

Vice-Chancellor Leads CUHK **Delegation to Paris**

ice-Chancellor Prof. Lawrence J. Lau led a delegation to Paris from 19th to 24th January 2006 to further the University's partnerships with French teaching and research institutions.

The delegation was received by presidents and other senior leaders of the top Parisian institutions, including University Paris I - Panthéon-Sorbonne, Université Paris IV - Sorbonne, HEC School of Management Paris, Ecole Nationale Supérieure de Mines de Paris, and Sciences Po (Paris).

A Memorandum of Understanding for Cooperation between CUHK and the Centre National de la Recherche Scientifique (CNRS) was signed to promote research cooperation and scientific

cooperation between CNRS laboratories and departments at CUHK. The first of such projects was initiated through an agreement for a joint research project on traditional Chinese medicine between CUHK's Institute of Chinese Medicine and the CNRS laboratory located at the Ecole Nationale Supérieure de Chimie de Paris.

During the visit, the vice-chancellor also met with alumni, outbound exchange students, and other friends of CUHK.



aving spent 12 years on a ranch in Colorado, survived boarding school in London, pursued studies at Colorado College, Denver University and Harvard University, then travelled 52 countries as a camera-wielding artist and voyeur, Los Angelesbased architectural photographer and artist Elizabeth Gill Lui is now in Hong Kong as artist-in-residence at the CUHK Department of Architecture. Her four-month visit to the University has been made possible by an Asian Cultural Council grant, supported by the Cypress Group of Hong Kong.

Teaching and Her Chinese Project

Lui teaches a course on 'Visual Thinking and Design' in the department to students who wish to expand through photography their creative and intuitive approach to visualization, cognition and design. The rest of her schedule is sprinkled with shooting excursions to rural areas of south-eastern China. These trips are part of a decade-long project, in collaboration with Prof. Ho Puay Peng of the department, to document changes in China's village culture.

Lui made her first shooting trip to China when she accompanied Ho and his students on their annual field trip in December 1995. The two had met six months earlier when Lui was invited by the Hong Kong Institute of Architects to stage her exhibition 'Closed Mondays' at Exchange Square. In the following years, Lui's shutter has winked at remote villages in Xiamen, Hangzhou, Suzhou, Shaoxing, Fujian, and Guangdong, among other places in China.

Her images capture aspects of China that are quickly disappearing - not with nostalgia, but with 'respect for the Chinese spirit and how Chinese culture has endured and adapted'. 'One cannot be too romantic about the past. Things are bound to change. Globalization started with the scientific revolution,' Lui remarked.

'Three's a Charm: Selected Works on the Photography of Traditional Chinese Architecture' will be featured in an exhibition opening on 27th of this month at Uma Gallery, Wanchai.

Philosophical Approach to Art

Lui's art and life are infused with a lifelong interest in religion and culture, in particular, indigenous peoples and their belief systems. She majored in comparative religion at Colorado College and has a graduate degree in American Indian Studies from Denver University. Her interest in Asian culture began in the early 1970s when she was exposed to Buddhist teachings at Colorado College. In her senior year, she spent a semester in Japan on a Ford Foundation grant to study tea ceremony. 'To me, the ideas behind art are more important than the art object. The influence of

philosophy on my work has been lifelong and profound. I am interested in the universal nature of spirituality in all cultures, such as the similarities between native American religion and Chinese religion, the connection these peoples have with the earth,' said Lui. She believes as an artist that her craft is her spiritual path.

From Art to Photography


A fine arts minor at Colorado, Lui's early works were dominated by lithography and engraving, but by her late 20s, she was using a lot of photography in printmaking. She discovered the power of this medium and went on to do graduate work in architectural photography at Harvard. But in fact, Lui's lifelong passion in this art form had been kindled much earlier, whether consciously or unconsciously. Ever since she was 10, she has had her own camera, her first photos being of the Tudor buildings of the boarding school she attended in London.

Lui's early serious photographic works featured abstract, geometric forms. This fascination for the aesthetics of mathematics led her to explore architecture and the urban environment as a source for creating images, and this eventually progressed to an interest in 'great' architecture.

Museum as an Art Form in Itself

'I decided to do work on 20th century museums after an art show I put on in Chicago.' That was the 1980s. Lui subsequently received a grant from the Graham Foundation for Advanced Studies in the Fine Arts for her project 'Closed Mondays' (Nazraeli Press, 1999). The project took her and her daughter to different parts of the US, Europe, and Japan; a book on the work was published in 1999. Why museums? 'The museum is a symbol of culture, an iconic building of 20th century architecture that is dedicated to aesthetics as an end in itself. Great architects are commissioned to do museums. And when architects get commissioned to design a museum as opposed to a bank, for example, they make an artistic statement of themselves as architects,' Lui explained.

Over the course of 10 years, she photographed over 70 world-renowned



Diplomatic Buildings as a

Lui's next project took the motherdaughter team to over 50 countries around the world to capture America's diplomatic properties. 'Diplomatic buildings are a metaphor for national identity. The United States has a history of only 200 years. Diplomatic buildings, of all things, have been our most consistent form of cultural export.' The book on the project, entitled Building Diplomacy (Cornell University Press, 2004), begins with the country's first embassy in Tangier, Morocco — the first country to recognize the US as an independent nation — to its latest embassies in Nairobi, Kenya, and Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, built to replace those destroyed in the bombings of 1998. The embassies featured in the book are reflections of the geopolitics of different eras. For example, those built after World War II were punctuated by a hope for peace and democracy; glass was used generously to give the buildings an open and inviting feel. After the bombing of the US Embassy in Beirut in 1983, congressional laws were passed in favour of more secure embassies. Now of course, many believe that one cannot be too vigilant. 'Civilians and diplomats are currently the target of terrorism, so embassies need to be secured. There have been more ambassadors killed than generals.'

As an artist and a pacifist, Lui believes that diplomacy is something all countries should be seriously committed to financially, politically, and culturally, and hopes that her book will be a step towards revitalizing diplomacy in the 21st century.

Lui lives in Los Angeles. America still remains her favourite country of residence, with the South of France a close second. She has her own production company for documentary films and publishing. Among other things, it helps young architects and artists to get published. When her artistic commitments do not send her trotting around the globe, she practises Taichi and dreams of having her own organic farm and vineyard. 🎇

成立第五所書院

為學生提供另一選擇

港的大學學制將於二零一二年改為四年制,屆時中文大學的學生人數預計將增加約三千人,平均每所書院的學生人數逾三千二百人,壓力非輕。大學經諮詢及商議後,決定增設一所或多所新書院,《十年策略計劃》內已有詳述。其後,劉遵義校長委任了新書院研究小組,由副校長廖柏偉教授擔任主席,成員包括書院院長、教師、學生和校友各一(見另表)。

小組於一月中到海外考察,訪問了六所成功推行書院制的大學,與它們的師生交流討論,然後將觀察及研究所得撰寫成一份報告。報告歸納了該六所院校的經驗和特色,又建議如何建設中大的新書院,英文版(http://www.cuhk.edu.hk/newcolleges/Full%20Report%20(16.2.2006).pdf)和中文版(http://www.cuhk.edu.hk/newcolleges/fullreportc.pdf)分別於二月十六及二十六日,透過電郵發放給大學同人和校友,讓大家就新書院思考並提供意見。小組又設立了電郵信箱(secretary@cuhk.edu.hk),收集意見,諮詢期至三月三十一日止。

本刊訪問了廖柏偉教授和小組成員蘇芳淑教授,以下是他們的答問撮要。

珍貴傳統

廖柏偉教授說:「書院 制是中大的珍貴傳統,對實 踐大學的使命十分重要。小 組在考慮考察對象時,也特 別慎重。但原來書院制非常 罕有,在亞洲根本找不到採 用書院制的知名大學,在英 美也屬少有。最後我們揀選 了六所著名的院校,包括美 國的克萊爾蒙特·麥肯納學 院(Claremont McKenna College)、哈維・穆德學院 (Harvey Mudd College)、普 林斯頓大學(Princeton University)和耶魯大學(Yale University),以及英國的劍

橋大學(University of Cambridge)和牛津大學(University of Oxford)。這六所院校可分為三類,代表三種不同的書院教育模式,劍橋和牛津更是書院制的發源地。」

蘇芳淑教授補充:「在地理上來 說,是美國的東西岸各一組,英國一 組。出發前我們對這些院校已有概略認

識,但各院校的資源分配、行政和運作等複雜問題,不能單從文字資料了解,必須實地考察才領略得到。通過與各院校代表的接觸,我們更清楚了解它們的架構、運作和特色,例如克萊爾蒙特·麥肯納學院和哈維·穆德學院是非常獨立的學院,就如一所微型大學。而六所

院校都十分認同書院制的理念,亦一致 相當滿意所達到的成績。」

三個共通點

廖教授指出,六所院校的背景、資源分配和行政運作各有不同,但有三個 共通點:規模小,學生人數大部分為三 百至六百人;幾乎所有學生都住校;以 及學生在宿舍用膳。

他說:「當大學的規模愈來愈大,容易產生疏離感。設立書院的目的,是培育一個人數較少的師生群體,拉近彼此的關係,增加接觸。是以書院的規模必須小,學生同住,師生共膳,這樣的環境會方便師生課餘社交溝通,就文化、生活和學術上的話題交流。」

新書院≠貴族/精英書院

對於小組建議徵收額外的書院費,有個別學生擔心要是院費高昂,只有富裕的學生才能加入,會令新書院變成「貴族書院」,造成分化。廖教授強調,書院費不是另一種學費,而是用來資助學生活動的,而即使徵收,也只是小量。

他說:「新書院絕對不是貴族書院,建議的書院費不是很大。新書院的宿費與其他書院的相若。但由於學生要全期住宿和在院內用膳,開支因而有所增加。也因如此,小組亦建議新書院提供助學金予有經濟需要的學生,以確保有意加入新書院的學生,不會因為經濟問題而卻步。」

廖教授強調,助學金的發放是視乎 學生的經濟需要,而不是學業成績。他 又指出,全期住宿和師生一起進膳的安排,並不是所有學生都認同的,選擇加入新書院與否,全是學生的自由。由於有助學金援助,所以人人都有平等機會作出選擇,因此不會出現精英書院的情況。

把握時機 表達意見

蘇教授則重申,小組提出的只是建議,並非定案,「希望大家細閱建議書的內容,提出意見,小組歸納後,會修訂原建議,才呈交校方考慮。」小組的成員已先後出席聯合和逸夫書院的聚會、周年研討會、院務委員會和學生論壇,與同事、學生和校友分享小組的觀察和建議。未來亦會繼續到訪其他書院,與學生會面,聽取多方面的意見,並舉辦校內公開論壇,讓全校教職員和學生同心協力,為新書院的建立作出貢獻。國

The Fifth College: An Extra Option for Our Students

The Chinese University will revert to a four-year normative curriculum in 2012. By then, the student population of CUHK is projected to have risen by around 3,000 individuals. This averages out to an overwhelming 3,200 students per college. After rounds of consultation and discussion, the University decided to build one or more new colleges. Details of this decision have been described in the Ten-year Strategic Plan.

Laying the Groundwork

In January, the Task Force on New Colleges, headed by Prof. Liu Pak-wai, pro-vice-chancellor, visited six overseas universities with a collegiate system. They were: Claremont McKenna College, Harvey Mudd College, Princeton University and Yale University in the US, and the University of Cambridge and the University of Oxford in the UK.

The report of the task force on the distinguishing characteristics and experiences of the six institutions and their recommendations for the new college was sent to members and alumni of the University on 16th (English version) and 26th February (Chinese version).

Prof. Liu pointed out that the six colleges being used as references are by no means identical in terms of background, resource allocation and administration, but they had three things in common: they are small with most having a student population of 300–600,

almost all of whom live on campus, and dine in dormitories. 'The larger a university is, the more likely the sense of alienation. The aim of setting up a college is to nurture a smaller and closer-knit teacher-student community,' he explained.

Consultation Ends 31st March

Some students have expressed worries of elitism over the task force's recommendation to charge extra college fees. Prof. Liu stressed that the fees, if charged, will only be used to sponsor student activities.

Prof. Jenny So, member of the task force, emphasized that the recommendations are but recommendations. 'I hope all CUHK members will go over the contents of the proposal carefully and give us their feedback. Amendments will be made accordingly before the proposal is submitted to the University for consideration.'

Task force members have shared their observations and suggestions with staff, students, and alumni at the assemblies of United College and Shaw College, annual workshops, College Assemblies of Fellows and student forums. They will visit other colleges, meet with students, and hold forums on campus.

The task force has set up an email account secretary@cuhk.edu.hk to solicit comments from CUHK members. The consultation period will end on 31st March.


