# New Institute to Examine Development of Shanghai and Hong Kong

The Shanghai-Hong Kong Development Institute was established jointly by Fudan University in Shanghai and The Chinese University in January 2001. Physically based in Shanghai, the institute aspires to elucidate social needs in the two cities and make concrete policy proposals to the local governments and enterprises through strategic research, to promote innovative research and train research personnel in the two universities, and to develop into a think-tank organization which can contribute to the prosperity of the two places.

Capitalizing on the academic and research strengths of the two cities, the institute will examine crucial issues on the future development of Hong Kong and Shanghai, including China's pending entry into the World Trade Organization, the development of the western provinces in mainland China, and other educational and cultural issues. The institute will make policy suggestions based on its research findings.

The institute was inaugurated in Shanghai on 20th January, with Prof. Arthur K.C. Li, vice-chancellor of CUHK, and Prof. Wang Sheng-hong, president of Fudan University, officiating at the opening ceremony. Well-known industrialists and community leaders from Hong Kong and Shanghai were invited to join the management committee of the institute while the academic committee consists of senior academics with ample expertise in a wide range of areas, including economics and management, risk management, regional development, law and politics, culture and education. Prof. Yeung Yue-man is a co-director of the institute.

# **Exchange on Corporate Governance and Disclosure**

A symposium entitled 'Corporate Governance and Disclosure: Enhancing the Competitiveness of Hong Kong' was organized by the Master of Accountancy Programme of the School of Accountancy on 22nd and 23rd February 2001 at the New World Renaissance Hotel.

Sixteen speakers were featured in four sessions: disclosure, transparency, and development of markets; role of directors; empowerment of shareholders; and the securities and futures bill 2000. The panel of distinguished speakers included Mr. Andrew Sheng, chairman of the Securities and Futures Commission, Mr. Anthony Neoh, senior adviser of the China Securities Regulatory Commission, Mr. David Carse, deputy chief executive of the Hong Kong Monetary Authority, and Mr. Andy Lee, president of the Hong Kong Society of Accountants.

# Lecture Series on Chinese Civilization and World Religions

A series of academic lectures on religion are being organized by the Centre for the Study of Religion and the Chinese Society at Chung Chi College from 19th February to 30th March 2001 in celebration of the college's 50th anniversary. Renowned scholars from mainland China, Taiwan, and the US are speaking on the relationship between Chinese civilization and religions, including Buddhism, Taoism, Confucianism, Islam, Christianity, and Catholicism.

Mr. George H.C. Hung, chairman of the Chung Chi College Board of Trustees, and Prof. Rance P.L. Lee, head of the college, officiated at the opening ceremony held on 19th February at the Li Koon Chun Hall. Mr. Ye Xiaowen, director of the State Bureau of Religious Affairs, delivered the keynote speech entitled 'The Development of Chinese Religions in the Past 100 Years in China'.

# Pivotal Success in NPC Treatment

The Clinical Trials Unit of the Department of Clinical Oncology has recently introduced a new combined treatment for nasopharyngeal carcinoma (NPC) to replace the mainstay treatment, radiotherapy. The new treatment is proven to greatly enhance the survival rates of patients diagnosed with advanced NPC.


The unit conducted a randomized trial for 350 patients between 1994 and 1999 to compare the treatment outcomes of combined chemotherapy and standard radiotherapy to that of radiotherapy alone in advanced NPC at the Prince of Wales Hospital and Queen Elizabeth Hospital. The study demonstrated that the new combined treatment is well tolerated by the patients and there is a reduction in the development of metastases, resulting in an improved survival rate. Researchers are now examining the use of additional chemotherapy administration before the combined treatment to achieve even better results.

# Surgeons All Over Asia Gather to Tackle Hepato-Biliary-Pancreatic Diseases



O ver 400 surgeons from across Asia gathered in Hong Kong to attend the Sixth Congress of the Asian Society of Hepato-Biliary-Pancreatic Surgery (ASHBPS) held from 6th to 9th February at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre. This biennial congress of ASHBPS was hosted jointly by the Department of Surgery and ASHBPS. The aim of the congress was to foster experience exchange for a better understanding of the causes and treatment methods for disorders of the liver, pancreas, and biliary tree that are prevalent in Asia.

The congress featured five keynote lectures, eight symposium sessions, two panel discussions, eight how-I-do-it video sessions, and over 200 free paper presentations. Many speakers were top-notch surgeons from different parts of the world. The Honourable Mrs. Rita Fan (right 2), president of the Legislative Council, Prof. Arthur K.C. Li (right 1), vice-chancellor of the University, Dr. Tadahiro Takada (left 2), president of ASHBPS, and Prof. Joseph Lau (left 1), chairman of the Department of Surgery, officiated at the opening ceremony held on 6th February.



Eight New Asia students visited Yale University from 20th January to 2nd February under the New Asia-Yale University Student Exchange Programme. The theme for this year's exchange was 'Youth Culture'.


The students, led by Prof. Lynne Nakano of the Department of Japanese Studies, explored youth issues for two weeks in the US. They presented reports relating to the social life of Hong Kong youth, their dating habits and views on sex, the role of Japanese culture in Hong Kong, and Hong Kong's examination-oriented education system at a symposium held at Yale University. They also met different student groups and government officials, stayed with local families, visited a correctional centre for juvenile delinquents, and toured New York and Washington DC.

# Complete Face Lift and All-out Computerization



Very soon, getting sick may have its cheerful side, because it will mean a trip to the brand new University Health Centre.

From now until September, the centre will undergo major renovations. Everything from water pipes, partitioning, airconditioning, furniture, to the appointments and the calling systems will be new.

The new centre promises a far more modern and user-friendly experience. You will be welcomed by an airy cathedral ceiling right at the entrance. The waiting area will be more comfortable, and the furniture, more uplifting. You won't have to wait outside the consultation room, and there won't be nurses to shout out your name anymore. Everything will be shown on a display panel. The pilgrimage along the gloomy corridor to the consultation and physiotherapy rooms will be gone; the rooms will only be a few well-lit steps away. Visitors with physical handicap or leg injuries will have the option of taking the lift to the dental clinic or seminar room on the first floor.

According to Dr. Kenneth Pang, director of the University Health Service

(UHS), the University is allocating \$1.5 million to the UHS for the renovation project and the whole process is supervised by the Campus Development Office.

Alongside this project, the UHS will undergo computerization with the help of the Information Management Unit. Appointments, record-keeping, communication of prescription from doctor to dispensary, now done manually, will soon be only a few mouse-clicks and button-pushes away. The optical fibres will be laid during the renovation.

Dr. Pang hopes that by September, the first phase of computerization will be complete, and users will be able to make appointments online with the medical and dental clinics. There will be a consultation process wherein a group of students and staff members will be invited to try out the system and give feedback. There will also be a trial period of three months to detect and fix any bug that may arise. 'We hope to reassure members of the University community that we will pay close attention to how well the system is serving them every step of the way,' remarked Dr. Pang. The second phase of

computerization will be concerned mainly with the clinic's internal communication, and the third, with the paramedical units such as the laboratory and the physiotherapy unit.

All good things in life take time to materialize and classy new clinics are no exception. Between March and September, the UHS will be relocated to Residence 1, next to the Ho Sin-Hang Engineering Building. According to Dr. Pang, intensive moving and setting up will take place on 3rd and 4th March, and by 5th March, the UHS will begin operation in its interim premises. 'The venue will be narrower as it was not designed to be a clinic, so it'll take a bit of getting used to. We may not be able to catch up with our current workload in the first few days, and there will probably be fewer outpatient cases. But everything should be back to normal by mid-week,' explained Dr. Pang.

The same cannot be said of the dental clinic, however, because the seven dental chairs need to be dismantled, reinstalled, and rewired, which would take some time. Moving and reinstalling the dental

x-ray machine is also time-consuming as it involves the handling of radioactive material, for which a government license is required. But by the third week of March, the dental clinic, too, should be operating smoothly. 'Luckily for us, most dental cases are by appointment, so we shall entertain fewer of those. However, during the interim, we will still entertain emergencies, even at the expense of appointments made earlier,' Dr. Pang pointed out. So if you are plagued by soulwrenching toothaches or other serious oral problems, have no qualms about heading down to Residence 1.

The task of moving to Residence 1 and back, and the computerization project require the contribution by the UHS of over \$1.1 million from savings of its one-line budget.

When the UHS moves back to its renovated original home in September, the whole process repeats itself of course. If you get sick this September, or even if you don't, make a trip to the new University Health Centre. You will be greeted by the same old friendly faces in a fresh new environment. O Piera Chen

### 《安老與社會工作》

上一世紀醫藥技術進步,延長了人類的壽命,人口老化也 就成為很多先進國家急需解決的難題。老人在生理和精神衰退 時,需依賴親朋戚友的照顧與支持,以及社會人士的關心。香 港的安老服務在過去二十多年已有長足的發展,老人服務的開 支更佔社會福利開支預算的大部分,老年學也成為社會工作學 的重要領域。

此書有系統地探討香港安老服務與社會工作的關係。全書 分三部分:第一部分闡述老化的概念、長者的生理及心理狀 況;第二部分審視現時的老人服務、服務模式和發展趨勢;第 三部分介紹個案,以及小組和社區工作的概念與實務。

作者朱佩蘭曾任職於香港社會福利署,現任教於香港理工 大學應用社會科學系。她長期研究香港的安老服務,曾發表有 關的論文多篇,亦為「香港耆康老人福利會」永遠顧問。

### 《香港稅務:法例與實施說明2000-01》

中文大學出版社一九八一年出版由David Flux撰寫的Hong Kong Taxation: Law & Practice, 隨後每年根據政府新頒布的條例及條文修訂內容,深受歡迎,亦為本港大專院校的指定教科書。一九八九年起,該社更出版此書的中文版《香港稅務:法例與實施說明》,以方便中文讀者。

二零零零至二零零一年度修訂版繼續由David G. Smith執筆,謝孝衍譯,詳述香港現行的物業稅、薪俸稅、利得稅、印花稅及遺產稅等各類稅項的法例內容和計算方法,亦就報稅表及稅例方面的懲罰、評稅與納稅、反對與上訴等問題,作出詳盡的解說。書中又以大量的具體例子說明及解釋應繳稅款的計算方法,並且引用過往的稅務個案,包括本港及英聯邦國家的判例,使讀者更容易明白有關條例的實際運作;新版更特別分析了強制性公積金對稅務的影響。

### 《中國社會:從不變到巨變》(修訂版)

老與社會

劉創楚、楊慶堃合著的《中國社會:從不變到巨變》,初版 於八十年代末期出版,正值中國的政治經濟改革方興未艾之 時,「中國往何處去?」是當年學者關心的課題。中國往後經歷 的巨大變遷,正好證實了書中的分析。

劉創楚因應中國政治經濟急劇變遷引致的種種變革,最近 重新修訂該書內容,並進一步闡釋有關理論。

他在初版的基礎上,集中剖析中國改革的五大變遷:(一) 組織方面可以看到組織系統已經形成,傳統社會「兩頭重、中間 輕」(缺乏中間組織)的格局已經扭轉;(二)制度變革將朝向現代 化及理性化的方向發展;(三)農村社會的「非農化」發展是現代 化的出路;(四)城市化是中國改革最大的挑戰;(五)新的社會 階層正在形成。

劉創楚任教於本校社會學系,一直專注中國社會方面的研究。楊慶堃於一九九九年辭世,生前任教於匹茲堡大學,一九七四年獲本校頒授榮譽法學博士。

### 《管理資訊系統》

現代社會的工商機構為了提高競爭力和效率,都大量使用電腦系統——般稱之為資訊系統。資訊系統是企業管理、決策、系統理論、通訊科技、電腦軟件和硬件的綜合體。此書由香港管理專業發展中心編撰,以淺易簡潔的文筆,大量的圖表說明,詳細介紹資訊系統的架構和類別、電腦的基本知識及發展資訊系統的方法;內容涵蓋系統理論、決策過程、電腦硬件、電腦軟件、資料庫管理、電腦網絡、資訊系統的建立方法、資訊系統的品質控制和保密。

香港管理專業發展中心由職業訓練局於一九八四年成立, 目的是促進並提高香港的管理效能及水平,以迎合本港不斷轉 變的管理環境。

### 《課堂管理技巧》

部分中小學生無心上課之餘,更經常擾亂課堂的秩序。其實,課堂秩序的失控,學生、教師和學校三方面皆有責任。中文大學出版社為提供廣闊的研討角度,特別選譯了《課堂管理技巧》一書,加入外國教育學者的角度,剖析香港課堂秩序失控的成因和解決辦法。

此書由David Fontana著、李彥譯,內容分兩部分。第一部分是從心理學的角度,探討學生、教師及學校三者構成課堂秩序失控的成因,以及課堂秩序管理的問題。第二部分提出解決課堂秩序失控的方法,包括了行為塑造、認知心理和管理技巧等。書中理論鋪陳清晰,可供本地教師參考。

David Fontana是國際知名的作家和教育心理學家,曾任中小學教師、師範導師,現為英國威爾斯大學教育心理學顧問。

### China Review 2000

China Review 2000, the 10th volume in the series, is edited by Lau Chung-ming and Shen Jianfa. The year 1999 is the 50th anniversary of the People's Republic of China; it also marks the success of China's attempt to gain access to the World Trade Organization (WTO) after many rounds of negotiation with the United States. Economically, she has been able to come out of the Asian financial crisis of 1997-1998 seemingly unscathed. Internationally, she was finally paying more attention to her relations with the outside world. Domestically, China is still trying to restructure its economic and social institutions. There is a new president to deal with in Taiwan although developments in the two newly added Special Administrative Regions of Hong Kong and Macau are on the right track.

China Review 2000 analyses critical political, economic, social and urban, as well as business issues related to changes during the past year. It tries to articulate the trends of development opportunities in the new century and is a comprehensive annual publication on China written by authorities in the field.



To ensure the accuracy of staff data records as required under the Personal Data (Privacy) Ordinance and for Inland Revenue reporting purposes, staff members are requested to notify the Personnel Office at the earliest possible opportunity if there are changes to their personal data, such as their name, address, telephone number, marital status, birth of child, or acquisition of additional qualifications. Such changes may be reported on prescribed forms obtainable from the Personnel Office (Tel. 2609 7189), and where applicable, the originals or certified true copies of relevant supporting documents should be attached.

Change of personal data may have implications on the appointees' entitlement to benefits at the University. For instance, newly married staff should report the change in their marital status since married couples should opt to receive benefits from either the University or his/her spouse's employer. Such benefits may include the following:

北大圖書館和中大文物館向來致力蒐集及保存中國歷代碑帖拓本,促進書法藝 術的欣賞與研究。是次展品共一百五十項,精選自兩館的珍藏。碑帖的年代由戰國 至清代,拓本的年代則以明清至近代的善拓居多,而極為珍罕的宋拓本亦為數不 少。展品風格多樣,異彩紛呈,可說是中國碑帖書法文化的縮影。

### Ancient Chinese Calligraphic Rubbings

The original stones date from the Warring States to the Qing dynasties, while the rubbings belong mainly to the Ming/Qing and pre-modern periods. A couple of rare rubbings that were made during the Song Dynasty form the star-pieces in the show. Together they represent the most comprehensive and systematic exhibition of this unusual branch of Chinese art ever held in Hong Kong. To coincide with the exhibition, an international symposium (in putonghua) will be held from 26th to 28th April.

The University Health Service (UHS) will hold another Hepatitis Awareness Campaign in March 2001. Blood tests for markers of Hepatitis A and B Virus will be made available to all staff, dependants and students at a privileged price of \$100 each on 15th and 16th March. Those who are shown to be in need of immunization may have themselves vaccinated in the UHS on 22nd and 23rd March if they so desire at \$225 per dose of Hepatitis A, requiring two doses, and \$70 per dose of Hepatitis B or Twinrix-combined A and B at \$220 per dose, both requiring three doses. All are welcome.

UHS will be temporarily moved to Residence 1 (next to Ho Sin-hang Engineering Building) from March to August for renovation works.








### 能源耗量競猜比賽

### 宗教學術講座系列

崇基學院宗教與中國社會研究中心於二月十九日至三月底舉辦「宗教學術講座系列」,以回顧和前瞻宗教在現代社會的發展,並順誌崇基學院金禧院慶。

開幕典禮於上月十九日在李冠春堂舉行,由崇基校董會主席熊翰章先生及院長李沛良教授主持。

第一個講座由國務院宗教事務局局長葉小文先生主持,回顧和前瞻中國宗教在過往一百年的發展。有關佛教、道教、儒教和伊斯蘭教的講座,分別由中國人民大學宗教系方立天教授、台灣中央研究院中國文哲研究所李豐楙教授、上海復旦大學歷史系朱維錚教授和中央民族大學胡振華教授主講,集中剖析此四大宗教與中國文化的關係,以及它們在中國的未來發展。紐約神學院Prof. Dale T. Irvin和美國天主教大學Prof. Peter C. Phan,則分別闡釋基督教和天主教在後現代文化與多元化衝擊下的應對和發展。

於三月二十日之前舉行的講座尚有四個,主題包括: 儒教與現代文明(三月八日,信和樓李冠春堂); 儒教在中國的發展過程(三月九日,利黃瑤璧樓一號演講廳); 中國伊斯蘭教民族文化(三月十五日,信和樓李冠春堂); 伊斯蘭教在中國的展望(三月十六日,利黃瑤璧樓三號演講廳)。

### 新法醫治鼻咽癌

腫瘤學系臨床試驗組採用嶄新的綜合療法,代替主流 的放射治療,大大提高了晚期鼻咽癌病患者的生存率。

鼻咽癌是香港五大癌病之一,而放射治療一直是鼻咽癌的主流療法。早期病患者單是接受放射治療,能生存五年的機會高達八成半,但逾半病患者是在晚期才被診斷患上鼻咽癌,接受放射治療之後,能生存五年的機會只有一半。



由於越來越多臨床資料顯示鼻咽癌對藥物治療(化學治療)同樣敏感,本校研究人員預計混合化學 治療和放射治療,應可取得更佳的療效。他們在一九九四至九九年間,在威爾斯親王醫院和伊利沙伯 醫院開展隨機試驗,以比較採用化學及放射綜合治療與只施行放射治療,兩者對局部晚期鼻咽癌的效 果,參加的病人有三百五十名。

研究證明,綜合療法效果理想,病人出現癌細胞轉移的情況大幅減少,無惡化的生存率得以增加兩倍半。腫瘤學系陳德章教授(左)已在美國臨床腫瘤學會的二零零零年周年大會上發表了有關研究的初步結果。

另外,醫學院現正試驗,先利用額外的化學治療藥物作為誘導,才施以綜合療法醫治局部晚期鼻 咽癌,觀察病人對這種密集式治療程序的效果,至今進展相當理想。

### 醫學院宣揚健康概念



二百名醫學院師生組隊參加 二月四日舉行的馬拉松賽跑,以 宣揚「健康」學院的概念,提高市 民強身健體的運動意識,並鍛鍊 醫生的體能和意志

該院的調查發現,香港人運動量不足,引致癡肥、高血壓、 膽固醇過高、糖尿病、骨質疏 鬆、骨折、心臟病等日漸普遍。 該院去年開始參加是項馬拉松賽 事,並籌得款項在教學醫院設立 健身中心,供醫科生使用。




# 港澳大學籃足友誼賽

# 中大復旦合設 滬港發展聯合研究所



由本校和上海復旦大學合設的滬港發展聯合研究 所,已開展一系列政策研究,探討中國加入世界貿易組 織的影響,國家的西部開發、文化發展、教育等重要課 題,並將會就香港及上海的未來發展提供策略性建議。

聯合研究所的成立儀式於一月二十日在上海復旦大學逸夫科技樓舉行,由兩校校長王生洪教授(左)和李國章教授(右)主持。本校亞太研究所所長楊汝萬教授及復旦經濟學院院長陸德明教授出任研究所的聯席所長。研究所下設多個專家小組,由資深學者主理,他們的專長涵蓋經濟與管理、風險管理、地域發展、法律與政治、文化、教育等範疇。兩地知名人士及工業家應邀出任研究所理事。

李國章校長在成立典禮上指出,滬港發展聯合研究 所的設立,是中國高等教育史上的創舉,研究成果將會 對滬港兩地,以至國家的發展具有劃時代的貢獻。

楊汝萬教授指出,上海和香港雖非毗鄰,但關係既 深且遠。在全球化及區域化的浪潮下,上海和香港應致 力延續雙方互補優勢的歷史傳統,加強溝通,彼此取長 補短,為提高中國在國際社會的競爭力而緊密合作。 研究所的成立宗旨包括:(一)根據社會發展的需要,研究重大戰略性課題,以新觀點和新視野,向政府部門和企業機構等提供政策性建議。(二)提高香港中文大學和復旦大學這兩所研究型大學的辦學水平,進一步發揮兩校在培養人才的典範作用。(三)發展聯合研究所成為民間智囊組織,為上海和香港的持續繁榮和進一步國際化作出貢獻。

該所將開展的研究專題有中國加入世界貿易組織 與滬港發展,中國中西部開發與滬港發展,滬港文化 的連繫、互動和發展,以及中國的教育改革與人力資 源開發。

研究所並就各研究專題,擬定相應的年度學術會議,首屆會議將於本年十二月在香港舉行,屆時將就中國加入世貿提出一些滬港發展的政策性建議。

校方上月七日在祖堯堂召開記者招待會,公布研究 所的詳情,出席者包括李國章校長、楊汝萬教授、香港 教育研究所所長盧乃桂教授、人文學科研究所所長梁元 生教授、工商管理學院中國研究與發展委員會主席段樵 教授。

# 中大勝出兩大粵語辯論賽

# 亞洲肝膽胰外科會議

四百多名主要來自亞洲地區的外科醫生上月六至九日雲集香港,參加本校外科學系與亞洲肝膽胰外科學會合辦的「第六屆亞洲肝膽胰外科學會會議」,交流最新的醫學知識和手術心得。
