

### Vice-Chancellor's Opening Remarks

This means that our panelists and guests have to come all the way to the New Territories. But, in spite of the distance, 60 of Hong Kong's prominent leaders representing a cross-section of the community's professions and businesses have kindly consented to come to talk to our students.

This wonderful opportunity for our students to meet community leaders has been made possible by a generous contribution from Rotary Club of Hong Kong Island West to this Workshop. The spirit of community service in Rotary, particularly in youth activities, is well known, and we are deeply indebted to all the Rotarians of the Club. I now have great pleasure to call upon the Club President, Mr. C.M. Wong, to address us.

### Abbreviated Translation of the Speech of Mr. C.M. Wong, President, Rotary Club of Hong Kong Island West

Both my fellow Rotarians and I are very pleased to attend this Opening Ceremony of the 4th Pre-Employment Workshop, and it is a great honour for me to be given a chance to speak to you. It has always been the aim of our Club to serve the local community. However, this is the first time that we are sponsoring this kind of workshop, and we deem it a very meaningful investment in the future of Hong Kong to encourage young students to serve the community.

Hong Kong is growing more prosperous every day and the various trades and professions are in urgent need of more qualified personnel to meet their rapid expansion. As all of the students here are young, energetic and well-educated, you will surely become the new blood of the society. Nonetheless, there must be some among you who still have some doubts about which profession you should join, which profession suits you best and the chances of employment to-day. The panelists here are ready to share their own experience with you and guide you in the search of a career. So, use what you gain these two days to prepare for your future.

As all of you will leave the University soon, I would like to suggest for your reference the objectives of our Club: (1) The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service; (2) High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying by each Rotarian of his occupation as an opportunity to serve society; (3) The application of the ideal of service by every Rotarian to his personal, business and community life; and (4) The advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional men united in the ideal of service.

Finally, may I wish all of you every success in the future.

### LIN YUTANG'S CHINESE-ENGLISH DICTIONARY OF MODERN USAGE NEAR COMPLETION

The publication process of Lin Yutang's Chinese-English Dictionary of Modern Usage is now reaching its final stages. The Office of the Dictionary Project has been engaged in copy-editing and proofreading and has added an English Index and a Glossary of Simplified Chinese Characters. As a result, the text alone has been augmented to 1,450 pages and the Preliminaries, Indices and Appendices 350 pages. In comparison with the original estimate, the Dictionary is now enriched by 500 additional pages. It will be cloth-bound in a handy volume and Bible paper will be used. The number of lead characters exceeds 8,000 and compounds and phrases 100,000.

Discussions with well-known publishers for worldwide distribution were initiated early in the year. Finally in April, a general agreement was confirmed between the University and McGraw-Hill International Book Co., by which the latter was appointed the world distributor of the epoch-making Dictionary. It is now known that it will bear McGraw-Hill Code Number: 99695 and the Library of Congress Card Number: 72-3899. Judging from the current timetable, the final proofreading will be extended to August and the actual publishing date may be delayed until October 1972. An indicated list price will be HK\$200 per copy.

### SINO-BRITISH FELLOWSHIP TRUST'S CONTRIBUTION TO STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The Sino-British Fellowship Trust, established in 1947 with the conviction of the sharing of interests between individuals of different nations and religions, offers scholarships to men and women of Chinese descent of acknowledged ability and experience in academic or professional life. The scholarships, which include travel expenses to and from Britain, maintenance, pocket money and fees, cover the following fields of studies: medicine, surgery, obstetrics and gynaecology, nursing, midwifery, other ancillary medical subjects, scientific subjects, social welfare and education.

The Trust has been offering scholarships to the Hong Kong community since 1952 and this University since its early years. Staff members of the University have greatly benefited by the awards in pursuing their advanced studies in England. A 1955 scholar of the Trust, Dr. Ma Lin, joined the University in 1965 and is currently Senior Lecturer in Biochemistry and Head of the Department at United College. To date, five members of the staff have been awarded the scholarships: Dr. Tam Shang-wai, Senior Lecturer in Chemistry, Chung Chi College; Dr. Bau Yun-shen, Lecturer in Biology, New Asia College; Dr. Chuang Lien-sheng, Lecturer in Physics, Chung Chi College; Mr. Lam Choi-nang, Associate Lecturer in Chemistry, United College; and Miss Louise S.W. Ho, Assistant Lecturer in English Language and Literature, New Asia College. Mr. Lam has been awarded a scholarship for the second year in order to continue his course in Synthetic Organic Chemistry at Southampton University in the academic year 1972-73.

Members of the staff who have served on the Trust's Overseas Advisory Committees include Mr. H.T. Wu, former University Registrar; Mr. S.T. Cheung, Senior Assistant Registrar; and Mr. Nelson H. Young, University Registrar.

By awarding scholarships to the University's staff, the Sino-British Fellowship Trust has made a very substantial contribution to the University's Staff Development Programme, which aims at improving the quality of the staff by further research, refresher courses and advanced studies. The Staff Development Programme is essential in developing the potentials of the academic staff and their ability to cope with the exacting task of building up a new institution of higher learning like The Chinese University. It is hoped that the Trust will continue to render its valuable support to the University.

### STAFF PROFILES

Dr. Lam Yat-wah, Lecturer in Electronics, United College

Dr. Lam Yat-wah was educated at St. Joseph's College, Hong Kong. He received part of his training in electronics at the Hong Kong Technical College. He joined Cable and Wireless Ltd. in 1953 and worked in the radiophone division for six months before taking up the appointment at the Engineering Department of Radio Hong Kong. In 1955 he emigrated to England and joined E.M.I. Records Ltd. as a junior engineer. Meanwhile he continued his studies in the evenings at the Polytechnic, London, and obtained the Graduateship of the Institution of Electronic and Radio Engineers (IERE) in 1957. In the same year he was promoted to the grade of development engineer.

Dr. Lam also attended an evening course in Physics at Birkbeck College, University of London, and was awarded a B.Sc. in Physics in 1962. In 1963 he was appointed a research fellow at the Electrical Engineering Department of the University of Birmingham and in 1965 obtained his M.Sc. degree from the University. He was made a lecturer the same year. While at Birmingham, he also did research on the microwave magnetic properties of single-crystal YIG and on semiconductor devices, and published several papers on these topics. He left Birmingham in 1969

to become the Mullard Research Fellow at the University of Manchester Institute of Science and Technology. He was awarded a Ph.D. in June 1971 by the University of Manchester.

Dr. Lam joined this University in April 1971.

Miss Louise Shew-wan Ho, Assistant Lecturer in English Language and Literature, New Asia College

Miss Louise Shew-wan Ho read English Literature at the University of Hong Kong and graduated with an honours degree in 1965. From 1965 to 1968 she served as tutor in the Department of English and Western Languages and Literature at Chung Chi College. She was awarded a scholarship by the Sino-British Trust in 1968 to study English and American Poetry 1900-1942 at the University of East Anglia at Norwich and received her M.A. degree in 1969. Then she proceeded to work on the poetry of Wallace Stevens at the University of Warwick at Coventry, having received a further two-year scholarship from the Sino-British Trust. She is currently attached to the University of Warwick as research student.

Miss Ho joined New Asia College upon her return to Hong Kong last January.


