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## UNIVERSITY UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE EXAMINATION

Beginning from the academic year 1967/68, the Degree Examination will be split into two parts: Part I to be taken at the end of the third year and Part II at the end of the fourth year. This year, the 3rd year students will sit for Part I of the Degree Examination, while the 4th year students will take the full Degree/Diploma Examination. After 1967, there will be no Diploma Examination.

In the Part I Degree Examination, a candidate is required to take three to five papers as prescribed by the Board concerned. Passing all the papers in Part I is a necessary prerequisite for promotion to the 4th year. In the Part II Examination he will be required to take the remaining papers as prescribed, making a total of minimum seven papers.

A candidate who fails in his Part I may be permitted to repeat a year, and enter for the same Examination of the following year.

Candidates who pass both Parts of the Examination will be awarded Bachelor's Degrees of the University.

## UNIVERSITY INTERMEDIATE EXAMINATION

The University will hold its first Intermediate Examination at the end of this academic year for students who have completed their second year in the University. The examination is intended to be a test of the candidates' ability to benefit from their courses of studies and the working knowledge of some of the basic principles in their subject fields. Passing the Examination is a prerequisite for promotion to the third year.

This Examination shall normally be held in June each year.

## ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON JOURNALISM EDUCATION AND OTHERS

In August 1965, an Advisory Committee on Journalism Education and Communications Research was set up by the Vice-Chancellor under the Chairmanship of Mr. N.J.V. Watt, Director of Information Service of Hong Kong, to advise the University on the development of a program of journalism education and communications research. More specifically, the Committee was requested to assist the University's Mass Communications Centre and the Department of Journalism in New Asia College (1) in assessing the overall needs of the Hong Kong and Asian community in respect of training and research in journalism, (2) in exploring the most effective ways of fulfilling these needs, and (3) in securing the necessary cooperation of the community.

## THE YALE-IN-CHINA ASSOCIATION RESOLUTION

On December 11, 1966, the Board of Trustees of the Yale-in-China Association passed a resolution, committing itself to an "allegiance" to this University. The resolution reads:—

*Resolved: That this board of Trustees of the Yale-in-China Association record its sense of enthusiasm and gratification that The Chinese University of Hong Kong has come into being; that the Faculties and Governing Bodies of Chung Chi College, New Asia College and United College have agreed to unite in this significant venture in higher education; and that the government of the Colony has adopted the necessary enabling legislation and is committing substantial funds to make the new University a reality;*

*Further Resolved: That this Board, recognizing that its members and the members of the Yale-in-China Association are, for the most part, graduates of Yale University and therefore have abiding interest in the aims, functions and opportunities of a university, unanimously commits itself to a fundamental allegiance to the new Chinese University and encourages constructive and mutually beneficial programs involving both institutions;*

*Further Resolved: That this Board, mindful of the magnificent work of the administration and faculty of New Asia College and of the affectionate ties which bind it to the College, as a new and significant milestone in the Yale-in-China history, reaffirms its interest in New Asia College and its supportive relationship to the College as one of the constituent units of The Chinese University of Hong Kong, particularly to keep alive and fresh the Chinese intellectual tradition through study and scholarship in the area of Chinese history, literature, philosophy, and culture.*

## UNIVERSITY'S DICTIONARY PROJECT

The University has embarked on a project to prepare a Chinese-English Dictionary to be carried out within the next three years, a dictionary that will be a basic reference work for both Western and Chinese students of Chinese and English languages.

The project is in the charge of Dr. Lin Yutang who has been appointed the University's Research Professor and Director of the project. Dr. Lin is too famous to need any introduction as a writer, but many may overlook the fact that he is a philology expert. He studied philology at Harvard and Leipzig in his student days, and was Professor of English Philology in the Peiping National University in the nineteen twenties, and Research Fellow in Philology in the Academia Sinica in the thirties. He is also the inventor of the Chinese index system and has been a collaborator in the official Romanization plan.

With Dr. Lin devoting his full time to the project, the dictionary is expected to be completed and ready for publication by the end of 1970. It will be a one-volume edition for general college use, similar to the Concise Oxford Dictionary in English. Dr. Lin will personally translate Chinese phrases into idiomatic English.

To the budget for the project, Butterfield & Swire (Hong Kong) Ltd., Lee Hysan Estate Co. Ltd., and Sin Poh Amalgamated (H.K.) Ltd. have each generously pledged to donate \$100,000. Butterfield and Swire's contribution is in connection with the celebration of its centenary.

When the dictionary is published, all royalties up to the total cost of the project will be returned to the University for the purposes of developing the activities of the Institute of Chinese Studies, which will be established soon and in which the dictionary project will be among the first research efforts.

## VICE-CHANCELLOR AND PRO-VICE-CHANCELLOR ON TOURS

Dr. C.M. Li, the Vice-Chancellor, flew to the United States on February 12 to attend a meeting convened

on behalf of the White House by Dr. James Perkins, President of Cornell University.

The meeting, which took place at Williamsburg, Virginia, between February 15 and 18, brought together leading educationists from many parts of the world to work out an agenda for the International Conference on Education which will be held later this year.

After the meeting, Dr. Li visited New York, Washington, D.C. and San Francisco on business of the University. He also called at the Headquarters of the Education Overseas Programme of the University of California on the Santa Barbara Campus.

Dr. Li returned to Hong Kong on February 22.

At the invitation of the British Council, Mr. T.C. Cheng, Pro-Vice Chancellor of the University and President of United College, left for the United Kingdom on February 17 to visit institutions of higher education there.

On February 21, Mr. Cheng attended an investiture at Buckingham Palace where he received the insignia of O.B.E. from His grace the Duke of Kent.

Mr. Cheng will spend about a month in Britain. He then will fly to the United States in early April to visit American universities and colleges and meet leaders of the Chinese communities.

While in the United States, he will also confer with the authorities of Williams College, with which United College has a co-operative programme, and later with the authorities of Indiana University and Stanford University for the establishment of a similar programme.

Mr. Cheng is expected to return to Hong Kong in the latter part of April.

## SCHOLARSHIPS FOR STUDENTS OF JOURNALISM

In addition to the scholarships donated to the University's students of Journalism by the Sin Poh Amalgamated (H.K.) Ltd. and by *Wah Kiu Yat Pao*, the South China Morning Post has recently offered four scholarships of \$1,500 each *per annum* to the University's Journalism students. The scholarships will commence in the academic year 1967/68.

The Journalism students take a two-year professional training course at New Asia College. Students of the three Foundation Colleges are eligible for admission after they have completed their second year of undergraduate studies.

There are now eight students in the first year of their professional training and six in their second and final year. Four of them hold scholarships donated by the Sin Poh Amalgamated (H.K.) Ltd. and another four now benefit from the scholarships donated by *Wah Kiu Yat Pao*.



## DONATION OF BOOKS

An amount of US\$3,000 was donated to this University in 1964 by the Japanese Government for the purpose of acquiring Japanese books to be equally distributed among the three Foundation College Libraries. A total of 487 books were bought and delivered to the University in March, 1965.

On February 1, 1967, over two hundred more books, also purchased from the same grant, were presented to the University by Mr. K. Arichi, Japanese Vice-Consul, at the University Library. Dr. Kaiming Chiu, University Librarian, accepted the books on behalf of the University. The three College Librarians were also present at the presentation ceremony.

## UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTRE

A tentative plan for the University Health Centre was presented to the Board of Trustees of the Yale-in-China Association, which has recently agreed in principle to finance the building of the Centre.

The Vice-Chancellor has set up a committee to be chaired by Mr. B.P. Schoyer, Vice-President of New Asia College to do the necessary planning for the University Health Centre. The Centre will be established at the University's new campus site in Shatin. The Committee is to advise on the functions and programmes of the Centre: to recommend, with the advice of the University Architect, items of equipment as well as building plans for the Centre and to propose interim arrangements that may be implemented prior to the establishment of the Centre.

Dr. Bowers, President of Josiah Macy Foundation, and formerly Dean of the Medical Faculty of the University of Wisconsin, will be in Hong Kong at the end of March to discuss with the Vice-Chancellor the programme of the Health Centre.

## PROGRAMME OF JAPANOLOGY

A programme of Japanology is conducted in the University by a distinguished team, as part of an educational project financed by the Japanese Government.

Professor Nobuhiro Matsumoto of Keio University of Japan is in charge of the programme at Chung Chi College. He is assisted by two Lecturers, Mr. Hiroaki Kani from Keio University and Mrs. Michiko Nakahara from Waseda University. Mr. Hiraki Kani was in Hong Kong from 1965 to 1966, when he was an Assistant Fellow at the Institute of Advanced Chinese Studies and Research, New Asia College.

Professor Matsumoto is a Docteur ès-lettres in Oriental History and Ethnology, from Paris University (Sorbonne). He has been with Keio University since 1928. Besides holding his Chair, Professor Matsumoto is also Director of the Keio Institute of Cultural and Linguistic Studies and Chairman of the Division of Human Relations of the University's Graduate School.

## STAFF PROFILES

*Professor Prentiss L. Pemberton, Professor of Sociology, Chung Chi College*

Professor Pemberton studied in Ottawa University, Kansas, and Andover-Newton Theological School, Newton Centre, Massachusetts. Later, he entered Harvard University where he received his M.A. degree in History and Government and Ph.D. in Philosophy and Sociology.

He is at present Professor of the Sociology of Religion, Colgate Rochester Divinity School, Rochester, New York. Prior to that, Professor Pemberton held successively the posts of Associate Professor, Andover-Newton Theological School, and Associate Director, the Danforth Foundation, St. Louis. He has been a Visiting Professor at the University of Southern California and at Boston University. He has also been editor of the *Journal for the Scientific Study of Religion*, President of the American Society of Christian Ethics, and the Society for the Scientific Study of Religion. Professor Pemberton's writings include many articles published in the *Journal of Religion*, *Cross Currents*, *Christian Century*, *Foundations*, and two study books, one on Marriage and Family, and the other on Communism.

Professor Pemberton is now Director of University Studies in Sociology at The Chinese University while on his sabbatical leave from the Colgate Rochester Divinity School.

*Mr. David A. Gilkes, Assistant Registrar*

Mr. David A. Gilkes was born in 1935 in Oxford, England. He was educated at Shrewsbury School and after two years' National Service which took him to Egypt and Cyprus, he returned to England and attended Christ Church College, Oxford, obtaining his B.A. degree in History in 1959.

After his University career, Mr. Gilkes worked with a firm of Accountants in London and qualified as a Chartered Accountant in 1962.

Mr. Gilkes has served the University as Assistant Registrar (Finance) since early January this year, when he arrived from England with his family.

*Mrs. Amy Mok, Administrative Assistant*

Born in Kweilin, Kwangsi in 1943, Mrs. Mok received her early education through high school from St. Mary's Canossian College in Hong Kong. On her graduation from St. Mary's in 1961, she entered Chung Chi College to study Sociology, and was awarded the B.S. Sc. degree by this University in 1965. She then joined the Hong Kong Housing Society as a Housing Assistant in July 1965, assigned to the Kwun Tong Estate Office.



Mrs. Mok was appointed Administrative Assistant of the University in January this year, being the first Chinese University graduate to serve the University in its administrative staff. Assigned to the Public Relations Section of the Registry, she helps with publications, receptions, press release, public relations, and general information.

## COMINGS AND GOINGS

△ Dr. David M. Maynard, newly appointed part-time Lecturer in History, Chung Chi College, arrived in Hong Kong on January 30, 1967.

△ Professor Bruce Pattison, Professor of Education in the Institute of Education of London University, flew home on January 31 after his two weeks' stay in the Colony during which he served as an advisor to the University. The opinions Professor Pattison expressed during the series of consultative meetings with the language teachers of the Colleges, as well as his lecture on "English Today", are highly esteemed.

△ Dr. Samuel Chan, Lecturer in Biology, Chung Ching College, returned from a two-week stay in Singapore where he served as an external examiner at Nanyang University.

△ At the invitation of the Vice-Chancellor, Dr. Charles H. Peake, Vice-Chancellor for the Academic Discipline of the University of Pittsburgh and Mrs. Peake, arrived in Hong Kong on February 21, to discuss inter-university co-operation. Coming at the same time were Dr. Burkart Holzner, Professor and Chairman, Sociology Department, and Professor C.K. visited New Asia College on February 3, with Mrs. DeBary. Professor DeBary delivered a lecture on "The Cultural Revolution in Communist China and the Cultural Revival in Taiwan", at the invitation of the Research Institute of the College.

△ Dr. S.T. Tsou, Senior Lecturer in Mathematics and Dean of the Faculty of Science at United College, left on January 29 for the United States and United Kingdom to visit the institutes of higher education there. The main purpose of his trip is to attend two Mathematics Conferences in the United Kingdom, namely, the Mathematics Symposium in Durham from March 20 to 23, 1967, and the 19th British Mathematical Colloquium in Swansea from April 5 to April 7, 1967.

△ Dr. Sutu Hsin, Dean of the Faculty of Commerce and Social Science, United College, returned to Hong Kong on February 19 after a leave which began in September last year, during which he visited Germany, Holland, England as well as the United States.

△ Professor Thomas W. Harrell, Professor of Applied Psychology of Stanford University, arrived in Hong Kong on February 9, and visited the three Foundation Colleges.

△ During the first week in February, Dr. Stanley Rypins, retired professor from Brooklyn College, Brooklyn, New York, who had been on a lecture tour in India at the invitation of the Indian Government, visited Chung Chi College.

△ On January 27, Dr. Carl F. Vikner, Chairman of the Department of Education, Gustavus Adolphus College, St. Peter, Minnesota, visited Chung Chi College, and will remain in the Colony for several months conducting educational research. Dr. Robert Carr, President of Oberlin College, Oberlin, Ohio, also paid a visit to the College on the same day.

## COLLEGE NEWS

△ On February 24 and 25, the new Science Laboratories of United College were open to science teachers and senior pupils of the local secondary schools. Over 2,200 people attended.

The occasion was arranged by the Science Faculty of the College, which has Chemistry, Mathematics, and Physics Departments. The Department of Physics has four laboratories (General Physical, Advanced Physical, Optical, and Electronic) and one Mechanical Workshop. The Department of Chemistry has five laboratories (General Chemical, Organic Chemical, Physical Chemical, Research, and Instrumental Room) and one glass blowing workshop.

During the two days, the visitors were shown the College's laboratory equipment and teaching models.

Practical demonstrations in Mechanics, Sound, Electromagnetism, Optics, Atomic Physics, Analytical Chemistry, Physical Chemistry, Organic Chemistry, Mathematics, etc., were witnessed by visiting students, who were thus enabled to have a better understanding of the science subjects taught in the University. Faculty members of the College were on hand to answer questions raised by the visitors.

△ Thirty-one outstanding students of United College were awarded *College Tenth Anniversary Prizes* in a ceremony held on February 3, in the College.

The prizes, donated by various organizations and individuals interested in the promotion of local higher education, were presented to the winners by Mr. Wilson T.S. Wong, J.P., Vice-Chairman of the College Board of Trustees and Chairman of the Tenth Anniversary Celebrations Committee.

Shields were also presented to members of the College Basketball Team, who recently won the championship of the 1966/67 Basketball Tournament sponsored by the Post-Secondary College Athletic Association.

△ Four Chung Chi students have recently been awarded the C.K. Tse Shields for their excellent services rendered to the student organizations. The Shields were named in memory of the late College Registrar, Mr. C.K. Tse.

△ On February 21, the New Asia College's Institute of Advanced Chinese Studies and Research gave a tea party to welcome Mr. Hsu Fu-kuang who had recently arrived to teach Philosophy in the College on a visiting basis for a period of six months. On the same day, the Institute conducted a meeting at which a Research Student, Luk Yuen-yee, read a paper on "Influence of the Three Traditional Schools in Cheng Chien's Modified Version of Mao Heng's Annotation of the Book of Odes".

△ A public lecture on "The Cultural Revolution in Mainland China" was given on February 24 in the Chung Chi College Chapel by Mr. Hsu Kwan-san, Editor of the *Ming Pao Monthly*, under the sponsorship of the Current Affairs Committee of the Student Union of the College.

The lecture was well attended by interested students and College staff.

△ In response to the Chinese New Year Charity drives sponsored by the *Wah Kiu Yat Po* and the Standard-Sing Tao Group, the Staff Association and the Student Union of United College jointly launched a campaign for donations, as a result of which a sum of \$1,152.05 was donated to *Wah Kiu Yat Po* and a sum of \$1,000.00 was donated to the Standard-Sing Tao Group.

△ Instruction in the use of Chinese musical

instruments commenced in Chung Chi College on February 3. Eighteen students are learning to play the *ch'eng*, *fiddles*, and wind instruments.

△ "The Coat", a play in Cantonese presented by United College Student Union, won the second prize at the Second Drama Festival sponsored by the Hong Kong Federation of Students held on February 19, 1967.

Mr. Fung Luk-tak, a 2nd year Arts student of the College, received the Best Actor Award for his performance in the play.

△ The Chung Chi relay teams won both the men's and women's titles in the invitation relays of the Annual Athletic Meet of the University of Hong Kong held on February 4.

△ A Quadruple Athletic Meet sponsored by the University of Hong Kong was held on February 26 at the Hong Kong University athletic field. Chung Chi

College, with 240 points, came out first; the University of Hong Kong, with 186 points, was second and United College and New Asia College were respectively third and forth.

△ February has been a very busy month for the students of New Asia College. Apart from the usual Student Union meetings, Departmental Club activities, music appreciation sessions, film shows, religious group activities, etc., the Student Union held a Chinese New Year Dance Party on February 11, which was attended by about 300 students. ## 雅禮協會決議案

議決：

「雅禮協會董事會，鑒於香港中文大學經告成立；崇基學院、新亞書院及聯合書院各校教職員暨校董等，共同聯合以完成大學教育之重大使命；香港政府

亦採取必要步驟，完成立法手續，並資助鉅額使新大學之設立終得實現，本會對其，備感興奮而快慰。」

又議決：

「本董事會認為，本會暨雅禮協會會員，多數為耶魯大學畢業生，故對於一大學設辦之目的、任務與各項機緣，均深感興趣，茲一致表示對此新創立之中文大學，予以原則性之支持，凡該大學與本會間所有建設性而互惠之計劃，當予以提倡。」

再議決：

「本會對新亞書院之行政教務等重要工作，以及本會與該書院之友誼，時時在念。茲為雅禮協會與新亞關係史上更添一段新紀錄起見，特重申本會對該學院之興趣，贊助其為香港中文大學之一成員學院，對於研究中國歷史、文學、哲學及文化等科尤望其能藉獎學金之支助，從事研究，使中國固有文化知識，得以繼續發揚光大。」

## 大學編纂漢英字典計劃

本大學編纂漢英字典之計劃業經着手進行，期於三年內完成。該字典將為研究中英文之人士主要參考之用。

本校已聘林語堂博士為研究教授兼主任，主持該計劃。林博士為蜚聲國際作家，毋待紹介，惟一般人似尚不悉其亦為語言學專家。渠於早年，曾在美國哈佛及德國萊比錫各大學專攻語言學，一九二〇至三〇年間，任國立北京大學英國語言學教授，一九三〇至四〇年間，復應聘為中央研究院語言學研究員。林氏曾發明中文檢字法，對於國語羅馬字拼音法之設計，亦嘗參與其事。

林博士今後三年內將以全部時間，致力於此編纂計劃，冀該字典當於一九七〇年付印，成書一卷，可供普通大學參考之用，與英文牛津簡明字典相類似，其中文成語，將由林博士親自翻譯為通用之英文。

此項計劃所需之經費，業由香港太古公司，利希慎置業有限公司及星系報業有限公司各慨捐港幣十萬元。太古公司此項捐款，係慶祝該公司成立一百週年紀念節目之一項。

該字典出版後之版權收入，將由本校撥充發展即將設立之中國文化研究所之用，直至全部編纂所需之經費清償為止。該字典之編纂，即為該研究所初期研究計劃之一。

## 校外考試委員

大學學位考試，定於一九六七至六八年度開始，分兩部份舉行。凡讀完三年級課程之學生，必須參加第一部考試，讀完四年級者，須參加第二部考試。故今年三年級學生須參加第一部學位考試，四年級學生則仍照去年參加學位文憑考試。

## 大學學位考試

一九六七年後，本大學將不再舉辦文憑考試。兩部份考試及格總卷數不得少於七卷。凡參加第一部學位考試者，須依照各有關系務會之規定，應考三卷至五卷。第一部考試時，各試卷必須全部及格，始准升入四年級。第二部考試時，亦須依照規定，考足其餘各試卷。

凡學生於第一部考試不及格時，得准其重讀一年，於次年再行參加第一部考試。

第一、二部考試均及格者，大學即授以學士學位。
