

Wei Lun Professor Discusses Future of Marketing Research

Prof. Paul Green, professor of marketing at Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania and marketing researcher of international renown, gave a lecture at the University on 5th May in his capacity as Wei Lun Visiting Professor to the University. In his lecture entitled 'Marketing Science or Marketing Engineering: What is the Future for Research in Marketing?', Prof. Green traced the development and maturation of marketing research from the late 1950s and commented on the question of relevance of academic marketing research to the needs of business students and the business community. He also predicted some future trends in marketing research and their implications for academic promotion and tenure, MBA education, and business needs.

Prof. Green's research interests include quantitative methods and new measurement techniques in market analysis and consumer research. He is a recipient of the Parlin Award for Advancement Science in Marketing, the Paul D. Converse Award in Marketing Theory, and the Gilbert A. Churchill Jr. Award for 'lifetime achievement marketing research'. Prof. Green's

contribution to education was demonstrated in his being awarded the AMA/Irwin Marketing Education of the Year Award in 1991 and the Academy of Marketing Science Distinguished Education of the Year Award in 1992. He is a fellow of various professional bodies, including the American Statistical Association, the Decision Sciences Institute, and the Attitude Research Hall of Fame.

Prof. Green also has extensive industry experience, some of which involved firms such as E.I. Dupont de Nemours and the Sun Oil Company. He has been consultant to Air Products, IBM, Squibb International, AT&T, Subaru, and other big names.



Medical Professor Targets Diabetes and Obesity in Inaugural Lecture

Trbanization industrialization in Asia have produced changes in lifestyles which have led to overnutrition, physical inactivity, and stress — underlying factors for a spectrum of noncommunicable diseases including diabetes and obesity. At his professorial inaugural lecture entitled 'Human History, Lifestyle and Metabolic Disease A Journey Through Time', Prof. Clive Cockram, professor of medicine, discussed both genetic and environmental factors underlying various metabolic diseases in the light of research data from Hong Kong and examples from mainland China and the Pacific Islands. The lecture was delivered on 24th April.

Prof. Cockram studied medicine at St. Thomas' Hospital Medical School, University of London, and received his MBBS in 1973. In 1979, he was awarded a fellowship to undertake research into the structure-function relationships of insulin, leading eventually to the award of doctor of medicine. He completed specialist training in internal medicine, endocrinology and diabetes mellitus in



1984.

Prof. Cockram joined The Chinese University as senior lecturer in medicine in 1985, and was promoted to reader in 1991, and chair professor in 1996.

He was instrumental in the establishment of a Diabetes and Endocrine Centre at the Prince of Wales Hospital, and is actively involved in the activities of the International Diabetes Federation.

Motorola Supports Frontier Research at Faculty of Engineering

he Faculty of Engineering recently received a donation of US\$20,000 from the Motorola Foundation in support of semiconductor research conducted by the Department of Systems Engineering and Engineering Management. Dean of engineering Prof. P.C. Ching, who received the donation on behalf of his faculty at a ceremony held on 2nd April, said the faculty would continue to work with Motorola in finding optimal systems that improve production planning and scheduling semiconductor in manufacturing.

Due to its complex production flow, stochastic environment, and rapidly changing technology, semiconductor wafer fabrication poses a great challenge to both academics and engineers. Researchers at the Department of Systems Engineering and Engineering Management have developed

optimization tools for dynamic production scheduling, some of which have been included by Motorola Semiconductors Asia and Pacific in its Back End Scheduling Tools, currently used by two plants in Hong Kong and other plants throughout the Asia Pacific region. Prior to such collaboration, the department succeeded in building simulation models for Motorola's assembly and testing processes, which have been proven, amongst other things, to significantly reduce production cycle times.

Motorola's funds to support research in this field used to be equally distributed among universities in Hong Kong. Since 1997, however, the Motorola Foundation decided to channel all its support into the Department of Systems Engineering and Engineering Management at CUHK.

Show 10th anniversary Symposium

As part of its 10th anniversary celebrations, Shaw College organized a symposium entitled 'Information Technology and Life' jointly with the Faculty of Education, the Department of Information Engineering, and the Department of Decision Sciences and Managerial Economics on 17th April at the college's Lecture Theatre.

The first session of the symposium, chaired by Prof. Chung Yue-ping, focused on the practice of information technology in Hong Kong schools, while the second gave a picture of the role information

technology plays in industry. Participants included representatives from local secondary schools, the Education Department of the HKSAR, the British-American Tobacco Co. (HK) Ltd., the Hong Kong Jockey Club, the Hong Kong and Shanghai Banking Corporation, and CUHK faculty members.

Between the sessions, Prof. Wong Po-choi of the Department of Information Engineering demonstrated new information technology applications, including the very popular 'Hong Kong School Net'.

Internet Broadcast of Peking University's Centennial Celebrations

The University was invited by Peking University and China Central Television

A (CCTV) to organize the Internet broadcast of the centennial celebration of Peking University. The Computer Services Centre of the University was responsible for transforming TV satellite signals from CCTV into digital video format for real time broadcast on the Internet. Internet users could view the celebrations through the University's website.

The Grand Celebration Party held on Peking University campus on the evening of 4th May was broadcast live. Other celebration



activities such as the 'Higher Education Forum: the University of the 21st Century' on 2nd and 3rd May could be viewed in the form of videos-on-demand. Also available on the Internet are the Centennial Celebration Conference held at the Great Hall of People, the inauguration of the new library building of Peking University, and the speeches of heads of universities delivered on the occasion, including that of Prof. Arthur K.C. Li.

To Cater for Research Interest in Comparative Literature, Cultural Studies, and Linguistics

The study of linguistics, literature, and culture at the University will soon enjoy an added academic dimension with the establishment of new postgraduate programmes. Based in the Faculty of Arts, such programmes are multidisciplinary, offering M.Phil. or Ph.D. degrees in linguistics, as well as comparative literature and cultural studies. In this issue, Prof. Wong Kin-yuen and Prof. Gladys Tang from the Department of English explain to the CUHK Newsletter the background for their introduction.

In Step with a Wordwide Trend

Before the creation of the programmes, postgraduate teaching and research in those areas were carried out in the Department of English. But as their scope and direction of development were not quite the same as those of the department, some teachers proposed the introduction of new programmes independent of the department. The move reflects a worldwide trend for studies involving several disciplines.

Prof. Wong Kin-yuen, coordinator of the new programmes, said, 'Between the major subjects at a university are often areas of knowledge that have been neglected. These have to be explored using an interdisciplinary approach. The delineation of disciplines is being reviewed worldwide, and what's happening at the University is no different.'

Prof. Gladys Tang, who specializes in linguistics studies, added, 'Linguistics is the root of many academic subjects, and knowledge of linguistics is useful to, for example, sociology, psychology, anthropology, translation, journalism and

communication. While English linguistics will continue to be a major focus of attention at the Department of English, linguistics studies involving other languages would surely benefit other departments. Students from other departments who show a concern for language studies will be able to pursue their research under the new programmes.'

What's Being Compared?

There is often a misconception that in comparative studies only data or texts

are compared. Comparative literary studies, for example, is often thought to be solely about comparing literary works from different traditions, say, Chinese and Indian poetry. But this is only part of comparative studies. Comparison is also made at a theoretical level of the applications of literary, cultural, or linguistic theories to texts or data, for instance, the application of western literary theory to Turkish novels, or linguistics theory derived from English data to Chinese dialects. Theory, in fact, is the focus of the new programmes as their proposers believe any vigorous research must be grounded in theory.

In the case of the linguistics programme, there is one more clarification to be made. Prof. Tang pointed out that the title 'Postgraduate Programmes in Comparative Studies in Linguistics, Literature, and Culture' can be misleading. 'I have received enquiries from potential applicants, who presumably have a conventional understanding of comparative studies, about whether they can still apply if they don't compare two languages. The answer is they can,' she said. Prof. Wong added, 'Yes, the title can cause a bit of confusion among linguistics students wishing to get into graduate studies. We may consider modifying it in the coming year.' As long

URBAN GIS FORUM

Experts from Beijing, Shanghai, Taipei, Hong Kong, Tianjin, Kaohsiung, Guangzhou, and Shenzhen gathered at Shanghai for the first meeting of the Urban Geographic Information Systems Forum (UGISF) held from 22nd to 24th April.

UGISF was recently established with the assistance of the Joint Laboratory for Geoinformation Science, a collaborative venture between The Chinese Academy of Sciences and The Chinese University of Hong Kong. The forum will be the meeting ground for large cities on both sides of the Taiwan Straits to discuss common issues related to urban planning and management, and development of urban GIS.

At the Shanghai meeting,

Prof. Yeung Yue-man, director of the CUHK Hong Kong Institute of Asia-Pacific Studies, gave a keynote speech on 'The Opportunities and Challenges Faced by Mega Coastal Cities of the Asia-Pacific Region', and Prof. Chen Shupeng, director of the academic committee of the Laboratory Joint Geoinformation Science and an academician at the Chinese Academy of Sciences, talked about urbanization and the development of urban GIS.

An agreement was made at the meeting for long-term academic exchange among large cities on mainland China and in Taiwan, and for setting up the secretariat and publication unit of UGISF at The Chinese University. The next UGISF meeting will be held in Taipei next year.

TDV Seminars on Teaching Excellence

ver 40 teaching staff of the University attended a series of seminars, workshops, and consultation sessions on the theme of 'Searching for Excellence' from 20th to 24th April. The events were run by Prof. John A. Bowden, director of the Educational Program Improvement Group and professor of educational development at RMIT University, at the invitation of the Teaching Development Unit. Topics covered including learningimprovement-focused approach to educational quality assurance and outcome-focused improvements to teaching and learning. Participants were encouraged to consider the relevance of Prof.

Prof. Bowden taught chemistry and education at the University of Melbourne and RMIT University. A specialist in educational development, he has over a hundred publications to his name. In 1992, he was elected a life member

of the Australian Society for Computers in Learning in Tertiary Education, which he founded. He was also president of the Higher Education Research and Development Society of Australasia.

Prof. Bowden's recent research includes topics such as the development of professional competence, educational quality assurance systems, and the learning of science concepts.

Two graduates of the University came out tops in the December 1997 HKSA/ACCA joint examinations administered by the Hong Kong Society of Accountants. as their research is theory-based, students can use linguistics to work on any language, be it German, Japanese, Chinese, English, sign language... or any combination of those.

Academic Space Enlarged

For linguistics teachers, the new programme creates a large academic space. Research in linguistics no longer has to be affiliated with any language department. The Linguistics Subcommittee of the English Division in the Graduate School has recently changed the title of its postgraduate programme to Applied English Linguistics from English Linguistics, making the distinction between the two programmes even clearer. Students wishing to do research in applied linguistics in English can now apply to the Programme of Applied English Linguistics, while students wishing to do theory-based research in linguistics involving data in any language including English can apply to the new programme.

As for students wishing to pursue cultural and literary studies, no language requirement is now imposed on texts used in their research. From its former status as a British colony to now, a special adminstrative region of China, Hong Kong's own culture has always been in

danger of being swallowed up by the larger discourses of dominant cultural and political powers. Prof. Wong believes that in this post-1997 era, especially, students should take into consideration their identity as a Hong Kong or even a Chinese person when determining the direction of

their research. 'At the postgraduate level, it is important that students of cultural studies have their academic roots in Hong Kong identity/culture. I believe it the mission of teachers and students of cultural studies to create a Hong Kong cultural language and literary identity,' he explained. Prof. Tang also pointed out that research in language attitude has shown that a better appreciation of one's own cultural identity indirectly helps improve one's language abilities.

Quality Control and Publicity

No doubt cultural studies is a very fascinating field of study and one that students in Hong Kong can easily relate to. But is there also a danger that cultural studies is chosen as a cop-out from more intellectually challenging and academically demanding studies like, say, traditional literature? Can it be a fad? After all, everything, even a bowl of

wonton noodles, is culture. 'Cultural studies can be a fad but it can also be serious academic study. My argument is: what does classical English literature or high culture have to do with a 20-year-old from Hong Kong? I

don't think learning should be completely divorced from the daily life of the learner. Besides, we've always kept an eye on the quality of research and will be very strict with the standard of research carried out by the students,' said Prof. Wong.

There is not yet a final decision on the choice of teachers for the programmes, but it should include six or seven basic teaching staff from different faculties. And what has been done along the line of promotion? 'Not much, apart from putting in advertisements in the newspapers and *Varsity*, the campus magazine, and sending out pamphlets and leaflets to other tertiary institutions,' said Prof. Tang. 'We have to work to the utmost within our constraints, the first of which is insufficient time. Manpower and money are also inadequate.'

Despite the constraints, however, the number of applicants for the coming semester, who are currently being interviewed, is 'very encouraging', a sign perhaps that the programmes are forward-looking. O

兩岸城市地理訊息論壇



楊汝萬教授

地球信息科學聯合實驗室最近推動成立「城市地理信息系統學術論壇」,並集合海峽兩岸大城市的學者於上月廿二至廿四日在上海召開第一次會議。

在會議開幕禮上,本校亞太研究所所長 楊汝萬教授發表主題演講「亞太區沿海特大城 市面臨的契機與挑戰」,而地球信息科學聯合 實驗室學術委員會主任、中國科學院院士陳 述彭教授則論述「城市化問題與城市GIS的發 展」。

與會者來自北京、上海、台北、香港、 天津、高雄、廣州、重慶和深圳,他們在會 上通過協議,開展長期的學術交流活動,又 決定在本校成立論壇的秘書處和論壇年報的 編輯部,並推選本校地理系林琿教授、上海 市建委科技信息技術委員會簡逢敏主任、台 灣大學林峰田教授協調論壇的活動。

林琿教授表示,該實驗室將可透過新設的論壇,爲區內的城市訊息化建設發揮積極的推動作用,而論壇將每年輪流在海峽兩岸的大城市舉行,第二屆年會於明年在台北召開。

百萬元研究普通話教學成效

課程與教學學系何偉傑教授聯同香港教育研 究所最近投得語文基金的研究項目,獲撥款近九 十九萬元,研究用普通話教授中文對中學生學習 中國語文的影響。

何教授表示,該研究爲期三年半,旨在比較 中一至中三學生,在以廣東話授課和以普通話授 課的不同條件下,學習中國語文的表現,包括寫 作能力、閱讀能力和對中國文化的認識。

近年來本港學生的語文能力不斷下降,教育

界提出各種補救方案。其中一種是採用普通話作 為中文科的教學語言,藉此縮短口語和書面語的 距離,增強學生對現代漢語的語感,從而提升整 體語文能力。

何教授說,本年九月開始,普通話科將成爲 全港中、小學的核心課程,而個別學校正積極考 慮採用普通話作爲中文科的教學語言,以期加強 普通話的學習和提高學生使用標準語的能力。他 主持的研究,會致力尋找普通話教學的成效。

市民的置業意欲不強

根據亞太研究所的調查顯示,逾半市民贊同 行政長官的房屋政策,而四分三的市民在未來一 年不會置業。

調查由亞太研究所所長楊汝萬教授主持,於 上月中以電話調查一千多名市民對政府房屋政策 的章目。

楊教授表示,調查結果反映香港市民受去年的金融風暴影響,對前景欠樂觀,百分之七十四 受訪者未來一年無意置業或換樓。三成受訪者認 爲「租者置其屋」計劃會壓抑樓價及減低市民購買 私營房屋的意欲,亦有近三成受訪者認爲「居者 有其屋」和「夾心階層住屋」計劃會減低私營房屋 的需求

此外,八成半受訪者認為,房屋委員會的「自置居所貸款計劃」和房屋協會的「首次置業貸款計劃」都有助市民自置居所;六成人則指住宅物業按揭利息可以扣稅的措施,能夠吸引市民自置居所。

調查又顯示,百分之五十五受訪者同意特首 的公營及私營房屋混合發展的政策。約四成人認 爲政府與發展商協議減收地價,是公營及私營房 屋混合發展的最可行方法。

楊教授稱,調查的主要目的是收集資料,以推動各界對房屋政策的討論。

第三屆華人社會研討會

第三屆華人社會社會指標研究 研討會於四月三十日至五月二日假 行政樓祖堯堂舉行,數十名香港、 內地和台灣的學者出席,宣讀論文 二十五篇。

會議討論共分九個專題,環繞各主要華人社會的指標研究、發展及其與別的社會現象的關係,例如數據偏差、社會指標比較、社會價值、公民文化、政治認受性、身分認同、婚姻觀念和性別研究等。

會議由本校香港亞太 研究所和社會學系、理大

應用社會科學系及港大亞洲研究中 心合辦,香港崇正總會贊助。開幕 禮由副校長金耀基教授和崇正總會 理事長黃石華先生致辭。



加強畢業生的就業能力

學生事務處為應屆畢業生提供 多項就業輔導計劃,加強他們的就 業能力,其中包括學界首創的精英 創業計劃,以低息貸款協助畢業生 創業。

大學輔導長郭少棠教授表示, 就業市場的競爭壓力很大,大學生 必須充實和裝備自己,加強個人的 競爭力。校方增設爲期三週的行政 事務培訓證書課程,提供行政人員 專業培訓和中英文商業文書訓練; 又籌設新紀元跨文化管理領袖培訓 計劃,加強中大學生和內地學生的 交流。此外,亦會與社會福利署和 尖沙咀街坊福利會合辦義工計劃, 增強畢業生對社會的認識。

至於精英創業計劃,則會參照 現行的學生貸款計劃方式,為應屆 畢業生提供低息貸款。申請者須提 交計劃書,經審批後,每位學生最 高可獲貸款五萬元,而學生亦須參 加一個短期的訓練課程,爲創業作 好準備。校方正籌款成立創業發展 基金,目標爲三百萬元。

社會保障不足

根據本校一項調查顯示,亞洲 金融風暴之後,更多市民認爲香港 的貧窮問題嚴重,只有一成多市民 覺得社會有足夠的失業保障。

調查由社會工作學系王卓祺教 授和香港亞太研究所研究統籌員王 家英博士主持,先後於去年十月和 本年四月以電話各訪問了一千名市 民,全面而有系統地探討他們對香 港現行社會福利狀況的看法。

上月的調查發現,更多市民認 為香港貧富懸殊,近六成人認為貧 窮的原因並非源自個人而是社會。 逾八成半市民認為失業問題嚴重, 比半年前的調查急升三成;逾半市 民認爲失業會危害家庭經濟,比上 次調查上升約百分之六。

王家英博士指出,近九成受訪 者認爲靠自己努力或家庭成員的幫 助最能解決生活所需,反映出香港 人傳統上並不倚賴社會福利。

王卓祺教授則表示,由於有更 多市民感到失業會危害家庭經濟, 若失業問題拖延下去,這個依賴個 人和家庭去解決社會問題的系統便 可能生變,他促請港府成立失業保 險制度。



市場學研究的未來



蜚聲國際的著名市場學學者Prof. Paul Green上月以偉倫教授身分到訪本校,並 於五月五日在信和樓主持公開講座,講題 爲「市場學術研究的未來——市場科學或 市場工程學?」。

他在講座上闡述市場學研究從五十年 代迄今的發展及其成熟過程,又批評部分 市場學的學術研究與企業實際所需的不 同;並且分析市場學研究的一些未來發展 趨勢,以及研究成果對大學教師升遷、教 席終身制、工商管理碩士教育和企業實際 需求的影響。

Prof. Green 爲賓夕法尼亞大學Wharton

商學院市場學教授,是眾多企業的顧問, 歷年獲獎無數,美國市場學協會更於一九 九六年以他的姓名設立獎項,嘉獎《市場 學研究期刊》優秀論文的作者。同年,他 獲頒市場學研究終身成就獎。根據最近一 項調查, Prof. Green獲選為市場學學界中 最傑出的研究學者。該調查的評審標準包 括論文質素、學術界人士評選等。

Prof. Green的主要研究興趣爲運用計 量方法及嶄新的測量技巧進行市場分析及 消費研究。他曾出版專著十五種和專題論 文叢刊五本,論文經常刊載於市場學、商 學及社會科學的著名期刊。

北大百年慶典 本校電腦直播

本校上月獲北京大學及中央電視台邀請,將北京大學創校百年慶祝活動實況以影像 方式在互聯網發放,讓世界各地的互聯網用戶收看盛況。



由於北大校友遍及海內外,該校 上月特與中央電視台合作,轉播百年 校慶盛會,而本校電算機服務中心則 負責接收由中央電視台提供的電視衛 星訊號,進行實時圖像數碼化製作及 播放,讓各地互聯網用戶透過本校網 址即時收看。

五月四日晚的北大百年慶典晚會 「光明行」透過互聯網現場直播,而其 他重點慶祝活動則以自選錄像方式在 互聯網上發放,包括「面向二十一世 紀世界著名大學校長論壇」、「北京大

學百周年慶典大會」、「北京大學圖書館影樓落成典禮」及「北京大學校慶盛況」等。

本校電算機服務中心去年曾與香港電台合作,將香港主權移交的過程,透過互聯網 作四十八小時的視像直播。

糖尿病專家的憂慮

內科講座教授郭克倫教授指出,糖尿病、肥胖和代謝失調已成爲亞太區的普遍病 症,而糖尿病患者激增的情況尤使人憂慮。

郭克倫教授上月廿四日於威爾斯親王醫院主持就職演講,以「與你穿梭時空,看人 類歷史、生活方式與代謝疾病」爲題,引用亞太區包括香港和中國內地的統計數字和例

子,探討引致各種代謝疾病的遺 傳和環境因素。


他說,估計香港有四十萬糖 尿病人,內地更高達二千萬,而 太平洋的瑙魯島約有四成人口患 上糖尿病,問題嚴重。隨著區內 城市化和工業化,亞洲人的生活 方式起了巨大變化,因而衍生營 養過剰、飲食改變、勞動劇減和 精神壓力增加等現象,而這些現 象就是導致糖尿病和肥胖的主 大。

郭克倫教授一九七三年醫科 畢業,一九七九年以胰島素之結 構及功能關係的研究,取得倫敦 大學聖湯瑪士醫院醫學院醫學博 士學位。一九八一年,獲聘爲聖 湯瑪士醫院內科部講師,並於一



他於一九八五年加入本校任內科學系高級講師,先後於一九九一及九六年晉升爲教 授及講座教授。

他的主要研究範疇爲糖尿病及胰島素,最近的研究重點爲中國人的第二型糖尿病。

訊息工程學系黃寶財教授則在兩節座 談會上示範了電腦科技幾項最新用途,包 括由他設計的「香港學校網絡」。
