Four Made Emeritus Professors



On the recommendation of the Senate and in accordance with Statute 21 of the University Ordinance, the University Council has approved the award of the title of emeritus professor to four retired professors — Prof. S.T. Chang, Prof. S.W. Tam, Prof. Baysung Hsu, and Prof. T.B. Lin, with effect from 29th November 1995.

Prof. S.T. Chang has been awarded the title of Emeritus Professor of Biology. He joined the University in 1960 and was promoted to professor rank in 1978. He was chair of the Department of Biology from 1983 to 1994 and dean of science from 1975 to 1977. He also held various concurrent posts such as chair of the Science Engineering Complex Management Committee and director of the Institute of Science and Technology at different times. Prof. Chang retired on 30th September 1995.

Prof. S.W. Tam has been awarded the title of Emeritus Professor of Chemistry in recognition of his distinguished services to the University as pro-vice-chancellor (1990-94), as professor of chemistry since 1982, as dean of the Graduate School (1981-93), as head of Chung Chi College for two terms, and as acting director of the School of Con-

tinuing Studies (1994-95). Prof. Tam joined the University in 1965 and retired on 31st August 1995.

Prof. Baysung Hsu has been awarded the title of Emeritus Professor of Physics. He joined the University as professor of physics in 1964, and was dean of science for two terms from 1969 to 1971 and from 1977 to 1979. He then served as pro-vice-chancellor for 15 years until his retirement on 30th September 1994.

Prof. T.B. Lin has been awarded the title of Emeritus Professor of Economics. Prof. Lin joined the University in 1966 and was promoted to professor of economics in 1983. He was chair of the Department of Economics from 1975 to 1991, dean of social science from 1977 to 1980, and head of New Asia College from 1985 to 1992. He retired on 31st May 1995.

Wei Lun Professor Examines Cost of Capital

Prof. René M. Stulz, Ralph Kurtz Chair in Finance from Ohio State University and Wei Lun Visiting Professor to the University, gave a lecture entitled 'Does the Cost of Capital Differ Across Countries? — Cases of the U.S. and Japan' on 21st November.

In his lecture Prof. Stulz compared a conventional formulation of the cost of capital with an agency cost adjusted formulation. The conventional cost of capital measures the rate of return which is required by the firm to satisfy its sources of capital. The logic is that any project accepted must be expected to be able to pay for the firm's cost of capital. The globalization of financial markets means that investors can now expect to earn similar returns across the world. Prof. Stulz however pointed out that there are important differences in the cost of capital in different countries brought about by differences in corporate control mechanisms. For example, the American system of corporate control exerts less control over managers and therefore implies a greater cost of capital; the Japanese



system involves more monitoring of managers and therefore a lower cost of capital.

Prof. Stulz has contributed significantly to the literature on financial engineering and risk management. He has published more than 40 papers in finance and economic journals. He is the current editor of the *Journal of Finance* and the former editor of the *Journal of Financial Economics*. He is also a member of the Asset Pricing and Corporate Finance Programs of the National Bureau of Economic Research, USA.

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From the Acting Director, University Health Service

Apart from providing primary medical care to University members, the University Health Service has launched several preventive programmes in recent years and made new developments in the provision of basic services:

Hepatitis B Awareness Programme

The hepatitis B awareness programme, run biannually, aims to heighten vigilance against the long-term sequelae of hepatitis B viral infection and provide prevention against such infection. It comprises an exhibition, a serological screening of hepatitis B surface antigen (HbsAg) and hepatitis B antibody (HbsAb), and the administration of hepatitis B vaccines. Both latter services are offered by private firms at very reasonable charges. It is hoped that the long-term incidence of liver cancer and chronic liver diseases will be reduced by this preventive programme.

Urine Screening and Blood Pressure Check-up

Urine screening for protein and sugar, and blood pressure check-ups are provided for staff and their spouses above 50 years of age. These screening tests are conducted yearly and, if manpower is available, halfyearly. Clients are asked to return for further check-up

should any abnormality be detected.

Papanicoloau Smear Screening

Automated microscopic scanning machines of the Papnet System have jointly organized several first-aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation courses for laboratory personnel. The courses were conducted by a lecturer of the St. John Ambulance Brigade and first-aid certificates were awarded to attendants on passing an examination. A similar course has been arranged for security staff. It is hoped that more first-aid classes will be run for interested University members to update their knowledge and skills in managing simple medical emergencies.

Video-viewing Centre

To keep up with medical knowledge and to continually educate professional staff, the University Health Centre has become a video-viewing centre of the Hong Kong College of General to enable easy recognition and to facilitate the continuity of medical care, especially when clients attend other medical centres, e.g., the accident and emergency ward of a hospital. However waiting time for the collection of medicine is expected to increase slightly due to the labelling procedure.

Computerization

The computer program used since 1993 for registration, keeping daily statistics, and data analyses has been extended to the dispensary for stock checking, drug purchase and drug

Medical Benefit for Retired

Since January 1993, retired staff members who have served the University for not less than 10 years and who have registered at the Personnel Office are eligible for primary care service at the Health Centre. Recently we have noted an increasing number of retired staff visiting our clinic. Some live far away from the University campus and some even come from overseas. It is gratifying to learn that many of them are enjoying sound physical health.

The University Health Service is always looking into ways to improve its service to the University community. Your suggestions and comments will help us attain our goal of providing quality medical care.

The Other Hong Kong Report 1995



Focusing on Assessment and Quality Assurance

Two More Projects Funded by Teaching Development Grants 1994–95

The CUHK Newsletter has so far introduced to readers five out of the seven projects that have been awarded teaching development grants. In this issue, we bring you the last two projects, both of which lay special emphasis on assessment and quality assurance.

ACCESS: Assessment of Curricula, Courses, Examinations, and Students System (HK\$588,155)

Grant recipientProf. C. B. Hazlett, Educational Services,

How valid are course examinations? How effective is student evaluation of courses and teachers? This project addresses the issue of teaching quality by examining these two pertinent issues.

Prof. Hazlett points out that very often examinations developed by university teachers leave much to be desired, and thus examination results are neither necessarily dependable criteria for grading and promotion, nor reliable indicators of teaching quality. Different examination formats have different shortcomings. For example, frequently multiple-choice questions assess only relatively simple cognitive skills (recall or recognition of factual data), while essay questions often fail to gauge higher problem-solving skills because of inconsistencies in marking.

Prof. Hazlett also observes that evaluations of teaching quality, course structure, and examination processes by students often fail to bring about constructive changes. This is due partly to the inflexibility of the evaluation system which fails to take into account crucial factors like the number of students responding to a question (which will affect the precision of an instructor's or a course's rating), and the number of classes rated using the same question (which will affect the precision of comparative ratings).

To deal with the problem of

examinations, Prof. Hazlett's team is in the process of creating a large bank of multiple-choice questions that are categorized by properties such as difficulty level, content, and cognitive focus (that is, whether they test problem-solving skills, or factual recall, or both). Item banks from other medical schools are being acquired and added to those of the University. For the latter, a representative

from each participating department within the Medical Faculty is helping to design additional questions.

ACCESS also provides for a post-examination analysis and reporting service. All multiple-choice questions used will be subjected to statistical analyses, in terms of overall test reliability as well as the difficulty level and discrimination capability of each question.

To increase the usefulness of course and teacher evaluations by students, the project team is also

acquiring from the University of Alberta and the University of Michigan a bank of student evaluation questions which are catalogued according to four components: (1) student development which includes aspects of knowledge, skills, self-concept, and responsibility; (2) instructor abilities such as clarity of instruction, rapport with students, and ability to motivate; (3) course effectiveness which covers areas such as outline and organization, examinations and grading; and (4) instructional format: whether it is lecture/seminar, bedside teaching/clinical supervision, or assignment/laboratory work. The instructor may select from this catalogue the most relevant items for evaluation and may add items of his/her choice. If the item has been previously used, the rated instructor can be plotted in reference to a normative group of his/her choice.

Student feedback will also be analysed and then communicated to the respective instructors, and if requested, to their department and faculty heads. To put these results in the right perspective, information will be given on the number of respondents to each question, the median rating of responses to each question, and the comparative ratings between, for example, the median of the course in question and that of other courses in the same department.

Since its approval in March 1995, the grant has been used largely for buying a computer, an optical scorer, and a precision

printer, in acquiring item banks, implementing and modifying appropriate retrieval software, and in hiring a consultant from Canada, an assistant computer officer, and a research assistant. The system is expected to be tested by Christmas, and ready for implementation after March 1996.

Development of a Programme of Teaching Materials in Quality Assurance (HK\$65,000)

How can we measure the quality of service in nursing? Prof. Mackenzie feels that 'It is very difficult to measure quality.' This difficulty stems from the many perceptions of quality, and is one of the questions being explored in the education package on quality assurance being developed by the Nursing Department.

The aim of the project is to improve the teaching of quality assurance in nursing by promoting student-directed learning and utilizing critical thinking in the application of theory to clinical practice. In the long run this means that students will be able to become actively involved in the promotion and development of nursing quality assurance in the workplace, be it in the community, hospitals, clinics, industries, or schools.

Quality assurance is definitely an issue in nursing — it provides nurses with a form of practice appraisal, a process to assist in defining the profession, and a form of demonstrating accountability, and

all of this is important in today's consumer society.

The educational package aims to answer the following questions: What is quality assurance? Why should nurses be involved in it? What form should it take? How can we measure quality? How can the concept of quality assurance be applied to the provision of nursing services? How is nursing quality assurance being utilized overseas and in Hong Kong? Can we improve on what we have now, and if so, how?

The project to date has seen the development of a reference resource comprising international and local papers on quality assurance in nursing and allied health professional literature, revamped teaching materials including multimedia teaching aids, and tutorial materials to

guide students through segments of self-directed learning.

The self-directed learning materials are based on the principle that more comprehensive knowledge comes from knowing not only 'what' but also 'how'. An authentic test of the acquisition of knowledge is the ability to apply knowledge in the actual situation. Thus the tutorials provide both thinking and practical exercises to promote the link between theory and workplace for the students. It is during these times that the students can freely discuss and

analyse quality assurance developments, as well as develop suitable programmes and tools in their clinical areas (clinical areas being those areas where the students are involved in the practice of nursing, for example, the orthopaedic ward/unit, the delivery ward/unit in obstetrics, or the community). It is also during these sessions that students can reflect on their learning and identify gaps in their knowledge. The focus of the self-directed materials is on developing quality assurance programmes and tools suitable for setting and measuring standards of health care. In addition students will examine ways of using the results of measurement to reinforce or amend health care practice.

Prof. Mackenzie hopes that the use of this package will lead to more interactive learning with students becoming confident and proactive in promoting nursing quality assurance in the workplace. The project itself forms the basis for further development of quality assurance using educational technology.

Putonghua and Cantonese Courses for Staff and spouses

The New Asia Yale-in-China Chinese Language Centre will offer Putonghua and Cantonese courses to University staff and their spouses from 16th January till 18th April 1996. The following courses have been tentatively scheduled to take place every Tuesday and Thursday from 5.00 p.m. to 6.50 p.m. at the Fong Shu Chuen Building:

- (1) Beginner's course in Putonghua for foreigners.
- (2) Beginner's course in Cantonese for foreigners.
- (3) Beginner's course in Putonghua for non-Putonghua speakers of Chinese origin.
- (4) Beginner's course in Cantonese for non-Cantonese speakers of Chinese origin.

The size of each class is limited to eight students and the minimum number of students to form a class is four. Enrolment will be on a first-come-first-served basis.

Basic tuition fee for each course is HK\$5,280. World-renowned Chemist Visits University

Prof. Jean-Marie Lehn, 1987 Nobel Laureate and professor of chemistry from Collge de France and Universite Louis Pasteur de Strasbourg, will visit the University and deliver a public lecture entitled 'From Matter to Life: Chemistry?!' as Advanced Chemicals Limited Distinguished Visiting Professor. He will also speak at a research seminar on 'Supramolecular Chemistry: Concepts and Perspectives'.

Prof. Lehn spent the major part of his academic career in Strasbourg where he obtained his Ph.D. under the direction of G. Ourisson in 1963. He has many accomplishments to his credit, including numerous awards from institutions in Europe and honorary doctoral degrees from the University of Jerusalem and the Universidad Autonoma in Madrid. He is a Foreign Associate of the U.S. National Academy of Sciences and a member of many other prestigious professional organizations. For his pioneering work in the design and synthesis of cryptands he received the 1987 Nobel Prize in chemistry.

Generally regarded as the leading chemist in France, Prof. Lehn has co-authored more than 300 papers. He gained worldwide recognition in 1967 when he described the synthesis of the first cryptand. Currently Prof. Lehn is conducting research on artificial photosynthesis in which photo-induced chemical processes are used to carry out energy-storing chemical reactions, such as the reduction of carbon dioxide and the production of hydrogen from water.

Prof. Lehn's lecture, which will be preceded by a tea reception, will take place at 4.30 p.m. on 14th December in LT1 of the Sino Building. The seminar will take place at 10.30 a.m. on 15th December in L2 of the Science Centre.

初任大學教師的感受

社區及家庭醫學系李大拔醫生

我童年時便十分嚮往教學工作,溫 習時往往將自己當作老師,將課文講解 一遍,從而領悟得更多,並感到如能與 其他人分享自己的學識,會有無限的滿 足感。

我就讀的小學在農圃道舊新亞書院 附近,所以常見到很多大專哥哥姊姊用 心學習的神態,而他們畢業後在社會發 揮領導地位,驅使我立志在大專教學。

後來中文大學成立,標榜通識及全 人教育,且著重中國文化傳統,而我又 十分喜愛閱讀中國歷史,加上中大的辦 學宗旨與訓練醫生的不謀而合,所以極 渴望加入中大服務。現在願望終於達 成,並且恰巧隸屬新亞書院。

醫生要有深厚的醫學知識,還要了解人類的行爲心態,和與人溝通的技

巧。醫科生的一般想法是如果熟讀醫書,行醫濟世便一定沒有問題。但當他們執業時,便知道了解人類行爲心態的重要。在習醫階段,大學必會教授及權輸這方面的知識技巧,並有很多鍛鍊機會,可惜學生很多時都不大注重,以致日後有「書到用時方恨少」的懊悔,這亦是我行醫多年的體驗。所以,我執業多年後才加入中大社區及家庭醫學系全職任教,是希望把這方面的淺見和體會與學生分享。

我習醫時,教師仍用傳統教學方法,在課堂講解或在醫院臨牀教授,很多細節要由學生自己尋求,探索其中的道理。大學教育本應如此,加上第四及第五年醫科生應已十分成熟,此種形式的教學應該沒有問題。但科技日益發展,學生要學的東西不斷增加,教師要多了解學生的弱點和學習上的困難,加以輔導。例如醫科教學以英文爲主,但

時下學生的語文程度下降,特別是英文,對醫學院老師來說,這是一個大難題。我們把小組討論列爲重點教學方法,雖然令我們要花更多心思及時間,但效果良好,也受學生歡迎。

新任大學教師都是滿懷抱負,希望 將自己的專長學識,傳授給學生。但基 於很多因素,學生不一定領受。我比較 幸運,全職任教前,已經在中大兼任教 學,和學系同事建立了良好的工作關 係,他們給我的支持、鼓勵及輔導,對 我幫助很大。因此,我明瞭如果同事之 間能夠多些交換意見,可以促進教學的 效果。

教學發展組在八月舉辦的「大學教學的挑戰與享受」座談會,對新教師十分有用,可以分享前輩的經驗,了解目前大學生的狀況,更重要的是可以與其他學系的同事交流,更新教學方法。

我的體會是,如果在全職任教前,



對自己的學科有具體的工作經驗,又參與兼任教學,會很快適應大學教學的新環境並建立良好的師生關係。在座談會上,很多同事都認爲若能在講解理論時列舉實例,學生對課堂學習會更加投入和有興趣。他們印證了我的看法:我們過往的工作經驗及人生閱歷,對教學都大有幫助。

大學生是社會的未來棟樑,能夠協 助培植他們,我認爲是人生最有意義的 事。

《性別學與婦女研究:華人社會的探索》

此書由張妙淸、葉漢明和郭佩蘭合編,收錄中國、台灣和香港從事性別及婦女研究的學者的相關文章和專題論文,從史學和理論層面探討在中華文化背景下作性別及婦女研究的一些基本課題,並比較三地的探索經驗。

教與學的心理健康

心理學系陳衛博士



看看手錶,已經是四時五十分,我 於是把這一堂課的最後一個要點略作說 明,便結束了三個小時的授課。也許是 上課的時間太長了,同學們看來都有點 疲倦。所以當他們得知課堂完結時,都 不禁流露出鬆一口氣的模樣。他們有些 在收拾文具和筆記,準備離去;有些則 繼續與同學討論剛才課堂上的某部分內 容。這個時候,我通常都是靜靜地站在 一旁,看著他們離去。總的來說,我發 覺他們是快樂地踏出課室的,至少不會 比進入課室時更不開心。

我常常試圖明白他們快樂離去的原 因。最近,我想到了兩個可能性:他們 感到快樂是因爲學到了一些他們認爲有 價值的東西,所以下課時便很滿足地離 開;然而,快樂的離去亦可能是擺脫痛 苦的自然反應。我基本上是一個樂觀的 人,而且不喜歡爲他人製造痛苦,所以 較傾向於接受第一個解釋。這種一廂情 願的自我安慰,至少有助於心理的健

除了觀察學生下課時的神態,我也 不時留意他們在課堂中的表情。我們的 學生比較含蓄,他們在上課時遇到不明 白的地方,都不大會向老師發問。相 反,他們會與鄰座同學討論,或者用一 臉惘然的神情來表示。因此,上課時我 必須口、手、眼並用。嘴巴在說著講 義,雙手就控制著投影膠片的放送,而 眼睛就得環遊四週,察看學生的反應。 每當大多數同學都顯得疑惑時,我便嘗 試把該部分內容重新解釋一次,把問題 說個明白。

要在課堂上取得成功,取決於很多 因素,例如對課題的認識、說話的技 巧、教書的經驗,以及對學生的關懷等 等,而事前的充分準備更是不可或缺 實踐,學生在中學已可自由選科。這也 的。就個人的體會而言,我在備課的時 候,常有一個衝動要把自己所知的通通 都說出來。但另一方面,我卻擔心學生 接受不了,因爲他們的需要未必就是這 些東西。要在兩者之間取得平衡,確實 不是一件容易的事。基於這個緣故,我

很多時都會修改原定的內容,希望藉此 增加學生對科目的興趣,更投入上課。

在現今的大學教育制度下,每科的 上課時間普遍是每週兩至三個小時,師 生在課堂內的接觸或交流實在非常有 限。我們大部分的時間,仍然是活在課 室以外的。下課並不代表教學告一段 落,更不代表學習的結束。我盼望同學 能夠好好把握美好的年青時光,善用各 方面的資源,盡情享受大學的生活。

我的一點感受和意見

我在香港長大,完成中學預科課程 後,到美國讀了六年大專,嗣後在美國 電話公司做了六年科技研究,繼而轉到 一所州立大學任教又六年。今年適逢休 假,很高興回到闊別了十八年的香港, 在中大訊息工程學系任訪問學人,從事



課程的設計和評分標準較可依循教師的 信念和要求,不須過分顧慮到所謂「學 生的消費權益」。

初回香港,我不期然把這些理念和 對學生的期望都帶回來,有的放矢,但 結果不如理想。學生給我的回應是課程 太深,功課太多,教得太快,考試太 難。雖然他們另方面感到上我的課新鮮 有挑戰性,但總括來說,我極需重新調 整目標,多了解他們在新學習形式上遇 到的困難。對於學生口頭和中期問卷發 表的意見,以及同事的提點,我倍加珍

翻新一次,他們要學的比我讀大學時多 了不少,自然沒有那麼深入,但他們有 更多機會與老師一同作研究,如果可以 延長他們在校的時間(諸如提倡學士碩 士聯合學位課程),提供更多科目讓他 們自由選修,部分科目用小班制以訓練 他們的思考及表達能力,並加強人文化 的科技課程,相信培育出來的人才,就 更能適應二十一世紀的時代需要。

我對教學的反思

鞍山蒼蒼, 吐露洋洋。在海外留學 及工作的歲月裡,不時懷念昔日在中大 就學的那一段美好時光。闊別多年後, 今天能夠回到母校任教,給我莫大的興 奮與喜悅。

然而,個人高漲的情緒,似乎與社 會輿論的調子並不調協。過去兩個月 裡,不時在校內校外聽到類似的言論: 「大學生的語文水平日趨下降」、「今 天的大學生利字當頭」、「近年師生關 係大不如前」等等。事實上,由於高等 教育的普及,大學生的質素自然隨著人 數的增加而變得比較參差。那麼,我該 如何因應實際情況,調節個人對學生的 要求,從而發揮教學的最高效能呢?

首先,我深信教與學是一條雙程 路,教師給學生的回應可促進學生的學 習, 而學生給教師的回應則促進教師的 教學。我要求選修「學習理論」的小學 教育課程學生以週記的方式寫下他們對 教學的反思,由我回應他們的觀點與看 法。幾個星期下來,大部分學生都認爲 這種形式的作業有助他們思考教學的問 題,但也有小部分學生覺得強迫的反思 對他們毫無幫助。我遂修訂日後對學生 的作業要求,容許他們選擇接近自己個 性和興趣的作業。在這個教與學的過程 中,師生的相互回應促進了彼此間的溝 通,從而提高了教學效果。

其次,我也深信如果要發揮教學的 效能,教師必須採取主動,給予學生個 別接觸與提問的機會。在學期中段,我 要求學生個別約見我,談論他們對學期 末的作業「個案分析」的構思。這做法 使我有機會認識平日在課堂上比較靜默 的一群,也讓他們在沒有公眾壓力的情 況下抒發他們的見解與感想。至於那永 遠獨立,不願與教師接觸的一群,我也 給予他們選擇的自由,只要他們有信心 將作業做好,則可以與我保持「安全的 距離」,毋須約見我。

至於課堂上的教學,我嘗試設計一 些簡單的教學活動,增加師生與學生之 間的互動機會。課堂上的課題與活動, 也會因應學生的回應而修訂。

總而言之,無論今天的大學生的水 平如何,我希望可以就他們現有的水平 予以引導,務求他們的學識與學養能夠 提升到另一個層次。在面對大學強調研 究、著作的壓力的同時,我希望我曉得 如何分配自己的時間,使教學與研究並

惜,從善如流。

每班學生都是獨特的。我面對的既 不是時下美國的學生,也不是十八年前 的香港大一學生。他們的優點是學習認 真,態度坦白真誠,且吸收知識的能力 比美國同輩強得多; 缺點是會答不會 問,能按公式分解,循序的能力實在驚 人,但對問題的模擬,假設的引進和批 判,以至日常現象的分析,卻缺少頭 緒。特別是或然率這一科,源於日常生 活,很多是「文字題」,而不是公式 題,他們在考試中答得最差的,是與學 科有關的日常知識。修讀我的先進網絡 科的學生對學術論文的理解力強,但卻 不敢發揮自己的創見,或批判他人的論 點。此外,我也曾問過部分將於今學年 畢業的學生,對資訊革命的了解及其對 社會的正負面評價。他們的答案往往只 講到科技的運用,卻不知爲甚麼和爲誰

數學新浪潮講座

揭開混沌之謎

數學系於十一月廿五日在邵逸夫堂 舉行「數學新浪潮」講座系列第三講, 向逾千名中學生揭開「混沌」之謎。

是次講座由數學系講師溫有恆博士 主持。他指出,宇宙有很多看似沒有規 則、沒有系統的混沌現象,橫亙在人類 面前,而我們往往不能用傳統理論來研 究和解釋。直至本世紀六十至七十年代 「混沌學」興起,這情形才有所改變。 混沌學說主要研究各種「混沌」現象, 應用範圍廣及氣象、生物、股票市場等 領域。我們現今已可根據近日氣象變

化,推測明天,甚至後天的天氣狀況; 不過,卻不能準確預測十天後的天氣狀 況。溫博士解釋,「混沌」的特徵之一 就是「差之毫釐,謬以千里」,原本的 些微誤差經時間擴大,以致天氣預測出

溫博士在講座中除介紹各種「混 沌」現象外,也解釋「混沌」如何在動 力系統(隨著時間的變遷,而根據某些規 律演進的系統)中出現。講座完畢,出席 者獲安排親自使用電腦以了解「混沌」 概念。

財務學家主持偉倫講座

提醒投資者注意各地資金成本差異

美國著名財務學家 Prof. René M. Stulz 認爲,公司資金成本往往取決於不 同的組織結構,而美日兩國的公司資金 成本則顯著不同。

Prof. René M. Stulz 爲美國俄亥俄州 立大學財務學講座教授, 專研財務工 程、風險管理及收購合併。

他於十一月廿一日應本校邀請,以 偉倫訪問教授身分假信和樓二號演講廳 主持公開講座,講題爲「資金成本在不 同國家是否有差異」。

他指出,現今不少投資者的投資組 合已趨向國際化,因而要承受不同程度 的風險,因爲不同國家及地區的上市公 司,基於不同的經營結構,有不同的資 金成本。因此,認識上市公市的經營結 構,是投資者避免高風險的首要課題。

資金成本是指投資者對公司要求的

加權平均回報率,當公司的實際回報率 大於投資者要求的,公司股值便上升; 反之,則下降。

他引用其在美日兩國的研究所得, 指出日本公司的資金成本顯著低於美國 的,原因是兩國的公司結構不同。由於 美國公司對經理的控制較少,經理自主 權較大,較專注爲自己爭取福利,因此 投資者須承受高風險; 至於日本公司的 經理則受到較多的監督,自主權少,不 易以私利是尚。故此,投資者對美國上 市公司要求較高的回報率,以彌補其所 承受的風險,而對日本上市公司的要求 則較低,因而導致美日的資金成本顯著 不同。

Prof. Stulz 現爲《財務學期刊》編 輯,以及美國全國經濟研究局資金定價 與公司財務計劃的成員。
