminar course on Social Treatment of Juvenile Delinquents at the University of Chicago. He left Hong Kong for Chicago on May 24 and is expected to return before the end of June.

△ Dr. George H. Armacost, President of the University of Redlands, visited Chung Chi College and addressed the College Assembly on May 20 on the subject "The Challenge of Education Today".

△ Miss Lee Hei-Man, Lecturer in Social Work of Chung Chi College, will be representing the University as one of the delegates from Hong Kong to attend the International Congress of Schools of Social Work and the International Conference of Social Work from August 22 to September 10, 1966 in Washington D.C., U.S.A. She will also visit some of the schools of Social Work in the U.S.A. and universities in the United Kingdom to study their social work training programmes. These visits will be arranged by the Council of Social Work Education in the United States.

△ Under a WUS Staff Training Fellowship, Dr. S.T. Chang, Lecturer and Chairman of the Department of Biology of Chung Chi College, will spend a year at Harvard University as Post-Doctoral Fellow to carry out research in the genetics of the tetrapolar incompatibility, which is so common in higher fungi. He is particularly interested in the analysis of subgene model for the A incompatibility factor of Schizophyllum Commune, and he will work with Professor June R. Raper, an international authority in this field. He expects to be at Harvard around September 20.

Dr. Samuel Chan has been appointed Acting Chairman of the Department during Dr. Chang's absence.

△ Mr. Robert Bunnell, Assistant Area Representative of the Ford Foundation, called on the Vice-Chancellor on May 31 during his recent trip to Hong Kong. He visited all the three Colleges and the University site at Ma Liu Shui.

△ Mr. A. D. Hardy, Deputy Secretary of the Cambridge Local Examination Syndicate, visited the

University Registry on May 27.

△ Mr. K.E. Robinson, M.A., F.R. Hist. S., Vice-Chancellor of the University of Hong Kong, and a Council member of this University, visited United College on May 27 and New Asia College on June 2. The Vice-Chancellor exchanged views with senior members of the administrative and academic staff of the two Colleges on higher education in Hong Kong and on various aspects of cooperation between the two Universities

△ Miss Lai Fung-Wai, a sophomore at New Asia College who represented Hong Kong's university and post-secondary college students at the Far East Student Leader Project VIII sponsored by the U.S. State Department, returned to the Colony at the end of May after a two-month visit.

△ Mr. Chi Hsiu, Lecturer in Chemistry at New Asia College, left for Japan in June to visit the University of Tokyo and the Tokyo University of Education to collect teaching materials and to exchange ideas with the faculty members of these two universities on teaching methods.

△ Mr. C.S. Liang, Acting Chairman of the Department of History and Geography of Chung Chi College, has become a member of the Association of American Geographers and of the American Geographical Society.

△ Dr. George H.C. Wong, Lecturer and Chairman of the Department of History and Geography of Chung Chi College, returned on June 2 after a year of postdoctorate research at the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, Tufts University, U.S.A.

△ Mr. P.Y. Lo, Lecturer in Business Administration of Chung Chi College, has been appointed Chairman of the Department of Economics and Business Administration to replace Dr. K.C. Mark.

△ The Students' Painting and Calligraphy Exhibition organized by New Asia College was opened on June 4. Fifty-three schools and colleges were represented in this exhibition, among which were The Teachnical College and many Chinese and English high schools. Two hundred entries were selected for display from among five hundred. This year's exhibition showed a marked improvement over that of last year.

△ Mr. Michael Chui, Demonstrator in Physics, and Miss Annabella Wang, Demonstrator in English at United College, have been awarded Ford Foundation Grants under the Faculty Development Programme of this University They are expected to leave later this summer for the University of California to pursue further studies in their respective fields

△ Mr. Ma Tsoy-wo, Demonstrator in Mathematics at United College, has been awarded a Fulbright Travel Grant to pursue further studies at the University of California, Santa Barbara. He is also expected to leave later this summer.

## RADIO PROGRAMME ON THE UNIVERSITY

Beginning from July this year, the two Universities in Hong Kong will be featured in a special programme called "UNIVERSITY REPORT" on the English channel of Radio Hong Kong.

The programme of thirty minutes' length will be presented fortnightly. The public will be informed of developments in the two local universities as well as in other universities abroad. Members of this University will be interviewed from time to time.

### OBITUARY

Mr. C.K. Tse, Registrar of Chung Chi College, died of a heart attack on June 9, 1966 at 10.30 a.m. He was sixty-seven.

Mr. Tse had been associated with Lingnan University for more than ten years before he took up the Registrarship of Chung Chi on the founding of the College in 1951. He rendered the College distinguished service and his loss is deeply mourned over by the whole College community and his many friends in the University.

The College is establishing a scholarship fund in memory of Mr. Tse. Contributions to the fund are most welcomed.

## STUDY OF MODERN LANGUAGES

Teaching of modern languages in this University is receiving strong support from various foreign governments

The French Government will shortly send a teacher of French to the University to strengthen the University's existing teaching staff.

A professor of Japanology, together with a number of assistants, will soon be assigned to the University by the Japanese Government to promote the University's Japanese studies. They are now being selected by the Japanese Ministry of Education.

There is already a lectureship in German contributed by the German Academic Exchange Service.

The University is well equipped with language laboratories which prove to be a valuable aid to the study of foreign languages.

## STAFF PROFILES

Mr. Wang Ning, New Asia College, Lecturer in English Language and Literature.

Mr. Wang Ning was born in Nanking and brought up and educated in Shanghai, where he received his Beachelor of Arts degree from St. John's University. Thence he taught at secondary and post-secondary colleges in Shanghai, Sarawark, and Hong Kong.

He joined the Department of English of New Asia College in 1958. In 1961 he was invited to attend the Educational Research Council of Hong Kong. In 1963, he attended the annual meeting of The Linguistic Society of America, of which he is a member, and the 1963 Linguistic Institute in Seattle, Washington. From September 1963 to May 1964 he was on a World University Service fellowship, doing linguistics research at the Louisiana State University. After he was awarded a Master of Arts degree, the American Council of Learned Societies gave him a grant to attend the 1964 Linguistic Institute and the Summer Meeting of The Linguistic Society of America in Bloomington, Indiana. He returned to New Asia in August 1964.

He has written several articles on linguistics and on the teaching of the English language, some of which are published in the New Asia Academic Journal. Among these articles are: On the Teaching of English in Hong Kong, (1959); Problems of Teaching English in Post-Secondary Colleges, (1962); Trends in American General Linguistics, (1965). He is an associate-author of Patterns of English, a text-book for Cantonese speaking students published by Longmans, Green & Co. in 1966.

Dr. Kai-Keung Mark, New Asia College, Lecturer in Biology (Molecular Biology)

Dr. Mark was still a high school student in Pui Ching Middle School, when he developed a strong

interest in biological subjects. During 1956-60, he studied biology and chemistry at the Hong Kong Baptist College on a Frank Shu Scholarship; he made it a habit to collect Hong Kong orchids and Hong Kong ferns during those years. In 1960, he was awarded the Lam Chi-Fung Scholarship and the Frank Shu Scholarship to study biochemistry at Baylor University in the United States. He joined the Biochemistry Department of the University of California, Berkeley, in 1961, and received his Master degree there within a year. Having developed an interest in bacteriophage, he went to the Institute of Molecular Biology, University of Oregon, to work under Professor Streisinger on bacteriophage development inside the infected bacteria. He was awarded a Predoctoral Traineeship by the U.S. Public Health Service for all the three years he spent at the University of Oregon, and was elected a member of Sigma Si, a national honorary science society. He also participated in the Phage Meeting in Cold Spring Harbor in the summer of 1963, and the Federation Meeting of Experimental Biology, Atlantic City, in the spring of 1965. His chief research results were presented by Dr. Streisinger on the Molecular Biology Meeting at Hawaii in the summer of 1965. Dr. Mark received his Ph.D. degree in Molecular Biology in August, 1965. On his way back to Hong Kong, he visited the Institute of Molecular Biology and Biophysics of Yale University, the Institute of Molecular Biology of Cambridge University, the Microbiology Laboratory of University of Denmark at Copenhagen, and the National Molecular Biology Research Unit at Naples, Italy,

Dr. Mark is now a lecturer in the Department of Biology, New Asia College. His research interest is in the biochemical changes that occur in a bacterial cell infected by bacteriophage T4.

Fr. John Gannon, S.J., United College, Lecturer in English Literature.

Fr. Gannon was born in Ireland in 1922. He entered

the society of Jesus in 1939, completing his noviceship training two years later. He then entered the National University of Ireland, University College Dublin, where he took a First Class Honours B.A. degree in 1944. This was followed by a three-year course in Philosophy, scholastic and modern, at the end of which Fr. Gannon joined the group of Irish Jesuits working in Hong Kong and Canton.

From 1947-49 he studied Cantonese in Canton. In the following year he taught in the Hong Kong Wah Yan College, and in 1950 he returned to Ireland for five years' study of theology and ordination to the priesthood, taking further degrees of B.S. and S.T.L.

Returning to Hong Kong in 1955, he spent another year on the study of Cantonese before entering Chu Hai College as a lecturer in English in April 1956. He taught in Chu Hai College until 1963, when he left Hong Kong for further studies in the United States. For six of the years that he taught at Chu Hai College he was Head of the Department of Foreign Languages and Literature, as well as a member of the College Board of Trustees. During this period he also undertook part-time teaching in United College and in New Asia College, was Director of a Chinese cultural magazine, Tsing Nin Man Yau (青年文友), founder and supervisor of the College Club for Post-Secondary Students, and founder of the Federation of Catholic Students, a body which embraces the Catholic societies of the two universities, the Post-Secondary Colleges and the Teachers' Training Colleges.

In 1963-64, Fr. Gannon spent a year at Columbia University, taking an M.A. degree in English Literature. Returning to Hong Kong in 1964 he entered United College as an Assistant Lecturer. He was promoted to Lecturer in 1965.

He has published a number of short stories in *The Irish Monthly*, and two critical articles in *Studies*. His most recent publication is *Literary Imitation in Renaissance Poetics*, United College Journal, Vol. IV, 1965.
