

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Poll Shows HK People Realistic About Financial Future

Hong Kong citizens hold a realistic view of Hong Kong's economic prospect, believing that Hong Kong will continue to be buffeted by the financial crisis for an extended period and that it will take a fairly long time for the economy to recover, according to a telephone survey conducted by the Hong Kong Institute of Asia-Pacific Studies.

In the survey, the third public opinion survey conducted in connection with issues to be discussed at the public policy forum series jointly organized by the Faculty of Social Science and the Hong Kong Institute of Asia-Pacific Studies, 993 Hong Kong citizens were interviewed about their views on the government policy of maintaining the peg one year into the Asian financial crisis. Most respondents believed that the Hong Kong dollar should not be devalued because it would exacerbate the current recession, and that the government should continue its policy of maintaining the 7.8 linked exchange rate.

At a press conference held on 21st August to announce the survey results, Prof. Liu Pak-wai, professor of economics,



said the government should ward off speculators by changing the rules under which stocks and futures are traded rather than intervening in the market. Increasing the margins, for example, would raise the costs of shorting the Hang Seng Index Futures to speculators and discourage them from entering the market, he said.

The findings of the survey, conducted on 11th and 12th August, were also discussed at the public policy forum on finance held at the Cho Yiu Conference Hall on 26th August. Entitled 'One Year into the Asian Financial Crisis: The Pros and Cons of Maintaining the Linked Exchange Rate', the function attracted close to 20

local academics, economists, and financial analysts from various sectors, who exchanged views on the recent economic plight of the HKSAR and the effectiveness of government policies in dealing with the situation.

The public policy forums series are held with an aim to foster a closer relationship between the government, academia, and the public. They are also intended to promote policy research among University teachers so that greater involvement of scholars in community affairs can be achieved. Three more forums on the themes of industry, environment, and education have been scheduled for the next three months.

Short Course in Outcomes and Effectiveness Research

Close to 80 health administrators, doctors, and allied professionals participated in the Short Course in Outcomes and Effectiveness Research organized by the University's Department of Community and Family Medicine and the School of Hygiene and Public Health of Johns Hopkins University from 10th to 12th July 1998 at the Wong Foo Yuan Building. Prof. Joseph Lee, dean of medicine, presided at the opening ceremony.



The course provided an introduction to the methods and issues involved in medical effectiveness and outcomes research, and identified, compared, and tested medical and health technologies and practices in the


broad clinical population. The course's teachers were Prof. Neil Powe, Ms. Nancy Fink, and Dr. Daumit Gail from Johns Hopkins University. Prof. Suzanne Ho of The Chinese University was the course coordinator.

Efforts to Preserve Sight

Eye Care Under Probe at International Symposium

Some 180 ophthalmologists from all over the world participated in an international symposium entitled 'The Challenges of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences in the Next Millennium' to discuss recent eye care developments. The event which took place from 20th to 23rd August 1998 at the Hotel Furama Kempinski was organized by the Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences.

World leading experts in the field of glaucoma, a disease recognized as the number one cause of blindness in Hong Kong, presented their views on the next generation of therapeutic strategies for glaucoma while others discussed the role of neuroprotection and gene therapy for the treatment of the disease. The symposium also featured talks on new treatments for diabetic retinopathy, and laser therapy for age-related macular degeneration and myopic degeneration, two major causes of blindness in Hong Kong. New diagnostic techniques and treatment for common retinal diseases were also discussed, including the use of Multifocal ERG to detect retinal diseases at their early stage.

Severe Shortsightedness a Threat to Sight, Study Finds

Prior to the symposium, the Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences also organized an eye screening service for individuals suffering from severe shortsightedness, i.e., 600 degrees or above. Project leader Prof. Dennis Lam pointed out that persons with severe myopia are known to have higher risks of retinal breaks, retinal detachment, open angle glaucoma, and cataract, but little is known about how many of these sight threatening conditions exist undetected. Of the 383 eyes with a mean shortsightedness of 1,000 degrees screened in the project, retinal breaks were detected in close to eight per cent, and retinal detachment was detected in one eye. But most alarmingly, only half of the patients with problems showed symptoms of the problems.

Retinal breaks can be treated easily and successfully with laser therapy. Without timely treatment, however, retinal breaks and retinal detachment may lead to blindness.

Exchange with a Technological Theme

A student exchange programme entitled 'Technology and Social Development' was organized by Chung Chi College and Xian Jiaotong University from 24th August to 2nd September on the Chung Chi campus. The programme focussed on the benefits of technological advancement on society and the application of science and technology in the modern world.



Ten Xian Jiaotong University students and 16 Chung Chi College students conducted joint research on selected topics related to the theme during the programme and shared their findings at a seminar held on 31st August. To understand how advanced technology is applied in transportation, the mass media, education, crime fighting, and communication, they paid visits to the Mass Transit Railway Corporation, the South China Morning Post, the Hong Kong Police Force, and were introduced to the Wireless Campus Project at the University's Ho Sin-Hang Engineering Building.

Orientation for New Teaching Staff

Thirty-three new faculty members attended a one-and-a-half-day orientation programme organized by the Teaching Development Unit (TDU) on 27th and 28th August 1998. The purpose of the programme was to prepare new teaching staff for the tasks ahead and to familiarize them with the University and its services.

The event started with welcoming speeches by Prof. Leslie N.K. Lo, head of the TDU, and Prof. Kenneth Young, pro-vice-chancellor. In the experience sharing session, the TDU invited Profs. Leung Kwok (Psychology), Kevin Au (International Business), Robert Cocks (Accident and Emergency Medicine Academic Unit), Andrew Li (Architecture), Wong Po Choi (Information Engineering), and Jimmy Yu (Chemistry), representing the spectrum of faculties, to speak to the newcomers on teaching. This was followed by questions from the participants.



In the afternoon, the newcomers were assigned to four groups for discussion with experienced staff on teaching methods. The four facilitators were Prof. Freeman Chan (Architecture), Prof. Chua Bee Leng (Management), Ms. Kimberly McGrath (English Language Teaching Unit), and Mr. Paul Sze (Curriculum and Instruction).

On the second day the new staff were introduced to the library, and computer and personnel services of the University by representatives from the respective offices.

Orientation Camp for Medically Inclined Sixth-formers

The Faculty of Medicine organized the first Orientation Camp for Sixth Formers to provide thorough information on the Faculty and its MB ChB programme to students with the interest and potential in pursuing a career in medicine.

Close to 80 sixth-formers recommended by their principals attended the



camp which was held on 4th and 5th August. Accompanied by medical students of the University, they visited pre-clinical departments, the Prince of Wales Hospital, and tried their hand at simple experiments. The highlight of the tour was the visit to the operating theatre where the sixth-formers, each donning an operating gown, observed the work of surgeons in one of the busiest operating theatres in Hong Kong.

In the evening a gathering was organized by the medical students, wherein alumni of the faculty were invited to share their experiences with the sixth formers.

Summer of Language-learning and Culture

Over 100 students from Chung Chi College participated in the college's Summer Study Abroad Programme, one of the many highlights of its Language Enhancement Programme. This year, the students were given the opportunity to brush up their English or Putonghua at the University of Washington, the University of Waterloo, or Beijing Normal University. Another group of students were arranged to take up English language courses at the Oxford English Centre in England.

Besides regular classes, excursions, sightseeing tours and social gatherings were organized to give the students a better understanding of the local culture and enhance their oral proficiency through interactions with local people. The participants found the experience extremely rewarding and precious.

The Summer Study Abroad Programme was first launched in the summer of 1996.

New Dean, New Visions

Prof. Kwok Siu-tong graduated with a BA in history from The Chinese University in 1972, and obtained his MA and Ph.D. in history from the University of California at Berkeley in 1974 and 1981 respectively. He joined the University as assistant lecturer in history in 1977, was promoted to lecturer rank in 1981, and senior lecturer (professor) rank in 1992.

Prof. Kwok was dean of students of Chung Chi College in 1992-93, and has been University Dean of Students since August 1996. In June 1998, he was elected Dean of Arts to serve a term of three years from 1st August 1998.

Prof. S.T. Kwok Outlines Plans for the Faculty of Arts

From the economic takeoff in the 70s to the Sino-British talks in the 80s, from the beginning of the transitional period to the opening of the Chek Lap Kok airport, Hong Kong has undergone multitudinous changes. As a faculty that traditionally emphasizes synchronization with the times, how should the Faculty of Arts respond to changes and the approaching millennium? Prof. Kwok Siu-tong,

Time Opportunity for Overall Review

Prof. Kwok will begin his new appointment by carrying a detailed review of the faculty with the help of the three sub-deans, posts he newly created, who are respectively responsible for teaching development, research development, and cultural and educational development. Each department in the faculty will do an internal review of its curriculum, teaching methodology, and research activities to find out, in particular, if they are congruous with the times. Prof. Kwok explained, 'In the past 10 to 20 years, for example, increasing emphasis has been placed on inter-disciplinary teaching and research. Yet is there enough inter-disciplinary or interdepartmental cooperation? Are we only keeping up with the times or leading? Is the knowledge we disseminate at the foremost of the times?'

Prof. Kwok pointed out that other than conducting reviews, the departments will organize new academic programmes, embark on new ventures to improve teaching quality, and explore new directions for development. Teaching exchange with leading universities in the world, which Prof. Kwok described as lagging behind that of research, will be a major focus of development. To make the most of such activities, especially those related to mainland Chinese institutions, he suggests putting on a CD-Rom all data concerning the development of arts subjects in all universities on the mainland, so that one can tell at a glance what kind of exchange and involving which institutions would be most beneficial to all concerned.

Teaching Evaluation

Teaching evaluation is another area at issue. Prof. Kwok has observed from speaking to teaching staff at the Faculty of Arts that many have reservations about the current evaluation exercise. An ideal evaluation should take into account the unique characteristics of the faculty as well as those of the individual departments and programmes. 'The University and the University Grants Committee should perhaps give greater consideration to the individual attributes of the departments and faculties when designing teaching evaluations. We may discuss this

with other faculties of arts at other universities as this is a common issue,' he remarked.

Uniqueness of Research in the Arts

Research in the arts disciplines traditionally tends to be an individualized effort, emphasizing the individual scholar's profound and thorough understanding of a topic. It is substantially different from group research, which involves the expression of many different viewpoints on a broad topic and is more prevalent in the medical, engineering, and science disciplines. As it tends to be more extensive in scale and scope than individual research, group research is generally given more favourable consideration by the Research Grants Council (RGC) when vetting earmarked grant applications. The very nature of research in the arts disciplines sets them at a disadvantage in the competition for financial support for research.

Prof. Kwok pointed out that for medium-to small-sized departments such as the Departments of History, Japanese Studies, or Fine Arts, developing a large research proposal involving the entire department is neither easy nor practical unless the research interests of all teaching staff coincide. However, the department may then suffer from another setback—a lack of diversity. 'It is unreasonable to expect the departments to demonstrate both harmony and diversity in terms of research interests. A characteristic of the Department of History, for instance, is its comprehensiveness—there are staff doing research on different eras and areas. Group research would necessitate a narrowing down of their respective topics which would subsequently limit the research development of the department,' Prof. Kwok explained. A related issue is having enough appropriate local reviewers. Given the diversity of the fields of specialization, researchers with similar interests may become competitors, and hence, may adversely affect reviews.

Another problem for the faculty is the RGC's requirement that research be 'relevant' to the demands of society. The good thing about being 'relevant' is, amongst other things, that immediate contribution to society is greater. Yet, Prof. Kwok believes what the faculty or this university is dealing with is the world and questions of human existence which

may not directly have much to do with the practical needs of a particular society. 'A research project at the Department of Philosophy or the Department of Fine Arts, for example, may not have any direct bearings on the demands of the times,' he said. 'The kind of intellectual reflection involved may be of a higher level than what one would expect of mundane living. Yet how is this going to help a project in the competition for research funding?'

The sub-dean of research development is to work closely with the Arts and Languages Panel of the University's Research Committee and the Research Institute for the Humanities to coordinate research efforts within the faculty and to encourage interdisciplinary research in particular. Prof. Kwok hopes that in this way, staff will find new directions for development and intellectual reflections of a more interdisciplinary nature will take place. 'On the one hand, we hope to maintain the uniqueness of the faculty, and on the other hand, we have to heed the government's requirement,' Prof. Kwok concluded.

Uniqueness of Publishing Activities

'Publish or perish' may be a platitude for academics, yet being able to produce a required quantity of publications remains a painful reality for many trying to survive in academia. Academic contribution is increasingly measured through quantification, a Western approach widely adopted in medicine, engineering, and to some extent, social science, by governments and universities. For the arts disciplines which focus on the publishing of books rather than articles, and on individual rather than joint effort, this can pose a problem. While stressing that the quantification of contribution is 'not completely inappropriate', Prof. Kwok pointed out that writing a book may take much longer than a journal article. 'A famous academic may only be able to complete one or two books of importance in an entire lifetime. An experienced staff may take about five years to write a book, and is able to maintain the uniqueness of his/her research while satisfying requirements for quantity. But staff with fewer years behind them may have a hard time,' he said. Creativity is also an important element in the arts. And one cannot expect novels to be written at the same rate as medical papers. Prof. Kwok calls for

more flexibility and diversity, more attention to quality and not only quantity in setting academic requirements.

Another standard he wishes to question is the use of English in publishing. 'As The Chinese University, we have a cultural mission towards Hong Kong and China, and as such, we should write in Chinese,' said Prof. Kwok who prefers to have works translated from Chinese for the international market. He admitted that works written in Chinese may have problems becoming international, yet becoming international should not be the University's primary aim. 'If going international was our primary aim, we should teach and publish purely in English. We shouldn't even be bilingual. What is special about Hong Kong and this university is they are multicultural and bilingual, but with roots in Chinese culture.'

The faculty will meet with other faculties of arts in Hong Kong to discuss how articles and books should be published and evaluated, how creative endeavours in music, art, literature, philosophy, and religion should be compared and evaluated, and how to handle works that fall between creation and research, between being cultural and academic.

Culture and Education

The sub-dean for cultural and educational development will be responsible for promoting culture in educational activities among secondary schools and youth in general. 'We as academics at this university should not hide in an ivory tower. An important mission in the founding of the University is to contribute towards the society we live in. There are 10 departments at the Faculty of Arts, each of which is capable of influencing culture and society in its own way. There's a lot we can offer. We have to decide how,' said Prof. Kwok.

Budget Cuts

Would the carrying out of these basic issues of repositioning be affected by tightening resources? Prof. Kwok said an ideal underlying the founding of the University back in 1963 was its cultural mission towards China which it should carry out through the development and dissemination of Chinese culture and Chinese-Western cultural exchange. The University was created to be one with a world vision and Chinese characteristics. This founding ideal, Prof. Kwok pointed out, is closely related to the mission of the Faculty of Arts. 'The arts and humanities are about the study of people and the value of people. Resources are important for our development but it is not the most important consideration. People's ideals, their sense of mission, responsibility, and belonging, and their identification with the times, society, and this university, are more important.' □

古文獻資料庫中心網頁成立

Integrated Database of Ancient Chinese Texts on the Internet

中國文化研究所古文獻資料庫中心網頁已於一九九八年六月廿八日成立，首批上網的是魏晉南北朝傳世文獻資料庫子部釋家類文獻，約共四百四十萬字。

古文獻資料庫研究計劃始於一九八八年，由中國文化研究所陳方正所長及劉殿爵教授倡議，目的為建立中國古代文獻電腦資料庫。在過去十年，先後得到香港研究資助局及台灣蔣經國學術交流基金會資助，建立了先秦兩漢至魏晉南北朝一切傳世文獻資料庫，共三千餘萬字，並於一九九四年將計劃擴展至建立出土文獻資料庫，包括甲骨文、竹簡帛書及金文。資料庫有以下特色：

- (一) 由專人比勘各種版本，加上注文及校勘記。
- (二) 所有異文及校改均用特定符號標示及詳列出來，俾便讀者查對。
- (三) 提供自行設計之中文造字庫，可同時顯示多種古文字，包括甲骨、金文及篆書等。
- (四) 提供單字及句式檢索，可選擇一種或多種文獻作檢索對象。

資料庫會以書刊、電子媒體及互聯網這三種媒介出版，迄今已出版超過五十一種逐字索引叢刊及廿六種磁碟/光碟；而資料庫亦會陸續分期上網，進度如下：

- (一) 先秦兩漢至魏晉南北朝一切傳世文獻，共九百種，約三千二百萬字，將於一九九九年分期上網。
- (二) 竹簡帛書(約一百二十萬字)及甲骨卜辭(約一百萬字)將於二零零零年分期上網。
- (三) 金文資料庫(約二十萬字)將於二零零零年建立，預計可於二零零三年上網。

From the Institute of Chinese Studies:

The CHANT (CHinese ANCient Texts) Database, compiled by the Institute of Chinese Studies, has been available on the Internet since 28th June 1998. In the first phase, 38 Buddhist texts of the period 221-589 AD, totalling 4.4 million characters, can be viewed and searched on the Internet free of charge.

The CHANT Database project was started in 1988 as an effort to build a comprehensive electronic database of the entire corpus of ancient Chinese texts. To date, a 33-million-character database of the pre-589 AD traditional texts has been compiled and another of all excavated texts including *jiaguwen* (甲骨文), *jianbo* (簡帛), and *jinwen* (金文), is in the process of being built.

All texts in the CHANT Database were emended and edited by experts, with detailed and complete notes provided for all emendations. The database uses carefully studied character sets and allows character-string and sentence-pattern Boolean search on all texts or any combination thereof.

The database is also released on CD-Rom/floppy disc and in a hardcopy concordance series. To date, 51 volumes of one-word concordance are in print, out of which 26 titles are available on CD-Rom/floppy. The World Wide Web version of the database will be released in the following stages:

- 900 titles of traditional texts from antiquity up to 589 AD, about 32 million characters in total, to be released by phases in 1999;
- 9 titles of texts on bamboo/silk, 1.2 million characters, and the complete Shang oracular bone inscriptions, 1 million characters, to be released by phases in 2000;
- Zhou bronze inscriptions totalling 0.2 million characters to be integrated into the CHANT database and released by the early 2000s.

Blood tests for markers of the Hepatitis A and B virus will be available to all staff, their dependants, and students at a privileged price of \$100 each on 8th and 9th October. Those in need of immunization may be vaccinated at cost in the Health Centre on 15th and 16th October at \$200 per dose for Hepatitis A and \$100 per dose for Hepatitis B, both requiring three doses.

校園泊車新措施

校方決定由一九九八年九月二十日起施行新的泊車制度，以加強管制進入校園的車輛，既配合保安需要，也可緩和校園車位需求日增的壓力。

甲. 教職員泊車證

- (一) 大學教職員(或其配偶)持有有效駕駛執照及名下擁有車輛者，皆可申請乙枚免費泊車證。
- (二) 符合上述條件之教職員而為校園住戶者，每戶得申請至多兩枚免費泊車證，額外之泊車證均須繳費，每枚每六個月一千二百元。
- (三) 符合第一項條件而非校園住戶者，祇可申請乙枚免費泊車證。基於會計及核數需要，每枚泊車證祇限乙輛汽車使用。
- (四) 教職員需要經常使用他人車輛進出校園者，可申請乙枚泊車證，惟須繳費一千二百元，有效期為六個月。
- (五) 持有教職員泊車證之車輛可以使用室內及專用停車場，預留之特定泊車位除外。停泊室內及專用停車場之車輛必須於每日凌晨三時前駛離。同人若需留校辦公，車輛不能依時駛離，請事先知會保安組(內線七九九九或傳真二六零三五零九五)。

乙. 學生泊車證

- (六) 校方有小量免費泊車證供有特殊需要之全日制本科生申請，申請人須先得書院輔導主任批准。除宿生外，持有此類泊車證者，不准把車輛逾夜停泊在校園。
- (七) 研究生／研究助理或兼讀學生持有有效駕駛執照及名下擁有車輛者，可申請下列其中一種收費泊車證：
 - 祇限於日間(上午七時至子夜)泊車者：一千元(有效期六個月)
 - 祇限於晚間(下午五時至子夜)泊車者：四百元(有效期六個月)
 - 二百五十元(有效期三個月)
- (八) 持有任何類別之學生泊車證者，若於有效期以外在校園停泊車輛，須依下述第(十三)條繳付泊車費。

丙. 認許之供應商／承辦商泊車證

- (九) 大學認許之供應商／承辦商需經常進出校園者，可申領收費泊車證，在上午七時至子夜在校園停泊車輛。
- (十) 申請人須持有有效駕駛執照及名下擁有車輛(或已獲登記車主授權)。
- (十一) 此類泊車證每六個月有效期之收費為一千二百元。

丁. 校園訪客泊車收費

- (十二) 駕駛沒有大學泊車證車輛進校的人士，須按下列制度繳交校園泊車費用：
 - (a) 上述駕駛人士經由校園閘口進校時，將獲發給一張泊車票。
 - (b) 駕駛者須在離校之前，先往大學正門或崇基學院閘口繳費處支付泊車費用。
- (十三) 校園泊車收費為：
 - 首三十分鐘：免費
 - 隨後之每三十分鐘(不足者也作三十分鐘計算)：十元

戊. 部門／單位認可訪客免費泊車

- (十四) 部門／單位主管可簽發認可證予公務訪客／駕駛人士，使該等訪客得以免費泊車。各部門／單位索取認可證，請事先填妥申領表格並交回保安組。
- (十五) 部門／單位主管須妥為保管未經使用之認可證，及確保認可證只可發給持有泊車票之公務訪客。

己. 校園住戶認可訪客免費泊車

- (十六) 在校園住宿之教職員亦可簽發認可證予賓客，在其宿舍範圍免費泊車。住戶索取認可證，請事先填妥申領表格並交回保安組。

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新任系主任

本學年有十多位教師首次獲委任為系主任，本刊訪問了他們，請他們談談各自的抱負。本期刊登五位系主任的訪問，其餘的會在本刊中、英文版陸續刊載，敬請垂注。

新聞與傳播學系 李少南教授



新聞與傳播學系系主任李少南教授表示，他會主力推動學系的學術發展，而具體事務泰半將交由各個專責委員會處理。他又會透過會議和私下交誼與同事溝通，讓他們了解學系的政策和發展方向，提供意見和給予支持，從而提高他們對系務的參與感。

李教授是中大校友，一九八六年加入母校服務。他說，雖然近年本地其他院校紛紛開設或擴大相類課程，競爭加劇了，但該系的收生情況依然理想，他可把精力都放在加強課程內容和提高課程質素上，以維持學系的吸引力。

李教授表示，該系是全港大專院校中最早開辦新聞學位課程的，至今已三十四年。學系教師的傳播理論研究很出色。本科課程的四大專業範疇之中，「新聞」和「傳播研究」發展完備，而「廣播」和「廣告」則會再進一步加強。該系於九十年代初開始逐步改善錄影廠的設施，又增聘了具廣播經驗和研究能力的教師，但要提供更優越的「廣播」學習條件，仍須不斷更新設施。至於廣告專業範疇方面，現已有兩名全職教師任教，可望加強廣告及公共關係課程的內容。他的目標是使四個範疇平均發展。

另外，新聞與傳播學系開始發展多媒體應用的課程，讓學生掌握最新的傳播工具。近年該系開設的多媒體科目大受歡迎，但因電腦設施有限，向隅學生不少。李教授說，前系主任陳文教授已因應政府削減撥款的行動，預留了款項應付學系未來一年的開支。學系在營運資金方面問題不大，但要擴展（尤其多媒體課程），便須更多支持。他們發展多媒體課程的決心很大，儘管額外資源仍未落實，但已重新安排教師的講課，讓系內的多媒體教師可專心於這方面的教學和課程策劃。

該系的研究院課程以傳播學為重點，新的發展集中於傳播學社會科學碩士學位課程。李教授今年的另一項重要工作，就是檢討和修訂該課程的內容。該修課式課程原為在職傳播人員，尤其是新聞從業員而設。開設兩年以來，系方發覺課程吸引了很多在職的公關及行政人員進修，且以兼讀為主，故計劃增加一些與學員工作有直接關係的科目，並考慮安排更合適的上課時間表。

哲學系 關子尹教授



「哲學系未來的一條可行道路，是在繼續致力中國哲學研討之餘，充分利用香港的優越地理位置和資訊發達的條件，積極推動學術交流和中西哲學思想比較研究，以期成為一個中西兼重、傳統與現代思想並收的教研中心。」哲學系新任系主任關子尹教授解釋說，該系由唐君毅、牟宗三和勞思光等先生建立在前，復由劉述先先生等經營在後，向為中國哲學思想研究的重鎮。隨著前輩學者相繼離任，哲學系要勉強繼持過往的形象，以目前的條件而言，是有一點脫離現實的。

關教授在中大哲學系畢業後，負笈德國，曾在台灣講學，八六年初返中大哲學系執教至今，近年更致力開發電腦在哲學和其他人文科學研究的應用。談到課程結構，關教授說：「事實上，本系過去十年都不斷在改進本科課程，以適應蛻變中的學制，如開設特別專題項目，讓老師能較自由地擬定授課內容。這是本系課程的一大特色，海內外鮮見。」

該系研究學部提供碩士及博士課程。後者本以中國哲學為主，但近年亦已修訂至可容納西方哲學和比較哲學。研究學部學生以香港的為主，其他的來自美國、加拿大、北京、台灣等地，由於他們的教育背景和學習經驗都不同，可收互相衝擊，取長補短之效。

關子尹教授透露，過去兩年，該系只按聯招結果收生，但由今年起恢復面見本科新生的制度，結合他們在面試和公開試的表現，才決定收錄與否。「由於中學課程甚少涉及哲學範疇，小部分預科生未充分了解哲學的內容而選讀，興趣不在，讀得辛苦，教師也不好過。因此，以面試來選拔學生，對哲學系而言，還是有意義的。」

關教授表示，該系會積極重新設計學系的網頁，為學員和外界提供多一個渠道，以了解該系的特色。

對於政府削減大學經費，關教授認為香港的專上教育會受到影響，各院校各學系都受波及，可幸該系參與開辦較多通識教育課程，獲得的經費也較多，所以面對的困難相對而言並不太大。反倒是校方將學系一成經費跟研究成果和校外研究資助金額掛鉤，促使該系嘗試開發新的研究模式，包括成立研究小組，應用電腦、資訊工程技術，以及互聯網推動研究。關教授已與系內同人合擬了研究計劃書，向研究資助局申請撥款。

他重申：「文科研究一向是以『讀書—思索—撰述』為主，我們都認同和尊重這個基本模式，認為這是人文研究的本位。新的訊息技術無疑為研究帶來許多便利和突破，但就其本身而言，只是一種手段。相比之下，舊有的研究模式仍然是不可取代的。」

關教授說，該系一直很著重舉辦研討會，探討並回應各種為世所關注的哲學問題，如多年前的「和諧與鬥爭」和「人禽之辨比較哲學」研討會，「分析哲學與科學哲學」和「分析哲學與語言哲學」國際會議等。該系近年亦曾舉辦大型的國際現象學會議，討論文化交互性與生活等問題。而該系今年、明年，和後年都會繼續舉辦研討會。

財務學系 蔣炤坪教授

「作為一個服務單位，人力資源的提升極為重要，故此，輔助教職員讓他們可以盡量發揮潛能，創造最高的生產力，是財務學系的首要任務。」蔣炤坪教授說，「而在釐定發展目標時，我們是由學系執行委員會提出初步建議，經全體同人商議修訂後，始行作實。」

蔣教授強調，財務學是實用課程，必須緊貼市場需要，並考慮中、長期的發展目標。他說：「能洞悉先機才可以提供領先的教研服務。」

蔣教授計劃在課程中增加更多有關集資、融資、中國金融，和中國財務的科目，而研究重點則是香港日後的金融地位，以及它與內地和外國的金融關係。「這是因為香港與內地的業務關係愈來愈密切，而內地又正在大力推行企業改革，相信香港將是內地企業集資及融資的首選地點。即使是現在，本地股票市場的H股及紅籌股也相當受人重視。」蔣教授說。

除正規課程外，他計劃為內地及本地機構舉辦專業培訓課程。「我們剛於六月底為中國信息產業部舉辦了融資培訓課程。」蔣教授說：「此等課程是內地、香港及外地之間的橋樑，既有助我們認識內地金融財經情況，進行深入的研究，亦可藉此向外國機構推介內地的企業和在內地投資的利弊。」

過去曾有僱主反映，該系畢業生的學術成績與才能雖然不俗，但待人處事卻欠成熟。為此，蔣教授亦計劃每兩星期舉辦一次座談會，邀請業界人士及學者向學生講述金融界的熱門話題及市場動向，讓他們了解日後就業時須面對的問題，及早作好準備。他又會進一步加強師生交流，以便了解學生的需要。

蔣教授感謝前任系主任史怡中教授為該系招聘了出色的教研人員，並為學系奠定了良好的基礎。他接任後

的首要工作是激勵團隊精神，盡量為同事提供支援，減省不必要的行政工作，以充分發揮各人所長，增加研究數量，提升教研質素。

蔣教授預期，削減預算對該系的教研工作「肯定有影響」，雖然暫時未知影響有多深遠，但他已擬好應變辦法，「增加行政措施的靈活性，如聘請短期和兼任教師，聘用研究助理兼任教學助理，以及更有效地利用電腦來處理教研和行政工作。」

生物化學系 何國強教授

何國強教授認為，香港現有八所大學，彼此需要競爭以吸引資優學生，是以訂定長遠及有效益的發展策略，是大勢所趨。



就生物化學系來說，為了改善教學質素，曾向畢業生進行問卷調查，又諮詢他們的未來僱主如中學校長及有關商業機構，以了解市場對畢業生的要求，從而釐訂學系的發展策略並修改部分課程內容。

根據問卷調查所得，近年畢業生多投身社會，而不像過往般以繼續升學為主。不少畢業生都建議增設實習科目，以便早些取得實踐經驗並了解就業市場的情況，而僱主亦有相同的意見，所以何教授計劃盡快開設這類科目。

何教授表示，生化系最近一次徹底檢討課程內容，是在十年前。自九四年起，該系與生物系及化學系合辦環境科學和食品及營養科學兩項學士學位課程，今年又協辦分子生物技術學課程，為免課程內容重覆，並適應社會近年的轉變，有必要再來一次大規模的檢討。

他又說，科技發展急速，生物化學涵蓋範圍又廣，故該系會發展一些重點科目，例如生物技術。「生物技術實用性高，發展潛力大，而且內地的農業、畜牧業、醫學等發展為生物技術研究提供了龐大的市場。」

何教授指出，該系教師共二十多人，分屬醫學院和理學院，且辦公室又分設於馬臨樓、李卓敏基本醫學大樓三樓和五樓，以及將來的蒙民偉樓，管理不便。他打算下放權力，邀請同事協助處理系務，以能更充分及有效利用人力資源，並會盡量採用電腦傳遞訊息。

他說：「在資源緊縮而教師人數又不能減少的情況下，系內研究經費必然收緊，而教師則必須更加主動向外爭取研究經費。」

翻譯系 陳善偉教授

陳善偉教授認為政府削減對大學的撥款對於翻譯系的發展有很大影響，系方必須在保持教研質素的情況下，緊縮開支，更有效地運用資源。



陳教授計劃在學系原有的紮實基礎上，進一步提升教研水準。課程方面，除繼續提供漢英對譯科目之外，亦考慮增設其他外語與漢語對譯的科目（例如法漢翻譯）及實用翻譯科目（例如電腦翻譯）。「為了使課程更適應社會需要，系方可能會成立課程委員會，定期檢討課程內容。」他說。

陳教授亦希望在學生就業方面多作努力，例如設立學系就業輔導委員會，聯絡僱主，了解他們對翻譯人才的要求，並安排就業講座，增加學生對翻譯行業的認識。

除定期出版學術刊物《翻譯學報》外，翻譯系亦已決定從九月起，每季出版《中大譯訊》，報導系務發展、學生活動及研究工作等，以加強系方與學生（特別是兼讀碩士生）及外界的溝通。

至於學術活動方面，陳教授希望同事除了進行文學翻譯研究的工作外，亦考慮開展實用翻譯的研究。系方亦會舉辦學術研討會，讓同事交流研究資訊及心得，又設立訪問學人講座，以廣師生視野。

堅守聯繫匯率

社會科學院與香港亞太研究所上月的民意調查顯示，七成半市民贊成維持聯繫匯率，並恐怕一旦改變，香港的經濟情況會更差。

該項調查為社會科學院和香港亞太研究所合辦的「公共政策論壇系列」研究之一，由廖柏偉教授主持，亞太研究所電話調查研究計劃執行，於八月十一及十二日晚上六至十時進行，成功訪問了九百九十三名成年市民。受訪者男女比例為五十五對四十五，六成一年齡介乎廿一至四十歲，約四分一學歷達大專。

廖教授指出，經過去年亞洲金融風暴的衝擊後，大部分市民對香港的經濟前景持現實看法，沒有初期般樂觀，並且不預期香港經濟會在短期內復蘇，又認為外國炒家仍對港元虎視眈眈。

調查結果顯示，三成半受訪者認為金融風暴仍會持續一年以上，七成估計香港經濟需要一年以上才能復蘇。市民又支持政府穩定港元幣值的做法，認為港元一旦貶值，對香港經濟、失業率、股市、樓市和銀行體系帶來嚴重影響。

廖教授說，可能市民目睹東南亞各國在金融風暴的經驗，知道貨幣大幅貶值的後果，所以支持政府力保聯繫匯率。

率。在香港現處的困境中，資產價格大幅度下調，利率波動，聯繫匯率成為唯一穩定的因素，也是支撐港人對香港經濟信心的重要基石。雖然港府為堅守聯匯付出很大代價，但這個調查結果對港府來說，是值得安慰的。

但市民對金融管理局處理金融問題的表現只給予四十九分(滿分一百，及格五十)，反映市民因樓市和股市大跌，經濟受損，將不滿情緒轉移到金管局身上。

題為「亞洲金融危機一周年：堅守聯繫匯率的利弊」公共政策論壇，於上月廿六日在行政樓祖堯堂舉行，由廖教授任召集人，出席之本地專家學者近二十人。

社會科學院與香港亞太研究所合辦公共政策論壇，目的是探討各項與社會民生福利有關的政策。整個論壇系列由社會學系劉兆佳教授策劃，而出席論壇的主講者與嘉賓包括政府高級官員、政策研究專家、學者及有關人士。

十名西安交大學生與十六名崇基學生一起研究科技進步對社會發展的影響，並於八月卅一日舉行研討會，與其他同學分享研究成果。學生又獲安排參觀及訪問本地一些大型機構和資訊科技拓展計劃，如地下鐵路有限公司、南華早報企業集團、香港警察科學鑑證科、香港中文大學無線校園計劃等，讓學生認識到高科技在交通、傳媒、教育、醫療及資訊發展上的創新應用。


