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Laying of Foundation Stone of the University Library

"Here we shall have a fine University library, ready to serve as a centre dedicated to the promotion of the inter-flow of Chinese and Western cultures, and also to assist the members of The Chinese University in their researches."

"Having the University Library, the well-functioning heart of a university, The Chinese University, I believe, will develop with more assurance and strength in the near future."

The foundation stone of the University Library was laid by His Excellency the Governor of Hong Kong and Chancellor of the University, Sir David Trench, on 28th September, 1970. The ceremony was attended by members of the University Council and the College Boards of Governors/Trustees, members of the Executive Council and the Legisla-

tive Council, prominent leaders of the community, and members of the staff and student representatives of the University.

Sir David was greeted by Dr. Choh-Ming Li, Vice-Chancellor of the University, upon his arrival at the University campus by helicopter. He was escorted to the dais by the Vice-Chancellor; Dr. the Hon. Sir Cho-Yiu Kwan, Chairman of the University Council; Dr. R.C. Lee, Vice-Chairman of the University Council and Chairman of the Campus Planning and Building Committee; Dr. the Hon. Ping-Yuan Tang, Member of the University Council and Donor of the University Library building; and the Hon. W. Szeto, the Architect.

In a brief address, delivered in both Chinese and English, the Vice-Chancellor made known the name of the donor of the building, Dr. the Hon. Ping-Yuan Tang, who "has evidenced a community spirit by giving his most magnanimous support" to the University.

His Excellency Sir David Trench then proceeded to lay the foundation stone of the University Library and addressed the guests, pointing out the immense value of the University's library complex and thanking Dr. Tang for his generosity. The Chinese version of Sir David's speech was read by Prof. Shou-Sheng Hsueh, Professor of Government and Public Administration of the University.

A reception was held at the Benjamin Franklin Centre after the ceremony.

The University Library will have five storeys, with a total floor area of 86,000 sq. ft. Construction is scheduled for completion in August 1971.

Dr. the Hon. Ping-Yuan Tang, a Member of the University Council and an Unofficial Member of the Executive Council, has donated HK\$3,000,000 towards the construction cost of the Library in memory of his late father, Mr. Tang Pao-Che, a prominent businessman who contributed enormously towards the industrialization of China at the beginning of the 20th century. The Library is to serve as a centre dedicated to the promotion of the inter-flow of Chinese and Western cultures.

"An event of great significance and felicity" — Dr. Choh-Ming Li's Remarks—

The heart of a university is its library: it continuously pumps the latest knowledge to the faculty and the students. No university can do justice to the development of its academic and research programmes without the services of an efficient library that meets the demand of its students and academic staff.

Six years ago, when I was installed as Vice-Chancellor of this University, I recall mentioning in my speech that besides the assistance we received from the British Government and the American people, a leading member of the local Chinese community had come forward with a pledge of three million Hong Kong dollars for the building of the University Library. This generous support, I said, gave me the courage to proceed and to work with my colleagues towards building up a good university, besides providing me with confidence that difficulties could be overcome and challenges met. Today, I have the honour and the pleasure to make known to you the name of the donor, Dr. the Hon. Ping-Yuan Tang. Six years ago, Dr. Tang requested this University not to disclose his name because his donation was merely an indication of his concern for the future of The Chinese University, not a means to claim personal recognition. The ceremony of laying the foundation stone of the University Library is to us an event of great significance and felicity. I have, therefore, taken this opportunity to invite you to come here and share with us the joy this ceremony brings.

However, Dr. Tang's contribution to this University is not limited to his donation of three million dollars. He is a member of the University Council and the Chairman of the Board of Governors of New Asia College, one of the three Foundation Colleges of the University. His intimate association with this University has helped us tremendously in its development. I do not have to remind you of Dr. Tang's contributions in the fields of trade and industry, culture, education and social welfare activities, for all of us are already well aware of his philanthropy, success and achievement. I would like to take this opportunity to make the fact clear to you so that we can all be proud of having among us a citizen so concerned with the well-being of the community of Hong Kong.

Seven years have passed since the inauguration of the University and the University is now gradually attaining its full status. Thanks must be given to the enthusiastic support from the people and the Government of Hong Kong as well as to various educational institutions overseas. Having the University Library, the well-functioning heart of a university, The Chinese University, I believe, will develop with more assurance and strength in the near future. I am certain that the University Library will help us immensely in developing our research institutes and the Graduate School and in reaching academic excellence. At present, the University Library has a collection of 100,000 volumes. The new Library will eventually hold a multi-million volume collection, adequate to meet the needs of the expanding University and the community as a whole. When seeing the benefit the University Library shall bring to us in the near future, we should be grateful indeed for the generosity of our community leaders, among whom Dr. Tang has evidenced a community spirit by giving his most magnanimous support.

We are most honoured today to have His Excellency the Governor and Chancellor of this University, leader of the community of Hong Kong, Sir David Trench, with us to officiate at the ceremony. I have no doubt Sir David will be very happy to lay the foundation stone of the University Library for us.

"More than just a repository for books"

— Address by Sir David Trench—

We are here today to witness the beginning of yet another significant stage in the development of The Chinese University of Hong Kong. As the three constituent colleges move out here and establish themselves in their separate ways, so the common buildings of the University itself are gradually taking shape and providing a focal point for both the students and for the staff and graduates, and acting as a unifying force for the University as a whole.

This University Library has been planned to be more than just a repository for books, although, of course that will be one of its main functions—it will hold some 400,000 volumes. In the five-storey, 86,000 sq. ft. building, which will be completed in about a year's time, there will also be a photographic laboratory, a group study and audio-visual room, a periodical reading room, conference and seminar rooms and so on. It seems certain that, together with the separate College libraries whose works it will complement, this complex will be of immense value to all who will use it.

A building of this kind is not, of course, an inexpensive project and its cost will be in the region of \$7,350,000. We are most fortunate that nearly half this sum has been donated by Dr. the Honourable Tang Ping-Yuan, a member of the Council of this University, in memory of his late father. I should like to take this opportunity of thanking Mr. Tang for his generosity—which is in line with what we in Hong Kong have come to expect from one who always demonstrates a keen interest in educational matters and who is at present so bound up with our plans for technical education.

So here we shall have a fine University library, ready to serve as a centre dedicated to the promotion of the inter-flow of Chinese and Western cultures, and also to assist the members of The Chinese University in their researches. I am very pleased indeed to have been able to accept the Vice-Chancellor's invitation to lay its foundation stone and I express my good wishes to all who will make use of its facilities.

New President of New Asia College — Dr. Y.P. Mei

Dr. Y.P. Mei assumed duty as President of New Asia College on 1st September, 1970, succeeding Dr. Y.T. Shen upon the expiration of his tenure of presidency.

A Ceremony of Transfer between the former President and the new President was held at the College on 1st September. It was presided over by Mr. Tsufa F. Lee, Vice-Chairman of the College Board of Governors, and attended by members of the College Council and Academic Board as well as senior administrative staff. A party in honour of the new President and Dr. Y.T. Shen, hosted by the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman of the Board of Governors and attended by all members of the staff and student representatives, was held after the ceremony. At the party Dr. Y.T. Shen was presented souvenirs by the staff and students.

Dr. Mei holds a B.A. degree and an LL.D. degree from Oberlin College, a Ph.D. degree from the University of Chicago, and an L.H.D. degree from Wabash College. The founder of the Center for Far Eastern Studies of the University of Iowa, Dr. Mei served as the Chairman of Chinese and Oriental Studies of the University of Iowa before taking up the presidency of New Asia College. He was once the Acting President of Yenching University in China and served as a professor at a number of American universities. Dr. Mei has many publications on Chinese philosophy and literature and has contributed numerous articles to a number of academic journals.

LIBA News

By strengthening the whole programme of the Institute and broadening the base of student enrolment, the Lingnan Institute of Business Administration of the University has attracted 76 applications for admission this year, an increase of approximately 70% over last year's figure. The number of new students has increased from 12 in 1969 to 21 in 1970, bringing a total of 33 students to the Institute. This year, students admitted to the Institute have various academic backgrounds, including not only graduates in economics or commerce but also those in natural sciences and engineering. It is believed that the optimum mixture of students' academic backgrounds and experience will provide opportunity for interchange of ideas and will consequently increase LIBA's contribution to the local community.

With the increase in student enrolment, the Institute has been endeavouring to recruit permanent staff members to teach on a minimum two-year basis in order to provide continuity in its programme of studies. At present the following faculty members are teaching the students of LIBA.

In the present academic year, curricula have been designed to enable students with various backgrounds to make up their basic courses and to complete their studies leading to the degree of Master of Business Administration in a minimum of two years. Some of the first-year students are required to attend basic courses conducted at the Foundation Colleges. In an attempt to pool the available manpower of the three Colleges and the Institute, third- and fourth-year students of the Foundation Colleges are also permitted to attend some of the courses offered by the Institute.

Eight students of the Institute were placed to work in summer assignments for a period of eight to eleven weeks to provide them with opportunities to gain practical experience and to enable them to have an insight into local business problems and operations. Besides serving as financial aid to students, the summer employment advances their actual knowledge of management. Students have to submit a report after they have completed their summer work.

The public has demonstrated its interest in the work of the Institute by rendering assistance in various ways including generous financial support from local and international organizations and individuals. During the academic year 1970/71, 8 students have been awarded scholarships donated by a number of industrial, trade and other organizations, and 16 have received bursaries each amounting to HK\$3,000 or HK\$3,800.

Professors' Profiles

Prof. An-Min Chung, Visiting Professor, Linguan Institute of Business Administration

Dr. An-Min Chung came to the Lingnan Institute of Business Administration in September 1970 and conducts courses in Operations Research and Management Decision Analysis.

Prof. Chung is a 1943 graduate of the wartime National Southwest Associated University in Kunming, China, where he majored in Electrical Engineering. After the Second World War he attended the Wharton School of Finance and Commerce, University of Pennsylvania, in Philadelphia, and received his M.B.A. in Industrial Management in 1949. He earned his doctorate in Economic Theory at the same institution in 1953 after completing the dissertation entitled, "The Development of the Modern Manufacturing Industry in China, 1929-1949".

Dr. Chung has taught at Drexel University, Carnegie Institute of Technology (now the Carnegie-Mellon University), and Haverford College, Haverford, Pa. He is the author of a book entitled *Linear Programming*, and has lectured extensively on that subject to groups of executives, industrial and government staff, and professional engineers. He is currently engaged in applying operations research techniques to the study of air pollution control problems.

Prof. Chung is a member of many professional societies, including the American Economic Association and the Institute of Management Sciences, and was elected in 1958 a member of the National Honor

Society of Phi Kappa Phi. He is also an active member of many Chinese organizations in the United States.

Although this is his first trip to the Far East in about a quarter of a century, and his first revisit to Hong Kong since 1939, Prof. Chung will be at LIBA for one semester only, and will be returning to Philadelphia in December to resume duties at Drexel University, where he holds the post of Chairman, Department of Management and Operations Research in the College of Business Administration.

Prof. John Hohenberg, Visiting Professor of Journalism and Director of Mass Communications Centre

Prof. John Hohenberg, who obtained a B.Litt. from Columbia School of Journalism in 1927 and then spent a year in Europe as Pulitzer Traveling Scholar, has been Professor of Journalism at Columbia University since 1950, and Administrator of the Pulitzer Prizes and Secretary of the Advisory Board on the Pulitzer Prizes since 1954.

Prof. Hohenberg has also been Consultant to the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace; American Specialist for the State Department, traveling in seven countries in Asia; Research Fellow, Council on Foreign Relations, studying in ten countries in Asia; and Senior Specialist, East-West Center, Honolulu. In 1968 Columbia University granted Prof. Hohenberg free press study in Britain, Europe and Czechoslovakia, and in 1969 a visit to the Soviet Union for a study of the press system there.

Prof. Hohenberg's many publications include: Foreign Correspondence: The Great Reporters and Their Times, and Between Two Worlds: Policy, Press and Public Opinion in Asian-American Relations—both of which have won him the Sigma Delta Chi prize for distinguished service in journalism research. He holds a medal from the Columbia Journalism Half-Century Awards of 1963, and is also the winner of a Columbia Journalism Alumni Medal of 1965.

Prof. Hohenberg is a member of Columbia Journalism Alumni, of which he served as President in 1954, and a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, Sigma Delta Chi.

Prof. Hohenberg is here as Visiting Professor of Journalism and Director of the Mass Communications Centre for the first term of the academic year 1970-71.

Prof. Jiri Nehnevajsa, Professor of Sociology and Director of Social Research Centre

Prof. Jiri Nehnevajsa obtained his Ph.D. from the University of Zurich in 1953 and undertook postdoctoral training as Social Science Research Council Fellow at the University of Washington and Harvard University in 1953-54.

In 1952-56 Prof. Nehnevajsa was Assistant Professor of Sociology at the University of Colorado; in 1956 he became Assistant Professor of Sociology at Columbia University; and since 1961 he has been Professor of Sociology at the University of Pittsburgh, and since 1964, also Professor of Social and Economic Development, Graduate School of Public and International Affairs. In 1967-68 Prof. Nehnevajsa was Visiting (Fulbright) Professor of Sociology at the University of Heidelberg and Visiting Professor of Sociology at the University of Mannheim.

Prof. Nehnevajsa is a Fellow of the American Sociological Association, and a member of the American Association for Public Opinion Research, the New York Academy of Sciences and the Czechoslovak Academy of Arts and Sciences in the United States. He has been a consultant to over twenty organizations, including the Office of Comprehensive Planning of the State of New York, American Institutes for Research, the Social Affairs Department of the Pan-American Union.

Prof. Nehnevajsa has contributed professional articles to numerous publications in English and German, and is the author of *Elements of a Theory of Internal War* and co-author of a number of books. His major research programmes include "Project Outcomes", studies of perspectives on changes in the international order among influentials in a number of countries; studies of the impact of civil defence programmes on society; and "Project Futures", studies of Columbia's social, economic and political change.

Prof. Irving B. Tebor, Professor of Social Work

Prof. Irving B. Tebor took his B.A. from Northern Illinois University in 1949, his M.A. in Social Service Administration from the University of Chicago in 1951, and his Ph.D. from Oregon State University in 1957.

Prof. Tebor worked as Psychiatric Social Worker, School Social Worker and Child Welfare Caseworker before he was appointed Professor of Social Work at the School of Social Work, San Diego State College, in 1957. From June 1962 to September 1963 he was on leave from that College to serve as Social Work Training Adviser to the Government of Indonesia with the United Nations Technical Assistance Operations. In 1966 he was appointed Associate Dean, School of Social Work, San Diego State College, and he acted as Dean from February 1969 to August 1970. Since then he has been on leave from the College to take up the position of Professor of Social Work at this University.

Among Prof. Tebor's publications are: Abstracts for Social Workers, "Background for Planning for Social Welfare in San Diego County", "A Pilot Project in California: Mental Health Summer Work-Study Program", and "Male Virgins: Conflicts and Group Support in American Culture". He has conducted many social work projects in various parts of the United States.

Prof. Tebor is a member of the Academy of Certified Social Workers, the American Civil Liberties Union, the Council on Social Work Education, the National Association of Social Workers, and the National Council on Family Relations. He was elected to the House of Delegates in 1969.

Prof. Benjamin E. Wallacker, Associate Director of the University of California Study Centre

Prof. Benjamin E. Wallacker, born in San Francisco, was educated in suburban schools and entered the U.S. Army upon graduation from high school in early 1945. After completing eighteen months' service he entered the University of California at Berkeley, graduating with an A.B. in Anthropology in the summer of 1950. He did a year's further study in Anthropology at the University of Hawaii and then returned to Berkeley in Oriental Languages, receiving an M.A. in 1954 and a Ph.D. in 1960. He served for five years on the faculty of the University of Kansas, and in 1964 he joined the University of California at Davis.

Prof. Wallacker's research interests have centered on Taoist philosophy of the Han period; Chinese siegecraft in mid-sixth century; and the Han Emperor Wu-ti, on whom he is currently writing a book-length biography.

Prof. Wallacker assumed duty as Associate Director of the University of California Study Centre in August 1970.

Prof. Harry Wang, Professor of Biology

Prof. Harry Wang graduated from the University of Shanghai with a B.S. in 1930 and obtained his M.S. from the University the following year. He served as Instructor at his alma mater for two years and was then appointed Assistant Professor of Hangchow College. In 1936 he returned to the University of Shanghai as Assistant Professor.

In 1938 Prof. Wang went to the United States and became Research Assistant at the University of Chicago, at which he received his Ph.D. in Zoology in 1943. After two years of research at the University of Chicago and four years of teaching at Berea College, University of Wisconsin and University of Chicago College, Prof. Wang was appointed Chief, Division of Histology, American Meat Institute Foundation, University of Chicago, which post he held until 1957. He then joined the Loyola University Medical School, Chicago, as Associate Professor of Anatomy, and became Professor in 1959. In the spring of 1961, under the sponsorship of the State Department of the United States, Prof. Wang was Visiting Professor at National Taiwan University.

Prof. Wang is the author of An Outline of Human Embryology and over 70 journal articles.

Prof. Wang is a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, and a member of Sigma Xi, the American Society of Zoologists, the Society for Experimental Biology and Medicine, the American Society of Animal Production, the American Association of University Professors, and the American Association of Anatomists.

Prof. Noboru Yamamoto, Visiting Professor of Japanology

Prof. Noboru Yamamoto graduated from the Faculty of Economics, Keio University, in 1935 and was immediately appointed an assistant in the Faculty. He was promoted Assistant Professor in 1941 and nominated Professor of Economics in 1948. Prof. Yamamoto studied at the Institute for World Economy, University of Kiel, West Germany, from 1952 to 1954. In 1960 he obtained the degree of Doctor of Economics from Keio University. From 1965 to 1969 Prof. Yamamoto was Academic Vice-President of that University.

Prof. Yamamoto's fields of specialization are international political economy and Southeast Asian

economy. His publications include: Modern Japanese Economy, Asian Economic Structure and the Problem of Regional Co-operation, International Political Economy, International Business, and a translation of Prof. Kindleberger's National Economy and Foreign Trade.

Prof. Yamamoto is Director of Keio International Center, Representative of the Asian Political and Economic Association of Japan, and standing Director of the Association of International Economics of Japan.

Student Enrolment

The total enrolment of the University as at 30th September, 1970 is 2,496.

Of these 2,260 are undergraduates, 677 in the Faculty of Arts, 926 in the Faculty of Commerce and Social Science, and 657 in the Faculty of Science. 851 of these students are enrolled at Chung Chi College, 747 at New Asia College and 662 at United College. There are altogether 1,318 male undergraduates and 942 female undergraduates.

The Graduate School has at present 82 students and the School of Education 105 students, 17 full-time and 88 part-time, while the New Asia Institute of Advanced Chinese Studies and Research has 17 trainees.

In addition, the University has 24 exchange students and 8 associate students.
